The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was Formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the Following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

Sir Knight Thornley was born December 21, 1924, in Meyersdale, Pennsylvania. He attended Carnegie Institute of Technology before the War, and went to Colorado in 1946 to attend the Colorado School of Mines. He has three children: Elizabeth (Mrs. William H. Koon, II), William III and Robert. His wife, Shirley Jane, died in September, 1991.

A Registered Professional Engineer, Sir Knight Thornley is a consulting Materials Engineer. He is a Fellow of the American Society of Civil Engineers, a member of the National Society of Professional Engineers, American Institute of Mining Engineers, Society of American Military Engineers, U.S. Committee for Large Dams, International Committee for Soil Mechanics and Foundation Engineering and the American Society for Testing Materials.

A veteran of World War II, he served with the 90th Infantry Division in Europe, where he was wounded and decorated for gallantry in action four times. He holds four campaign stars and an arrowhead for the invasion of Normandy. He is a member of Christ Church, Episcopal.

He received the degree of Master Mason on June 25, 1946, in King Solomon's Lodge No.346, F. &A.M., Connellsville, Pennsylvania, and the Capitular Degrees in Colorado Chapter No. 29, R.A.M., serving as High Priest in 1959 and Treasurer since 1962. In the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Colorado, he served as Most Excellent Grand High Priest in 1966. His Cryptic record shows membership in Denver Council No. 1, C.M., where he served as Thrice Illustrious Master in 1977. He served the Grand council of Cryptic Masons of Colorado as Most Illustrious Grand Master in 1986. He is a member of both the Order of High Priesthood and the Order of the Silver Trowel.

Sir Knight William was Knighted September 13, 1950, in Denver Commandery No.25, K.T., (now Denver-Colorado Commandery No. 1, K.T.), and served as Lieutenant of the Drill Team from 1952-60, Eminent Commander in 1960, and Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Colorado in 1976. He was the Charter Commander of St. Bernard Commandery No. 41, K.T., when it was formed in 1983. He is Past President of the Colorado Past Commandery Association.

In the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Sir Knight Thornley is a member of Rocky Mountain Consistory, Valley of Denver, Orient of Colorado, where he was Venerable Master of Centennial Lodge of Perfection and is a 33° Inspector General Honorary, Southern Jurisdiction.



Duane L. Vaught was born February 17, 1956 in Crawfordsville, Indiana, the first of three sons of Lloyd E Vaught and Loretta Maxine (Miles) Vaught. He graduated from North Montgomery High School in its third graduating class and from Indiana University, the latter with a Bachelors of Science degree in Accounting. During college he served for four years in Air Force ROTC reaching the grade of Cadet Major. He was baptized and confirmed as a member of the Methodist Church and in December 2000 married Georgia Jean Nagai Goode in a small private ceremony at the Opryland Hotel in Nashville Tennessee. Sir Knight Vaught has two brothers, Dale and Glen, both residing in Indiana. Lady Georgia has a sister, Gloria, living in Atlanta Georgia.

Duane Vaught began his professional career with a small national accounting firm in its Indianapolis office, during which time he passed the CPA exam and was licensed as a Certified Public Accountant. He subsequently moved to a large local accounting firm in Bloomington Indiana. He advanced in that firm to the level of partner. Some three years after the merger of that firm with a large regional firm he left for an environment where he could provide more personalized service to clients. Since 1995 He has been vice-president of Stampfli Associates, CPAs, P.C., which has grown to be one of the larger accounting firms in Bloomington, Indiana. Although he works with individuals and many kinds of businesses, non-for-profit entities are one of his primary specialties. 
Sir Knight Vaught was initiated an Entered Apprentice in Crawfordsville on March 21, 1977, and raised to the degree of Master Mason 49 days latter after previously receiving the degree of Fellowcraft. He served as Worshipful Master of Spencer Lodge no. 95 in 1977 receiving the Grand Masters Award with Distinction. He is currently Worshipful Master of Dwight L. Smith Lodge of Research. Vaught received the degrees of Royal Arch Masonry, Cryptic Masonry and the Orders of Chivalric Masonry on October 22, 1977 in a festival, held in Muncie, in honor of then presiding Most Eminent Grand Master, Willard M. Avery. He Served as High Priest of Crawfordsville Chapter No. 40 and Illustrious Master of Montgomery Council No. 34 in 1983. In 1995 he was appointed as Grand Representative of the Grand Chapter of Oregon.

Sir Knight Vaught served as Eminent Commander of Crawfordsville Commandery No. 25 in 1981 and 1982. He has received the Distinguished Service Award and in 1996 was appointed Grand Representative of the Grand Commandery of Utah near Indiana. He is also a member of Bloomington Commandery No. 63 and St Anselm Commandery UD. He holds honorary memberships in the Grand Commanderies of Kentucky and Illinois.

