The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

Steven Jack Barton was born in Indianapolis, Indiana, on December 10, 1944, the eldest child of Branson C. (Bill) Barton and Doris Ruth (Poer) Barton. Steve graduated from Charlottesville High School in 1963. He graduated from Ball State University in Muncie, Indiana, in 1970, with a B.S. in chemistry and biology. Steve married Sherry Freeman in 1966. They have three children, Tammy, Scott, and Adam, and seven grandchildren. He was created a Sir Knight in Knightstown Commandery on March 20, 1966 and served as Commander in 1971. Steve is currently the Secretary Recorder of the York Rite Bodies of Knightstown. He has been a member of Knightstown Commandery Drill Team since 1966 and has served as Captain since 1973. Under Steve's command Knightstown Commandery has won four Grand Encampment Knights Templar drill competitions in Class A drills.



Presentation of Distinguished Service Award

The Grand Commander called Clarence "Dutch" Schultz to the East and presented to him a Distinguished Service award for his outstanding work for the Commandery and in his efforts in opening Hammond Commandery at this annual session. Signed and sealed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander and the Grand Recorder, including his jewel for the DSA.

Presentation from Charles D. Wood

Sir Knight and Companion, Charles D. Wood, PMIGM, presented honorary memberships to Sir Knight Kaminsky, GC and Sir Knight Hodge, PMEGHP, to the Grand Council, Cryptic Masons of Indiana, giving them the right to join them and sit back and enjoy the hospitality of the Grand Council. Sir Knight and Past Grand High Priest Hodge thanked the Grand Council for the presentation. Grand Commander Kaminsky also thanked them and added his particular thanks for the donation of \$1,000.00 the Grand Council made to the Grand Commandery membership development fund for their efforts in making a video for membership.

ROLL CALL OF REPRESENTATIVES

The Grand Commander then called upon the Grand Recorder to call the roll of the Grand Representatives. The Roll Call showed that there were 39 Grand Representatives present, 5 excused, 6 absent. Grand Commander Kaminsky thanked the Grand Representatives for their work in keeping the Grand Commanderies of other jurisdictions informed of our doings and them of ours, and dismissed them.

Deputy Grand Commander Mann then assumed command of the Grand Commandery while the Grand Commander delivered his allocution as follows:

GRAND COMMANDER'S ALLOCUTION April 28, 2006

To the Officers, Past Grand Commanders and Members of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana:

It's indeed an honor and a pleasure to welcome you to this One Hundred Fifty-Second Grand Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Indiana. To our Distinguished Guests from the Grand Encampment and other Grand Jurisdictions, you honor us with your presence here today. We hope that our members as well as our distinguished guests have an enjoyable and pleasurable stay. If there is anything we can do to make your stay with us more enjoyable please feel free to contact any of the Officers.

My term as Grand Commander is coming to a close and it is now my duty to report on my Activities for the past year.

STATEMENT OF GOALS

At the winter meeting in 2004, I presented the following plan to the Jurisprudence Committee for their edification.

GOALS

- I. Improve the Effectiveness of the Grand Commandery Officers.
- II. Improve the Visibility of the Grand Commandery.
- III. Improve Templary Throughout the State.
- I. Improve the Effectiveness of the Grand Commandery Officers.
 - **Empowerment:** Grand Officers will be encouraged to implement new ideas within their battalions.
 - **Recognition:** Continue to encourage Grand Line Officer's enthusiasm and participation levels and recognize them for their efforts.

- **Participation:** In addition to their travel obligations and battalion responsibilities, the Grand Officers will continue to chair key committees.
- Camaraderie: Continue regular formal/informal officer's meetings. (Each dais officer is to schedule a meeting during the year). Come together as friends and brothers with our families.
- **Accountability:** Evaluate Grand Officers performance and ability to progress through the line. (Performed throughout the year and formally at the winter meeting).
- **Education:** Strive to prepare the Grand Officers for the kind of questions that are going to be coming up as a result of the current Hollywood themes.
- **Mentoring:** The Grand Officer mentoring program, as started last year, will continue this coming year under the direction of the Deputy Grand Commander. He will review status with the mentors at the officer review meeting during winter meeting weekend in 2006.

