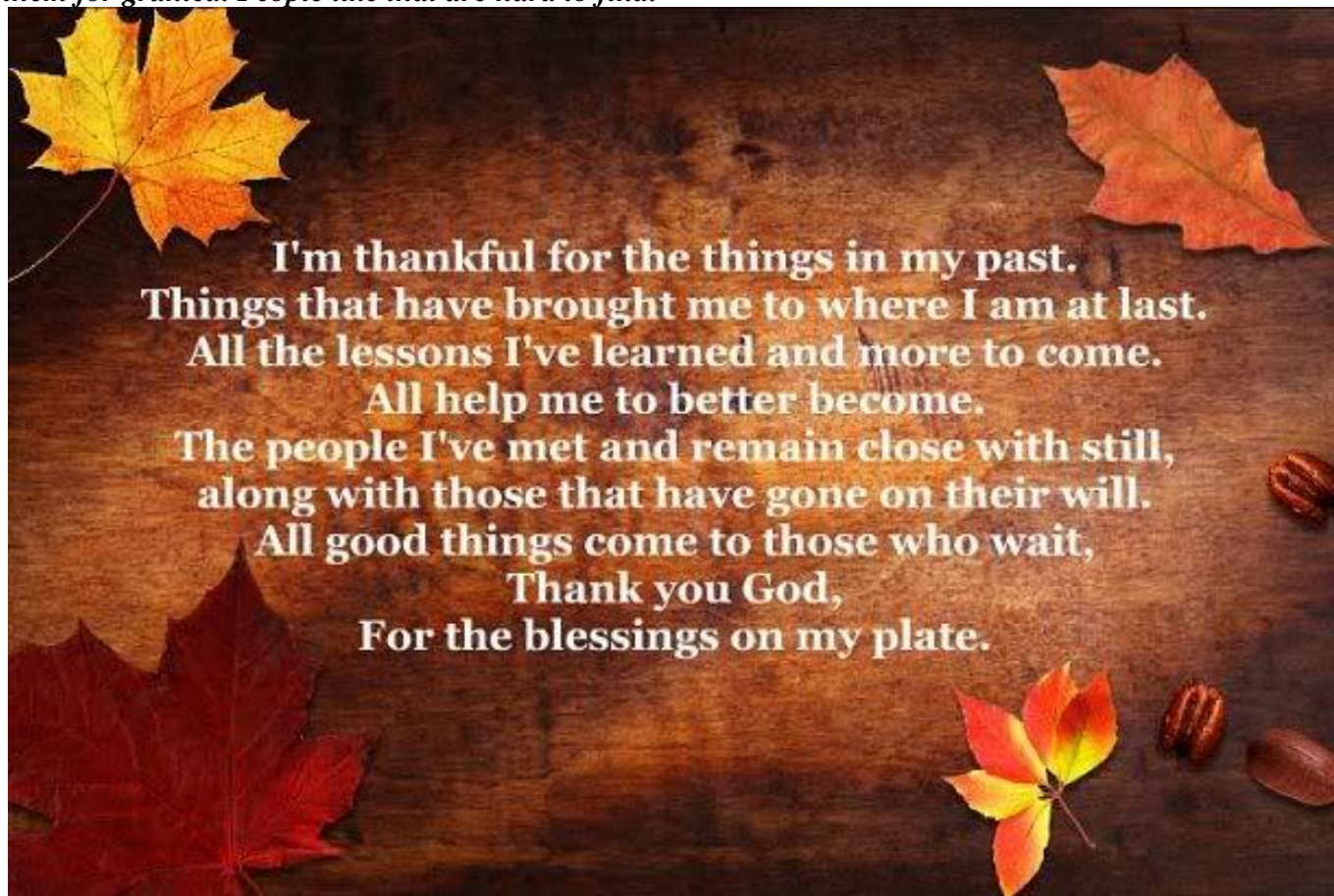

Sickness & Distress:

Phoenix Bridegroom: October 6, We had an amazing time on Phoenix's Make a Wish trip... But came home and she developed a fever. Mom and Phoenix are in the hospital to keep an eye on things... Please send them your prayers and I will have trip pictures for everyone very soon!

October 7, Phoenix is in the hospital today fighting a virus. This is a reminder that leukemia is a horrible disease that remains in our daily life. Take a stand with us & Join Team Phoenix in The Mission to wipe out blood cancer!

October 7, I know people would like some details about what is happening with Miss Phoenix, so here's what's up: Sunday morning Phoenix woke up with a nasty cough & a low grade fever. As per docs instruction we took her to the ER for blood counts, cultures, & a chest X-ray. Her X-ray & cultures were good, but her WBC were low & so we were sent to South Bend to be admitted. Viral infections cause blood counts to tank (sometimes) which makes her at-risk of catching other infections. This morning's counts were even lower, which is why we are here (at least) another night. In order to be discharged she must remain fever-free & show an increase in her neutrophil count. Although she feels sickly, she is good spirits & can't wait to break outta here. Thanks to everyone for the concern & prayers.