Sir Knight Vaught is a Past Governor of Banks of the Wabash York Rite College No. 72 and has received the Gold Honor Award and Order of the Purple Cross. He is a member of J. Vaught is currently the Jr. Warden of Indiana Council No. 15, Knight Masons of Ireland and Deputy Director General of Indianapolis Preceptory, Yeomen of York. In the Allied Masonic Degrees he is a Past Sovereign Master of St. Bernard de Clairvaux Council 256, as well Past Commander Noah and Past Supreme Ruler of the Secret Monitor. He is a Knight of the Red Branch of Eri and currently serves as Secretary of his council.

Sir Knight Vaught was appointed as Grand Sentinel of The Grand Commandery of Indiana in 1992 by Gerald A. Sullivan, Jr. Subsequently, he was appointed to each higher office in turn, elected Grand Jr. Warden in 1996, served successively in each office and elected the 140th Right Eminent Grand Co Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana on April 27, 2001.

GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS OF TEMPLAR OF INDIANA NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS March 31, 2001

NOTE I - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles generally accepted in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments The organization adopted the Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations." The provisions of the new standard require that investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities be measured at fair value in the statement of financial position. The unrealized gain on investment is reflected in the statement of activities. The effect of this change was immaterial.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) The Commandery adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, "Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Organizations." Under SFAS No. 117, the Commandery is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted and permanently restricted. In addition, the Commandery is required to present a statement of cash flow

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS

The organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be tax exempt under Section 501(c)(10) of the Internal Revenue Code and not determined to be a private foundation.

EDMUND F. BALL

To: The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights;

Indiana's most distinguished Sir Knight Edmund F. Ball, our senior Past Grand Commander, passed away on September 30, 2000, at the age of 95.

His life activities are well documented. Muncie was his lifelong home, but his activities and influence was worldwide. He attended Wabash College and graduated with a degree in philosophy from Yale University in 1928. He served his country in World War II, where he was on the staff of General Mark W. Clark and participated in the North African invasion and at Anzio Beach Head.

He was a most successful and distinguished business leader with the Ball family business and served as president and chairman of the Board of Ball Corporation of Muncie, a Fortune 500 Corporation.

His many business activities rivaled those of his responsibilities as one of the nation's business leaders. He was very much interested in flying, having his first solo flight on October 27, 1929, when flying was very unusual, and continued until the last few years of his life. (Margaret and I were privileged to accompany him and Virginia on a few of his flights, the first one being to Detroit to the funeral of Grand Master Wilbur M. Brucker.) He was the leader in forming the Muncie Aviation Company and Airport. He was interested in ranching and had a large cattle ranch in New Mexico. He was a world

traveler — a few years prior to his death, he and Virginia were members of a group that went to the North Pole and Ed took a "dip" in the frigid waters. He was active in charities, particularly in the Muncie area - Ball State University, Ball Memorial Hospital, Ball Brothers Foundation, Edmund F. Ball Memorial Education Center, Muncie Y.M.C.A., and its Camp Crosley on Little Tippecanoe Lake at North Webster, Indiana. He was the leader and financial force back of the purchase of a wetland nature preserve protecting Camp Crosley and the lake.

It is unusual for one of Edmund F. Ball's status in business, philanthropic activities, and other interests, to be as interested and active in Masonry and specifically Templary as he was. He was a member of Muncie Lodge No. 433, all of the Muncie York Rite bodies, Valley of Indianapolis Scottish Rite, Murat Shrine, St. James Conclave — Red Cross of Constantine, and the Holy Royal Arch Knights Templar Priests. He was awarded the Caleb B. Smith Medal by the Grand Lodge F. & A.M. of Indiana. He was a 33° Scottish Rite Mason and received its highest award, the Gourgas Medal of Honor.

During the last 50 years, on the state level, Ed's interest and activities in Templary have not been equaled. He started the Knight Templar week for youth at Camp Crosley in 1946 when he was Grand Commander, and continued to support it until his death; a number of our present Sir Knights recall their week of camping at Camp Crosley. He was instrumental in supporting two-one day York Rite Festivals at Muncie in which more than 600 candidates were knighted; he was interested and active in recent years in saving part of the Muncie Masonic Temple for "Masonic" use and occupancy when the size of the Temple was no longer a facility that could be supported and used only for Masonic use; the Ball addition was with Ed's backing and financial support from the Ball Brothers Foundation; he was one of the leaders and supporters in forming the Masonic Home Foundation and successfully funding the same.

The preceding are only some of the activities and support that was always present when Ed saw ways in which he could help Masonic projects here in Indiana.