II. Improve the Visibility of the Grand Commandery.

- Church Services: The Commandery of Knights Templar is not visible enough across the state. To that end, it will be required that all Commanderies hold at least one religious service this calendar year. It may be a private ceremony held in the Asylum or it may be a public one, such as attending a church in uniform, as a Commandery. Points will be awarded based on the activity as defined on the activity sheet.
- Wakes and Funerals: We will encourage the wearing of the uniform to the wake or funeral of a deceased Sir Knight as a means of displaying our attachment to our deceased brother. Whenever asked, we will perform an honor guard. A Past Grand Commander is currently learning the Templar funeral service.
- **Drill Teams:** As you are all aware, the participation in drill teams is falling off. This trend must be reversed starting now. Next year, each Battalion Commander will be required to put together a D Class Battalion drill team. The Battalion drill teams will compete for a separate *Traveling Battalion Trophy* which will have the Battalion number inscribed thereon each year. A Battalion winning the trophy three years in a row will permanently retain the trophy. In addition, I will ask the Grand Officers to form a team and enter into the competition.

The Competitive Drills Committee has agreed to travel and put on a program to help the teams with the drills when requested. Further, this committee can count on the full cooperation of the Grand Line to meet its objectives.

Committees: The Grand Commander/Executive Committee will provide direction for committees. The Executive Committee, with the input of the Past Grand Commanders and the other Grand Officers will make recommendations for committee focus.

Each Committee will make a written progress report to the Grand Commander (with copies to the Grand Recorder) ten (10) days prior to the summer meeting and ten (10) days prior to the winter meeting. Final reports with recommendations to the Executive Committee will be due on or before March 31, 2006. If the recommendations require funding, then that process must begin prior to budget time.

• Indiana Templary Academy (ITA): It has been several years since we had an ITA. Each time an ITA was put on, it had a particular focus. For the past several years, the officers have been working out the ideas around a training session that would educate a substantial number of Sir Knights in the history and operation of Templary. The primary focus of the ITA will be to create knowledgeable Sir Knights that can travel the state "selling" Templary.

A recent letter from a young Sir Knight has caused many of us to re-think how we project ourselves as Sir Knights. The younger generation, as a whole, looks quickly for value, or what's in it for them. If they see a spark, they go further, if not, they lose interest. What value do we place on being a Sir Knight and how would we "sell" Templary to a young man looking for its value?

• **Jurisprudence Committee:** This independent committee operates in the best interest of the Grand Commandery. It sees that the Laws and Rules that govern our great institution are followed. We will do our best to get all necessary questions, materials and documentation to the Jurisprudence Committee in a timely matter for their interpretation and opinions.

It is also our intention to build a closer relationship with the members of the Jurisprudence Committee in order to be able to utilize their knowledge in the daily operation of the Grand Commandery. In addition, since many of the officers in the line are lacking in knowledge of the history of our Grand Commandery, I will ask each of them to make it a point to spend a minimum of one hour with three different Past Grand Commanders whom they do not know and are thus outside their comfort zone.

III. Improve Templary Throughout the State.

• **Inspections:** The inspection plan currently in place is a result of extensive collaboration among the line officers from the Deputy Grand Commander back through the last five Past Commanders, with consultation of the other current line officers.

We intended the inspection/instructional format to be used for several years, at least rotating through the Orders for two years each. It was intended to be a means to improve ritual and educate the members of local Commanderies. Most of the members enjoyed taking part in the instructionals, however we also found that some of the Commanderies that we expected to do the inspections took the easy way out and only attended the instructional. Most of those same Commanderies held no other activity to bring the Commandery together.

