#### **James Anthony Owens**

James Anthony Owens, 63, peacefully passed away in his sleep Monday morning, August 26, 2019, in his home. He is survived by his wife of twenty-nine years, Clair Juenell (Williams) Owens, his sons Benjamin Earl Jesse Owens (Sarah) and Jared Lawrence Nelson Owens (Kaylee), brother Kelly Carl Owens, father Lawrence C. Owens, half-sister Michele Costner and other half-siblings, sister Joyce Owens, along with a vast and loving family of aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his mother Betty J. (Gray) Owens and his step-mother Bea (Foley) Owens.

During his high school years, Jim competed as a Golden Gloves pugilist and billiards player. He had a passion for working on cars and developed his love of woodworking early in life, polishing skills which he used throughout his career.

Jim graduated early from Wood Memorial High School and entered the United States Navy, initially serving as a Boiler Technician on the USS Hoel and later serving as a Seal. After assignments in several locations around the world, he was honorably discharged from the Navy and then served as a captain in the Merchant Marines, piloting barges on the Southern river ways. After returning to Southern Indiana, he focused on construction, taking enjoyment from working on custom furniture cabinet design and construction, carpentry, and interior design, working both independently with his own company Owens Construction and at Styline Office Furniture Systems, Gibson General Hospital, Corporate Design, Furrows, North American Construction, Hobgood, and Menards where he was employed since the Princeton store opened in 2008.

Jim served as a deacon at First Christian Church in Oakland City in the 80s and 90s and later as a Trustee at St. Marks United Methodist Church in Princeton in the 90s. He attended Bethel Memorial Church in Princeton for the last fifteen years.

He was raised as a Master Mason in Prince Lodge #231 on January 19, 2010, moving through the ranks to serve as Worshipful Master in 2017. He also joined the Vincennes York Rite Commandery of Knights Templar.

He was an avid outdoorsman and sharpshooter who instructed his sons in marksmanship and dedicated himself to raising his sons to be strong men who valued family. He readily told anyone within arm's length how he was so proud of the men they had become. He was devoted to his wife, constantly surprising her with flowers.

Above all his professional accomplishments and endeavors, he was a loving husband and father.

Visitation on Sunday, September 1, will begin at 1:00 p.m. (Central time) at the Colvin Funeral Home in Princeton. The Masonic memorial will begin at 3:30, followed by a service led by Pastor Kevin Wilson of Bethel Memorial Church. Graveside services will follow at Montgomery Cemetery in Oakland City, Indiana. Full military rites will be provided by Retired Military Veterans. Flowers or memorial donations to the Indiana Masonic Home or Masonic Scholarship (information available through Prince Lodge #231) are both welcome. Envelopes will be available at the funeral home.



## **Compass Park**



Inside an old building on a Franklin Masonic Home campus, police dogs are practicing how to sweep for drugs, pull people from cars and navigate gunfire.

For the next couple months, the Franklin police and fire departments can train however they best see fit inside an old Compass Park building that's fate has been sealed.

Compass Park volunteered its old health center, which is slated for demolition later this year, to local public safety agencies on the hunt for a large vacant space for training.

Last week, the Franklin Police Department used the facility to train two K9 dogs to serve dual purposes — narcotics investigations and patrols, said Tim Coy, an officer and trainer with the department.

On Wednesday, the dogs were learning vehicle extractions, Coy said, shouting above the barking and commands in the background.

In the coming weeks, the Franklin Fire Department will use the building for various fire drills. Last week, the local SWAT team used it, said Jenna Butler, executive administrative assistant at Compass Park who helped facilitate the trainings.

"One of the hardest things for us to do is find buildings like this to use," Coy said.

Usually, Franklin police will travel to Camp Atterbury in southern Johnson County to conduct trainings, or use much smaller dorm rooms at Franklin College during the summer.

With a space that size, the officers can teach the dogs how to search a large building for people, drugs or man-made devices.

"They're learning everything from vehicle extraction to track to bite. Next, we'll work on gunfire," Coy said.

# Researcher wants to unlock the mysteries of strabismus



Strabismus, also known as being cross-eyed or having a wandering eye, is one of the most common reasons that children undergo eye surgery. But little has changed in its treatment since the 1800s, according to Jolene Rudell, acting assistant professor of ophthalmology at the University of Washington School of Medicine.

"We still don't understand why or how some children develop strabismus," she said.

With the goal of advancing treatment, Rudell is working to detect what causes strabismus. She said research has shown that sometimes problems in the brain can lead to strabismus, noting it's common for patients with brain injuries and strokes to develop the eye disease. She said there is also evidence that abnormalities in the eye muscles that move the eyes, known as the extraocular muscles, may play a role.

She and colleagues are examining extraocular muscle tissue removed during surgery to study the morphology of neuromuscular junctions – the nerve connections that direct the muscle's movement. Preliminary data suggests that patients with strabismus might have a significantly higher percentage of a specific type of synapse, an "en grappe," or grapelike, synapse, than expected.




The findings might inform new treatments for strabismus, such as strengthening the synapses that communicate to the extraocular muscles.

"I want to bring attention to a field that has not generated a lot of scientific interest," Rudell said.

Because little research, if any, has explored the role of extrocular muscles in strabismus, surgery remains the standard treatment, and it is effective for most children. Some literature indicates, however, that more than half of children who undergo strabismus surgery need a second such procedure to correct the condition. And surgery is not guaranteed to succeed: Some patients may remain cross-eyed or experience an overcorrection.

Rudell added that, in muscular dystrophy, children experience generalized muscle wasting – except in their eye muscles. It's another area of interest and potential clues for researchers.

Rudell's research is being supported by a \$65,000 award from the Knights Templar Foundation, a group that supports research to cure childhood blindness.

# This Month in History...

- 1860 Telegraph line between Los Angeles and San Francisco began operating.

#### 2019-2020 Grand Commandery Ritual Competition

Eligibility: Any member of any Constituent Commandery of Indiana is eligible (any card-carrying member). Any Sir Knight can participate in one or all of the categories chosen this year. You do not have to hold that or any office in your Commandery.

**Judging:** Judging will consist of 3 judges. There will be 2 judges for the accuracy and 1 for the delivery.

The ritual judges will follow the ritual and score for accuracy (wording MUST be exactly as in the ritual, word for word).

Deductions as follows:

1 point off for each missed/added word.

10 points off for each time a prompt is requested by the competitor. Prompts will ONLY be given by request from the competitor.

The delivery judge will score the competitor on the manner in which the Sir Knight exemplifies the work, makes eye contact with the "candidate", remains calm and makes proper use of the props, etc. The final score cards will be totaled by the Audit Committee. The Audit Committee's ruling will be final.

Each competitor will be allowed to give the lecture to a "candidate", but this is not required. If used, the "candidate" MUST be a Sir Knight. Any help or signage from this Sir Knight will result in a 50-point deduction.

The Junior Warden MUST be in Full Templar uniform and have any needed props.

The Prelate MUST be in Full Regalia OR Full Templar uniform together with all props (i.e., Bible, Cross, etc.)

The Ode to the Skull must be in Full Templar uniform or appropriate ceremonial costume.

Scoring is similar to Drill Competition. A base of 1000 points is the starting point for the competition.

In case of a tie the following method will be used to break it:

Ritual Work – 1st tie breaker