Ed was recognized as one of the most respected leaders in Templary on a national basis. He was Grand Treasurer of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar of the United States of America, from 1955 to 1973; he had previously announced that he would not be a candidate for that office at the 1973 Triennial Conclave. He was an Honorary Past Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, was awarded the Knight Templar National Award for Citizenship, and held the highest honor in Templary --Knight Commander of the Temple.

Ed's primary continued interest in Templary on a national level was the Knight Templar Eye Foundation; he was one of its first trustees when it was formed and served as trustee from 1949 until the time of his death, at which time he *was* the sole survivor of the original trustees. He was a trustee that attended the meetings, his last being in 1998. There were some of us trustees who might frequently speak more than Ed, but none of us listened more intently than when Ed spoke; his business experience and connections were instrumental in placing the Foundation on a business basis. On a recent occasion when he considered a study necessary on a given project, he asked and received permission from the trustees and personally financed the same; as his last major activity relating to the Foundation, he devoted a great deal of his time in collecting details, organizing the same, meeting and publishing a History of the Foundation of the Knights Templar Lye Foundation — a 58 page, hard cover booklet published in 1998.

For more than 50 years, Edmund F. Ball was present at our Annual Conclaves and important meetings. For a number of recent years, one of his duties near the close of the conclave, was to thank the retiring Grand Commander for his service and to welcome him to the status of Junior Past Grand Commander~ our present and future Grand Commanders will miss this distinct honor. We all recognize that Sir Knight Edmund F. Ball was our most distinguished Sir Knight - a leader in business, philanthropic and national activities, who knew that our personal activities were on a different plain from his. But he always maintained a relationship with us that we could call him Ed and he was one of us. As Sir Knights and Ladies of Templary, we will long remember and appreciate the privilege we have had in enjoying the fraternal company of Ed and Virginia Ball.

Things were just a bit different this trip due to the apprehension brought on by the tension in the Mid-East. Much stricter security on the airline - one reason we fly with El Al. Our first evening was in the Grand Beach Hotel in Tel Aviv - dinner that evening with a brief outline of our intended tour.

The following morning, we boarded our tour bus - had a devotional note and prayer by one of the pastors and we were on our way.

Went to Jaffa, the older city in Israel, then north to the Aqueduct built by Herod's slaves to carry water into the area; Caesarea where St Paul was imprisoned; visited the Roman Theater, drove to Megiddo; to Nazareth to visit the Church of the Annunciation; then to Cana. Overnight on the North shore of the Sea of Galilee kibbutz Nof Ginasor. Next day we toured Capernaum and the Mount of Beatitudes. (Disappointed here, the Church at the top of the mount would not let us go down on the

side of the mount where we always read Matthew 5-7.

On to Tabgha - the site of the feeding of the 5,000; then rode the "Jesus Boat" across the Sea of Galilee - lunch with St Peter's fish. Then to Korazin - Jesus criticized these for rejecting His miracles.

At Korazin one of the Ministers, a Lady from Florida had a bad fall, and she was taken to the hospital - no fractures, Praise the Lord - some black eye and bruises all over. On to Mt Tabor, site of the Transfiguration. We then frequented the Jordan River and two of our pastors reconfirmed their baptism.

The next day, we drove south through the beautiful Jordan River Valley visiting Beth-Sbean, important center of Roman Palestine. (Another disappointment - we did not visit Jericho - due to the situation.) On to Jerusalem, walk into the old city, as our guide Ezra Eini reminds us that we are coming home. See the Temple ruins (Another disappointment - we did not get to the Temple Mount or the Mosque of Al Saq - due to the situation.) Prayed at the Western Wall for the peace in Israel. (I believe this will happen when the Lord, your Saviour and mine returns from on High.) On to our procession of the 14 Stations of the Cross along the Via Dolorosa then to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. To Mt Zion to see David's Tomb. (I got into trouble here, when I entered the tomb with the cross that PGC James A. Wills had made for me out of mahogany. Some young Israeli became upset and pointed to the cross around my neck - I went over to him and said that I was not ashamed to Him and turned around and walked out.) Then to the Room of the Last Supper and the Dormition Abbey. (We did not visit Bethany - due to the situation!)

Sunday, we attended the Churches in Jerusalem, most of our group went to the Garden Tomb, where we enjoyed a service sponsored by an English Church. Here we sit in front of the Tomb, on the door, "He Is Not Here". What a beautiful service and a beautiful day out in the sunshine, the clouds drifting over and the birds singing. I might say, we had 8 days in Israel of perfect weather - the group before us experienced 2 days of rain and 50 mph winds on another day. Thank You Lord.