I believe in this system of inspections/instructionals however I now feel that the system needs to be modified to include full inspections on occasion. Therefore, this year, we will be going back to full inspections with the following details:

- Each Commandery will have its books and records inspected at the time of inspection, unless previous arrangements are made with the Inspecting Officer.
- Inspections with opening/closing will be required with open inspections being more desirable. Commanderies may confer Orders at their inspections if they desire.
- ➤ Orders may be conferred on a different date than a Commandery's opening/closing inspection. Orders may be inspected any time after May 1 and before November 30, 2005.
- Full meals may be provided at any inspection, but are not required.
- ➤ Subordinate Commandery Officers are requested to attend their Inspection and Instructional unless for reasons of illness, work, or family.
- To maintain inspection consistency throughout the State, we will have a workshop for the Battalion Commanders and their Deputies on May 28th held by the Inspector General, on how to conduct their Battalion Meetings in June.
- ➤ Each Battalion Commander, with the assistance of his Deputy Battalion Commanders, will schedule and hold an instructional at their June Battalion Meetings.
- **Visibility:** The poster project that has been worked on for several years will become a reality this year. Several samples are around the room. Trinity Commandery did not waste any time in putting up several posters drawing attention to the Commandery.
- **Project Inner Focus:** There are several Commanderies in the State that have not knighted a candidate during the past year. Also, several Commanderies have attained less than 100 points on their activity sheet. This is not acceptable. The Battalion Commanders and Deputy Battalion Commanders need to get those Commanderies moving forward by working closely with them to get some activity going. As mentioned earlier, a religious service or perhaps a dinner meeting. Something to get them talking. The inspection summary will be preprinted in the advance proceedings and each Battalion Commander will be given a copy to identify these Commanderies. A report of progress by Battalion will be due at the summer and winter meetings.
- **Project Outreach:** Project Outreach is a voluntary program for the constituent Commanderies of Indiana. To participate, they will schedule activities in an area of the state that does not have an active Commandery. The activity may be one of their choices; but it will include Sir Knights from the host Commandery, as well as, Sir Knights from the guest area. The Battalion Commander for the host Commandery may award activity points at his discretion, per the Activities Sheet. The host Commandery will also receive special recognition at the 2005 Grand Conclave. The purpose of the project is to promote fellowship and maintain communication with the inactive Sir Knights in the guest area.
- **Membership:** The current membership plan is sound, and requires additional time to realize its full potential. Rodney and Andy are working on a new approach to the myriad of membership issues. Their work will begin to be rolled out as soon as they are ready. We will continue to work closely with Commanderies to implement the plan.

- **Mentoring:** Maintaining interest in new Sir Knights and preparing Junior Officers for future leadership are important issues in the life of any Commandery. An active mentoring program can achieve these goals and the following program is directed for implementation and monitoring by each Commandery.
 - ➤ Upon Knighting, each new Sir Knight will have a mentor assigned whose responsibility it will be to cause the new Sir Knight to remain an active member by inviting him to all functions personally, helping him become involved in the Commandery to the extent the new Sir Knight is able, and answering all questions that he and his family may pose.
 - ➤ The mentor will also be responsible to provide a member packet to the new Sir Knight containing information about the Commandery and Templary. This may include a calendar, newsletter, Commandery history, philanthropies, and information on Conclaves, activities, and officers.
 - Each new officer in the line will also be assigned a mentor, preferably a Past Commander or Dais Officer, to provide guidance and encouragement to the new officer and to instruct and answer questions he will have as he advances.
 - The officer's mentor shall make certain that the new officer has the proper ritual, tactics, officer's handbook bylaws, and other information he needs to succeed. The mentor shall assist the new officer in preparing his uniform and equipment and assist him with proficiency in protocols, practices and the School of the Knight.
- Certificate of Merit: In order to honor the Eminent Commanders of Indiana who have completed a full term in 2005 and who have demonstrated that they are effective leaders will be eligible to receive a Certificate of Merit based upon the following criteria at the Grand Conclave on April 28, 2006.
 - An Officer mentoring program is functioning in the Commandery.
 - A new member mentoring program is functioning in the Commandery.
 - ➤ The Commandery has made personal contact by telephone or visited all inactive Sir Knights in the local area.
 - The Commandery has knighted at least 1 candidate in 2005.
 - The Commandery can open and close the Commandery without the use of an open ritual.
 - ➤ The Commandery has participated, with a quorum present; in a local Order (an Order for Inspection qualifies).
 - The Commandery has accumulated at least 100 activity points on the Activities Sheet.
 - The Recorder has submitted all monthly reports for the year to the Grand Recorder.
- **Information Systems:** We will continue work on our new computer system in an effort to provide better service to our Recorders, the Grand Recorder and the Grand Encampment.