October 8: Dear Friends, Phoenix was released to go home this afternoon! Her blood counts did not improve, but remained at the same level, and her perky personality convinced the docs that she would be fine at home. They put her oral chemo on hold (which is never ideal) to allow her white count to come back up. She will be at home resting and recuperating until we go back to the clinic on Friday to check her blood counts again, where we will get further instruction. The entire pediatric staff loved hearing all about her magical Disney experience. Again, I thank you for your loving support...it means so much to our family!

Michael C. Ritter, VEDGC: fell in his home and fractured his ankle. Adam Jackson sent me the following. Michael is in Ball hospital and will be here for a few days they will be doing surgery today at 5:00 on his ankle as it was broke in 3 places and dislocated from a fall. He is in good spirits. If someone needs to get a message to him in the next few days they can call me Adam Jackson 765-610-4765 as they are keeping him on some pain med's and he's in and out visitors are welcome he is in the south tower room 4307.

Update: Larry: Here is an update on Mike's surgery. Everything went well on Friday night. They released him today (10/28). He's feeling good, but he says it will be a few weeks before he will be able to get out and about. He also says thank you for all the prayers from everyone. Adam Jackson

Willa Fay Roberts: I talked to Bobby yesterday and he told me that Lady Fay was in the hospital and was very sick. She has an unknown infection in her back that they are trying to treat. They have sampled the infection but won't have results for 12 days. Until then, they are trying antibiotics.

Update: (10/31): Had a very nice conversation with Bobby this a.m. Lady Willa Fay is currently in IU Ball Memorial Hospital. While she was still at home, she had inflammation of the spine that has been very painful, being treated with a variety of antibiotics. Then pneumonia in both lungs forced moving her to the Hospital for more closely monitored care. Bobby thinks she may be there for another week as they work to identify and break up the pneumonia, and treat the spinal inflammation. Sally Brindle: 9/30: For those of you who don't know, my wife Sally had a hip replaced this morning. Long-planned and long-awaited, it corrects a problem she has had since birth but which only surfaced in the last few years due to the cartilage in the joint wearing out. The surgery began around 7:30AM and was completed about half an hour ago without any complications. Sally is in recovery now and should be in a regular hospital room by 10 or 10:30. She'll be here until sometime on Wednesday unless something unforeseen crops up, at which time I'll take her home for 6-8 weeks of further recovery.

Update: Today (10/14) she had the staples removed and the surgeon is very pleased with her progress. She has been cleared to walk with a cane rather than a walker, will be able to go back to work and get back in the pool in about two weeks, and should be cleared to drive in four weeks. The surgeon is very conservative and wants her wait to start physical therapy until after the bone has had time to grow in and attach to the new joint, which should also take about four weeks. She's doing very well and has had little pain, and even with the walker it's obvious that she is walking better than she has in several years. Modern technology is wonderful. Nathan

SOOB Supreme Assembly a Success in Indy

INDIANAPOLIS – A local organizer called the recent Supreme Assembly of the Social Order of the Beauseant here a great success, and a local officer was appointed to supreme office. “It went wonderfully,” said Monica Pearson, Worthy President of Indianapolis Assembly No. 90. “We had quite a few complements on the hotel and the hospitality room. Twenty-four Sir Knights formed an arch of steel Wednesday night and it was spectacular.” That arch of steel was formed Sept. 25 at the Marriott East Convention Center, where the annual Supreme Assembly was held. It began Sept. 24, and concluded Sept. 27. Received through that arch were 12 past supreme worthy presidents, all of the supreme officers and their spouses who attended, and Hostess Group Chairman Karen (Mrs. Kris) Williams and her husband. Williams, who has served several years as treasurer of the Indianapolis Assembly, was subsequently installed Friday night as Supreme Marshal. The hostess group which organized the event consisted of Indianapolis Assembly No. 90, Columbus Assembly No. 226, plus Assemblies from Michigan, Ohio and Tennessee. Planning began three years ago when the group was asked by the Supreme Assembly to submit a proposal to host the event, a request which Peterson said the area ladies found “intriguing.” Their proposal was accepted and leaders began meeting periodically in Findlay, Ohio, to plan it, with the assistance of “countless e-mails.” The work was divided among the hostess Assemblies, with Indianapolis and Columbus assemblies being responsible for the Wednesday night reception, the “formal banquet,” and the hospitality room. 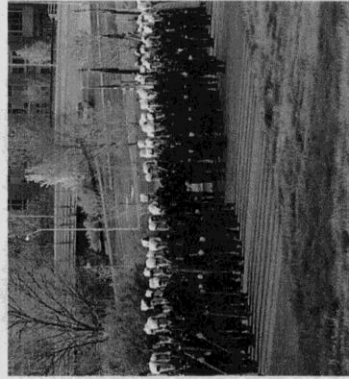

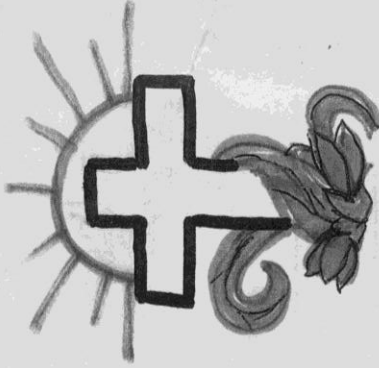