Monday, visited the Mount of Olives, the Garden of Gethsemane, drove to Bethlehem (Another experience - we had to get off our Israel tour bus - walk about 300 yards past the Israel check-point, board a Palestinian bus and ride on into Bethlehem) one of the Nissan Brothers, who has an elaborate gift shop in Bethlehem came on the bus - sang in Arabic - a song regarding the Nativity. And again when he took us out to Shepherds Field he sang to us. **We had the usual tree planting in the Knights Templar Forrest**

Our trip to the Dead Sea was enlightening - some of the pastors - went swimming in the sea; having been warned not to splash - due to the salt in the water - over 30% mineral. Visited the Massada -site of the Jewish zealots' last stand against the Romans, then to Qumran, where the Dead Sea scrolls were found. Enjoyed a lunch at the "Cardo" in Jerusalem.

Our last day, we drove by the Knesset the supreme court building, then to the Israel Museum – the Shrine of the Book where the Dead Sea scrolls are housed. Scale Model of Jerusalem during the second temple time. Then to Yad-Vashem Holocaust Memorial.

Then to the Garden Tomb - where, after a tour of the area, we have a Communion Service. The Ministers conducted this service, a bit different than I was used to, but I'm sure the Lord heard our prayers for forgiveness.

REPORT OF THE GRAND TRUSTEES

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana:

The market value of the Permanent Fund of the Grand Commandery as of March 31, 2001, is \$255,701.53 as compared with the market value as of March 31, 2000, of \$280,618.23, a decrease of \$24,916.70 after a transfer of \$8,000.00 to the regular budget. We note with pleasure that by tight zero-based budgeting, the transfer this year is the lowest in several years.

Earlier in the current Templar year, the Trustees, after consultation with the Grand Recorder, elected to move the Permanent Fund from the previous trustee with a view to both lowering investment fees and increasing total return. The fund is now being handled for us by the First National Bank of Kokomo through their investment division. As all of you know, with the turmoil in the market in recent months, equity investments have suffered substantial attrition and it may be some months until we see the net results of the move. We are sure, however, that in the long run it will prove a wise decision.

The assets of the Life Membership program remain fully invested in Certificates of Deposit although long range plans are to review each of these as they reach maturity and to look at other investment possibilities at that time.

The Newby-Avery Fund continues to assist in building the Permanent Fund and has now been supplemented by the Newby-Avery Chair program. We encourage you to consider supporting the fund through both of these programs in order that we may meet our next goal of increasing the fund to the \$300,000.00 level. Of course, bequests and direct contributions to the Permanent Fund are always welcome.

REPORT OF THE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

To the Right Eminent Commander, Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana:

The membership statistics for 2000 indicate that Indiana had a net decrease of 148 Sir Knights on January 1, 2000 there were 6007 members, with 5859 on December 31, 2000. The loss of 148 members is a loss of 24% of our membership. We lost 190 to death, 154 demits, and 68 suspensions.

A report of the Grand Recorder, found elsewhere in the Advanced Proceedings, will show the membership changes by Commandery

The following are statistics from the 53 Commanderies

- 164 Knightings total in Indiana from 33 different Commanderies
- 6 Reinstated in 14 different Commanderies
- 18 Commanderies had NO Knightings
- 10 Commanderies showed a gain in membership
- 5 Commanderies showed a breakeven
- 36 Commanderies showed a loss in membership

One of the most satisfying statistics is that Greenfield Commandery #39 had 45 Knightings, with a net gain in one year of 42 members. This is outstanding and is proof that with local leadership and determination, membership development is possible

The Grand Master's all degree-day on November 18, 2000, was a success with 1448 new Master Masons We thank George Ingles, G. SW for representing the Grand Commander in assembling York Rite information for all the new Masons. The Grand Commandery paid \$843.33 toward the expense of the handouts. Two personal computers were running presentations at the Indianapolis Master Mason class site explaining the York Rite, and again at the Murat Shrine Ceremonial on December 8, 2000.

Indiana York Rite has been given the opportunity to work with the Indiana Grand Lodge with 6 regional one day classes combining the FC and MM degree in Blue Lodge and the Chapter degrees in April and May 2001. Although the results will not be known until after this Grand Conclave, our participation and support are important.

How can individuals or Commanderies support membership development now and in the future? There are many opportunities and, but the emphasis is that each individual "DO SOMETHING". Your alternatives include.

- 1. Develop a plan for your local Commandery on membership goals and the means to achieve them. The emphasis is that it involves YOU and Your Commandery leadership.
- 2. Participate in new initiatives that involve the Indiana Grand Lodge. 1448 new Master Masons were raised on November 18, 2000 How many have you asked to join York Rite?
- 3 Support the Grand Masters York Rite Class and other festivals.
- 4 Cooperate with the Grand Lodge Development Area Representatives. which allows York Rite presentations at Blue Lodge meetings. Speakers are being organized currently by the State York Rite Association that can be requested to help upon your asking.