WINTER MEETING

The Winter Meeting was held on January 7, 2006 at the Marriott Hotel located in Indianapolis, Indiana. The Officers met at 7:00 A. M. for breakfast and to discuss various topics. The Past Grand Commanders, DBCs, and Committee Chairmen met at 9:00 A. M. for the committee reports and finished in the afternoon.

Knights Templar Education Foundation:

The members and invited guests met Friday evening to discuss a possible transition from a loan program to a scholarship or Grant program. One of the principle reasons for this is that our loans are offered at 5% interest. In the recent past, students have been able to get loans for a lesser interest rate, so we have not been as active as in the past with our loans. After discussing this at great length, the committee determined that with the current rise in interest rates and the lack of government funding of many related entitlements, our loan program still has a solid basis of need. We will therefore continue the loan program, funding it from the current outstanding loan fund. We will also continue administering this fund through the Grand Recorder's office. In addition, the committee has determined that we will now be able to fund two (2) five-thousand dollar scholarships based on the interest accrued each year in the Education Fund. We will only use \$10,000 of interest each year and not tap into the principle of this fund. These scholarships will be in place as long as the fund generates enough interest to fund them. The scholarships need not be based on need. Further, it was decided that the scholarships would be given to a university in Indiana to be presented to students of great promise on behalf of the Knights Templar. The university has the wherewithal to choose these students based on their performance and desire to succeed. Universities can better administer these types of scholarships, and therefore will remove the burden of administering them by us. The committee will be meeting shortly to choose a university as well as a curriculum we want to support. Great work Sir Knights!

Finance Committee:

The members and invited guests met early Saturday morning to discuss several propositions designed to help the operation and budget process of the Grand Commandery. We discussed the removal of principal from our permanent fund and agreed that this cannot happen. We are proposing legislation that would limit withdrawals from the permanent fund not to exceed 5% of the interest accrued. This will help us to again grow our permanent fund and thereby increase the current operating expenses we can draw from interest. As you are aware or should be, we last raised our per-capita assessment over ten years ago with the promise that we would not raise it again for five years. Sir Knights, the Grand

Commandery has done a fine job of holding down expenses and of earning money over these years. However, the same financial pressures you are facing in you own lives have finally caught up with the Grand Commandery and I'm afraid we will have to look at raising the per-capita at the next conclave. A full discussion will take place along with recommendations by the Finance Committee at the Grand Conclave in April.

Membership:

Sir Knights, I have never been more excited about the developments from the Membership Committee then I am right now. Our Membership Committee under the direction of Sir Knight Andy Jackson, Grand Generalissimo, has put together a series of nine (9) goals for this Templar year. This committee was comprised of Rick Elman, PGM and Mark Genung, Publicity Chairman of Grand Lodge, The Most Excellent Grand High Priest James Hodge and several of his Officers, the Most Illustrious Grand Master Charles Wood and several of his Officers and the Grand Commander along with several of his Officers. These goals, although I do not have the space here to do them justice, are:

- 1) Get a Templar Poster posted in each symbolic lodge in Indiana (about 80% complete).
- 2) Brand the Commandery along with the other York Rite bodies by creating a new modern banner/logo/catch phrase. This was completed by Sir Knight Justin Crisp, Carson Smith and Mark Genung (catch phrase is still be decided).