- 5. Incorporate the Grand Encampment Membership Program of 5/50 in your local Commandery. For every 100 members on your current roster, have a goal to add "5" new members each year. Reduce our losses by "50%" for those lost by demits and suspensions. 6. Use your Battalion Commanders to assist in planning membership endeavors.
- If membership development is to be successful, it depends on what YOU are willing to do tell yourself, If it is to be, it is up to me. Plans have been developed and conversations have taken place over the years on how we can be successful, but deeds not words, is what will determine the final success. If a judge were to ask you how you would plead to an action of asking Master Masons to become York Rite Masons, would you be innocent or guilty? We hope you would be guilty!

REPORT OF THE LONG RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana:

The Long Range Planning Committee has continued to support our defined "Mission" during this Templar year. Our priorities have focused on Finance, Operations, and Leadership development.

This year the Grand Commander extended an invitation to the Grand Chapter and Grand Council to join in our planning process which added a complimentary dimension.

FINANCE

The "Newby-Avery Chair" program was approved by the Executive Committee, and announced by the Grand Commander in December. This program is complimentary to the existing Newby-Avery Fellowship" program, and has been introduced to assist in attaining our financial goal of achieving \$300,000 in our Permanent Fund. Membership in the "Chair program can be accomplished by donating a minimum of \$250.00 to the fund. The targeted audiences for sponsorships are Individual Commanderies, Templar organizations (Beauceant, Drill Teams, etc.), and individuals wishing to support our financial goals. Recognition items for participants in the program have been defined.

OPERATIONS

In the area of Templary Operations, the Committee has begun exploration of the concept of "Templary Clubs". The Grand Encampment is advancing this novel concept, and we believe that there is merit in testing this concept in Indiana. The concept is designed to apply to weaker Commanderies that may not have a strong leadership team, have not had 'official stated Conclaves for extended periods of time cannot confer the Orders, and experience continued declining membership.

We believe that exploring and testing this topic is one of our highest priority goals next year. It provides for a new and structured approach in ore-building" Commanderies, and perhaps may minimize or eliminate unnecessary mergers. We have, therefore, assigned this to a sub-Committee headed by Sir Knight S. Randal Schutz, DBC with the objective of evaluating the practicality of the concept, establishing the standards we wish to test, identifying Commanderies that are candidates for participation, and coordinating a test with the Executive Committee for evaluation.

LEADERSHIP

We continue to provide Leadership development training to current and future Templary Officers. The "Indiana Templar Academy", inaugurated in 1995, graduated a new class, and now has over 100 graduates of the program. Guest speakers present relevant topics on specific leadership skills.

RECOMMENDATION

This Committee would also encourage the Executive Committee begin a defined process of reviewing the current Long Range Plan, selecting specific goals for implementation during the year, agreeing upon the tactics, and assigning a leader for execution of the goal. This would provide more teamwork between the Commanderies, accelerate implementation of approved short-term goals, and permit the Long Range Planning Committee to focus on more intermediate goals and strategies.

We have had many sight saving procedures approved this year. Many thanks should go to those Sir Knights who have worked on cases. Each of these Sir Knights has proven himself a true hero by giving unselfishly of his time and resources to help others to see.

NATIONAL CHILDREN'S EYE CARE PROCRAM

In 1997-1998, then Right Eminent Deputy Grand Master, Sir Knight William Jackson Jones approached the Grand Commandery of Indiana to do a pilot study for a new Knights Templar Eye Foundation program. The goal of the National Children's Eve Care program is to have every child's eyes screened by the age of six while mans' problems can be easily corrected.

It has been two years since we started training our eye screening teams, and we are getting ready for the re-certification process. This may be a bit slower this time because Prevent Blindness Indiana has had to reduce the number of associates from two to one. Anne Krieker, who did much of the training, is no longer with them. She told me to wish the Knights Templar the very best. Maureen Golden will be doing all of the work that she and Anne have performed in the past.

In the past two years, we have had mixed results with our screening teams. Some groups started screening almost right from the moment of certification, but others have not been active. In practice, each team is a stand alone unit that schedules eye screening sessions, performs the screening process, and reports the results to Prevent Blindness Indiana. Somewhere along the way, we failed to teach them to function properly. We are planning to make a training video for this purpose.

This past year, the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana was named "Advocate of the Year" by the Indiana Academy of Ophthalmology. A plaque was presented to the Grand Commander at a Banquet given in our honor.

On June 15, 2000, Lady Faye and I had the honor of representing the Grand Commandery of Indiana and the National Children's Eye Care program at the "Light up the night for sight" walk-a-thon fund raiser for Prevent Blindness Indiana. We completed a 5K (roughly 3 miles) walk through downtown Indianapolis. They have assured me that they will give me a little more advanced notice of the event this year, because many of our people said that they would have loved to take part.

This is a very worthy program and deserves our support. It is the recommendation of those most involved - namely Dr Gene Helveston, of the American Academy of Ophthalmology, the representatives of Prevent Blindness Indiana, and me - that it be given Committee status and budget of its own. There should be separate Knights Templar Eye Foundation Committee and National Children's Eye Program chairmen.

146TH CONCLAVE DIGEST

The 146th Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana, was held at the Marriott Hotel, Indianapolis. The Sir Knights of Ft. Wayne Commandery #4, the home Commandery of the R.E. Grand Commander, served as hosts for the Conclave.

The lines were formed by the Deputy Battalion Commanders, under the direction of S.K. John Bleich as Captain. Distinguished guests were received under the guidance of S.K.'s Steven J. Barton, K.C.T., P.G.C., and Dwight E. Lanman, Jr., K.C.T.; P.G.C. Inspecting officer was S.K. Richard B. Baldwin, R.E. Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment and Personal Representative of S.K. James Morris Ward, M. E. Grand Master. Also present was S.K. William H. Koon II, K.C.T. and R.E. Department Commander of the East Central Department. In addition, S.K. James S. DeMond, K.C.T. and Past Department Commander, as well as S.K. Robert E. Price, K.C.T., S.K. R. Frank Williams, K.C.T., and Willard R. Clutter, K.C.T., Honorary Past Department Commanders, were in attendance. S.K. Ishmael D. Ison, Jr., K.C.T. and M. W. Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana, was present and took an active part in all of the proceedings. The officers in the West presented the colors and all present participated in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call of Grand Representatives showed that 37 were present, 6 absent, and 5 were excused. The Report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 206 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest, including James Aaron Wills, Sr., P.G.C. These named Sir Knights were appropriately eulogized. The Grand Recorder reported a loss of 249 for the year 2000 with 109 new Sir Knights having been created.

The Eye Foundation Committee reported that a total of \$61,196.28 in contributions was received for the 1999-2000 year. The greatest portion of this amount was from wills and bequests; totaling more than \$56,489.00 The Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee reported that 14 Indiana Pastors had been given the opportunity to visit the Holy Land during the past year, a new single-year total. This brings to a total of 150 the number of Indiana Pastors who have participated in the program. The Educational Loan Foundation committee reported that 10 loans aggregating \$30,000.00 were made during the year and that total loans outstanding totaled \$107,006.08 at year end. A continuing shortage of applicants has curtailed the lending even though allowable loans were raised to \$3,000.00 per year or a total of \$6,000.00 per applicant. 17 student loans were paid off in 1999 with an additional 5 since January 1, 2000.

The official Conclave Program Book now entitled "The Templar Crusade?" was again made available to those present, although there was not sufficient advertisements sold to make a donation to the Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee or the Camp Crosley program. A total of seventy-seven persons traveled from Indiana to attend the Easter Sunrise Pilgrimage in Washington, D.C., and the Indiana Sir Knights, joined by a number of others, including the M.E. Grand Master, again placed a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington Cemetery.

The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies were represented by at least one delegate. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

- 5. On or before OCTOBER 1, 2001 send the completed form to: S.K. R. Frank Williams, PGC, GPE, HDC, Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana. A letter supporting the Nomination may be submitted.
- 6. The Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee of the Grand Commandery, consisting of the Grand Prelate and Former Grand Prelates will receive, shortly after November 15, a copy of the Nomination forms along with a ballot. Henceforth, any Commandery that contributes to the Newby/Avery Chair Program, in the amount of \$250.00, will be designated a chair sponsor for the next five years.

Chair sponsors will receive an appropriate plaque. Provision will also be made for a method of recognizing additional subsequent contributions.

Points will be awarded on the annual Activity score sheets as with the Newby/Avery Fellowships.

Each 'Chair Sponsor' will receive an invitation to send someone of its choice to the Newby —Avery Banquet and to the Grand Commandery Winter Meeting general session for each of the five years of its sponsorship.

ANNUAL INSPECTION OF CONSTITUENT COMMANDERIES

General Order No. 1 — Bitting - 2000-2001

May 3, 2000

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 473 and 474 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, as amended, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of this Jurisdiction be inspected by the respective inspecting Officer assigned.
- 2. Each Commandery shall open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form, receive and present such Distinguished Guests as may be present, conduct the Rehearsal of Duties, and then confer the Order of the Temple and upon an actual candidate if possible. Open inspections are encouraged or an optional form may be used which is open in full form with Rehearsal of Duties, receive and present such Distinguished Guests as may be present, then a dinner. If this form of inspection is used it must be an Open Inspection. The Order of the Temple portion of the inspection may be presented at a date that is agreeable between the Commandery and the Inspecting Officer. The Commandery may be opened using the Twelve (12) Knight Line Opening or the Ten (10) Knight Officer Opening.
- 3. Each Inspection shall start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Battalion Commander. The date and time may not be changed after the Official Inspection Schedule has been printed and distributed except by a "Special Dispensation" issued by the Grand Commander. Officers of Inspections starting at 2:30 P. M. or earlier shall complete both the ritualistic and public portions before the evening meal. Depending upon the inspection option used. If a joint inspection is preformed the host Commandery will open with the Rehearsal of Duties and Close. The visiting Commandery will receive the Commander and Reception of Distinguished Guests.
- 4. The full form Opening and the conferring of the Order shall be in accordance with the Ritual and Official Indiana Asylum Tactics, and the most recent interpretations thereof, by the Ritual and Tactics Committee and the Grand Commander.
- 5. The Inspecting Officer shall examine the books, records, accounts, paraphernalia, and properties of the Commandery and shall issue such instructions of comments that he may deem necessary in reference to these items.
- 6. The respective Inspecting Officer will send an "Official Notice of Inspections" courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder, approximately thirty (30) days in advance of the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, Inspecting Officer's time of arrival, and request certain statistical reports to be completed. On the day of the Inspection, the Recorder shall provide the completed statistical reports to the Inspecting Officer upon his arrival. In addition, the Recorder will gather all Rituals from the Officers and have them at his desk for review by the Inspecting Officer or his deputies.
- 7. No Inspection will be considered complete until all books and financial records have been made available to the Inspecting Officer. If not available at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the Officer involved (Recorder or Treasurer) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within fifteen (15) days. Failure to do so will cause the Commandery to be placed on probation until this obligation has been fulfilled.

- 8. The regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery should fill their respective stations in the opening of the Order of the Temple. In the conferral of the Order the Cast may be made up of other Sir Knights, as we wish to make the greatest impression possible upon the candidate.
- 9. The Twelve Man Full Form opening or the Ten Man Officer opening may be used. If the Ten Man Officer opening is used, it is desirable for the Officers to fill there own stations.
- 10. The Inspecting Officer shall make his report of each inspection to the Grand Inspector General, Grand Generalissimo and the Eminent Commander and Recorder of the Commandery that was inspected.
- 11. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest score on the Ritual and Tactics Opening. All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted by the Ritual and Tactics Committee. A Full report of the inspection will be published and appropriate recognition given, at the Annual Conclave in Indianapolis on April 27, 2001.
- 12. Upon completion of each Inspection, the Inspecting Officer shall give his remarks first and then the Grand Commander, if present, shall be called upon for any remarks that he might wish to make. At all times if the Grand Commander is not present, then the Inspection Officer shall act as his Official Representative and shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him as such. In all instances, if the Grand Commander is present, he will be the final speaker; unless the Most Worshipful Grand Master is in attendance then he will be the final speaker.
- 13. It is STRONGLY suggested that if a Commandery is unable to comply with Section 2 of this General Order, then they contact surrounding Commanderies for assistance. NO COMMANDERY WILL BE EXEMPTED FROM MEETING FOR AN ANNUAL INSPECTION OF IHE RECORDS OF THE TREASURER AND RECORDER.
- 14. This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and so noted in the minutes of the Commandery.

Rules and Regulations

An award to be known as the "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD" was established by the Grand Commandery of Indiana on May 6, 1977 at the 123rd Annual Conclave.

It is to be conferred upon members, who, by distinguished service to Templary are worthy of such an award. The recipients to be selected and the award to be presented as follows:

- 1. The recipient must be a member in good standing of a Commandery.
- 2. The Eminent Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General will, acting together, present the nomination for the award as suggested by members of their Commandery. The nomination shall be on forms to be provided by the Grand Recorder. Said nomination shall be forwarded to the Right Eminent Grand Commander no later than February 15 of each year for the preceding year. The Grand Commandery may appoint the Grand Recorder and the Special Activities Committee to assist him in the selection of recipients.
- 3. Those chosen to receive the award shall be made known by the Right Eminent Grand Commander at the Grand Commandery Conclave each year. The names of the nominees to receive the award shall be kept strictly confidential until announced by the Grand Commander.
- 4. The award shall be limited to one (1) member from each Commandery in Indiana each year starting with the year 1977.
- 5. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the recipient's Commandery. Such presentation to be at a Stated or Called Conclave. It is strongly recommended that such presentation be open to the public, visitors and friends and is performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar uniforms.
- 6. The award shall consist of a jewel engraved with the words "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD, Grand Commandery of Indiana," with the name of the recipient and date of the award engraved on the back. In addition thereto, an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.
- 7. The cost of the jewel, certificate and engraving shall be borne by each Commandery presenting a nomination. Each Commandery will be billed for the cost by the Grand Recorder.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FOR FRIENDS Of The GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Rules and Regulations

An award to be known as the "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FOR FRIENDS" was established by the Grand Commandery of Indiana on April 25, 1998. It is to be awarded to a Friend who has given service to the Grand Commandery, or a Constituent Commandery of Indiana, above that which can be expected of a non-member. The recipients to be selected and the award to be presented as follows:

- 1. The Eminent Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General will, acting together, present the nomination for the award as suggested by members of their Commandery. The nomination shall be made on forms to be provided by the Grand Recorder. Said nomination shall be forwarded to the Right Eminent Grand Commander no later than February 15th of each year for the preceding year. The Grand Commander may appoint the Grand Recorder and the Special Activities Committee to assist him in the selection of the recipients.
- 2. Those chosen to receive the award shall be made known by the Right Eminent Grand Commander at the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery each year. The names of the nominees to receive the award shall be kept strictly confidential until announced by the Grand Commander.
- 3. The award shall be limited to one (1) nomination from each Commandery in Indiana each year starting with the year 1977.
- 4. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the nominating Commandery. Such presentation to be at a Called Conclave. Such presentation shall be open to the public, visitors and friends and be performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar Uniforms.
- 5. The award shall consist of a jewel with suitable fastener on back to be worn by a Lady or a lapel pin for a Gentleman. In addition thereto, an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested to by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested to by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.
- 6. The cost of the jewel and certificate shall be borne by each Commandery presenting a nomination. The Grand Recorder will bill each Commandery for the cost.



ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg #2 – Charter date September 1853. One of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from #2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located in Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was changed to Baldwin #2.

Cambridge City #6 – On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville #6 was changed to Cambridge City #6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford #7 – Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was "surrendered".

William Hacker #9 – Organized April 4, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown #9 on April 28, 1874.

Warsaw #10 - Chartered April 17, 1868. Merged with Goshen #50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch #14 - Chartered April 14, 1868. Name changed to Columbus #14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling #16 – Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute #16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora #17 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929. Revoked by action of the Grand Commandery.

Muncie #18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000, and merged with Anderson #32.

Marion #21 – Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changed to Grant County #21 on April 20, 1990.

Caleb Schmidlapp #22 – Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison #22 on April 1, 1873.

Madison #22 – Chartered April 3, 1872. Charter surrendered June 12, 2001, and merged with Columbus #14.

Franklin #23 – Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County #23 on April 20, 1900.

Plymouth #26 – Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974, and merged with South Bend #13.

Washington #33 – Chartered April 16, 1890. Charter surrendered July 14, 1985, and merged with Vincennes #20.

Cyrene #34 – Chartered May 2, 1891. Names changed to Columbia City #34 on May 9, 1947.

Columbia City #34 – Successor to Cyrene #34. Charter surrendered September 4, 1968.

Bluffton #38 – Chartered April 18, 1895. Charter surrendered October 20, 1994, and merged with Fort Wayne #4.

Delphi #40 – Chartered February 4, 1897. Charter surrendered December 11, 1972, and merged with Lafayette #3.

Lebanon #43 – Chartered April 20, 1899. Charter surrendered August 15, 2000 and merged with Frankfort #29.

Princeton #46 – Chartered April 26, 1903. Charter surrendered April 22, 1995, and merged with LaValette #15.

Rushville #49 – Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered November 20, 1997, and merged with Connersville #6.

Mishawaka #51 – Chartered January 16, 1906. Charter surrendered March 1, 1973, and merged with South Bend #13.

Tipton #52 – Chartered May 9, 1907. Charter surrendered January 1, 2001 and merged with Kokomo #36.

Winchester #53 – Chartered July 18, 1906. Charter surrendered 1961 and merged with Muncie #18.

Sullivan #54 – Chartered July 4, 1907. Charter surrendered September 29, 1979.

Martinsville #55 – Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered December 1, 1932.

Gary #57 – Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary #57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995. Granted a change of location by the Grand Commander in 2000, Gary #57 moved to Hobart.

East Chicago #58 – Chartered May 9, 1912. Charter surrendered December 31, 2000 and merged with Hammond #41 at same location.

Greensburg #59 – Chartered May 12, 1920. Charter surrendered September 1, 2001 and merged with Columbus #14.

Peru #60 – Chartered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989, and merged with Wabash #37.

DeMolay #62 – Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental #62 on May 12, 1941.

Oriental #62 – Successor to DeMolay #62. At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental #62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity #62, but no record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity #62 – Charter was arrested by Grand Commander, March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the Charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, Calvin Prather Lodge #717.

Crown Point, U.D. - Dispensation issued February 12, 2001, to form a Commandery at Crown Point.

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. – Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, to form a Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.