Sir Knight Jim Dove, Grand Junior Warden, is helping to determine presenters and geographic locations for presentations to be given. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 4. I recommend that the Grand Commandery of Indiana maintain a closer relationship with the Grand Chapter of the Order of Eastern Star to benefit the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. The Eye Foundation committee and Campaign Chairman should be ready to make presentations to raise funds within the Districts of the Order of the Easter Star on behalf of the Eye Foundation. Appearing in uniform would further be an asset and a recruiting tool.
- 5. I recommend that the Grand Commandery Officers all attend the quarterly Indiana York Rite Association meetings and then meet informally either before or after that meeting.
- 6. I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue the Indiana Templar Academy.
- 7. I recommend that leadership training should be ongoing whether formal, such as the Indiana Templar Academy and schools of instruction, or informal, one on one.
- 8. I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue to put great emphasis on the duties of the Inactive Membership Committee.
- 9. I recommend that the Grand Commander form a sub-committee under publicity to study better ways to communicate with our Sir Knights.
- 10. I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue to put increased emphasis on drill team formation and competition statewide.
- 11. I recommend that the Grand Commandery write some guidelines for the functions of the Grand Representatives, which would exceed the annual appearance at Grand Conclave.
- 12. I recommend that changes be made to reduce the burden of the Grand Commander and his lady in relation to providing hospitality rooms. These would include the hospitality rooms and storing of the flags and banners.

GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS OF TEMPLAR OF INDIANA NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS March 31, 2006

NOTE I - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles generally accepted in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments The organization adopted the Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations." The provisions of the new standard require that investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities be measured at fair value in the statement of financial position. The unrealized gain on investment is reflected in the statement of activities. The effect of this change was immaterial.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) The Commandery adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, "Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Organizations." Under SFAS No. 117, the Commandery is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted and permanently restricted. In addition, the Commandery is required to present a statement of cash flow

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS

The organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be tax exempt under Section 501(c) (10) of the Internal Revenue Code and not determined to be a private foundation.

GRAND TRUSTEES REPORT

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights:

During the Templar Year 2005-06, the interest rates have continued to remain low as investment opportunities have begin to improve but are still somewhat limited. During the past year, your Trustees have attempted to reorganize themselves and the investments of your Grand Commandery. It is anticipated that interest rates will continue to be higher in late 2006 and this may provide slightly higher income as a result of new commitments being made during the improved interest climate.

While it has been necessary to use some of the income from the Permanent Fund for operating expenses of the Grand Commandery, we have been unable to improve the balance. We haven't been able to recoup the losses made in the past years that were invested in Mutual Funds. We are developing an investment plan to create an improved working balance and to be able to increase the income on the Permanent Fund in 2006.

The balance in the Permanent Fund of the Grand Commandery as of March 1, 2006 is \$290,358.66. We believe that it is important to keep this fund intact and to add to it whenever possible. As membership in the Grand Commandery of Indiana has continued to decline, we have been able to continue our regular operations only by using the Permanent Fund income.

We hope that all Sir Knights are supportive of the stewardship of your Grand Trustees since cost of operation of the Grand Commandery will continue to grow and it appears that our membership continues to decline, leaving a smaller per capita base from which to finance the overall operations. A full report and listing of all holding is continued in the Audit Report.

Sub-committee on Power Point Presentation

We have put together this collective list as our starting point for this Winter Meeting, it's not all finished but it's a start for our presentation. Only after we review the Power Point presentation can we effectively make our final proposal as a Committee.

- A. First, I think that it is not practical that we try to visit each and every single Lodge of Freemasons in Indiana. I believe that we should hold Power Point Programs by dividing up the lodges within a 25 to 30 mile radius and invite them to attend a meeting. Always insuring that this is not a sales/promotion program, only an informative meeting on attaining further light in Masonry, and to see material that is available that they may not be made aware of. First, we should target the areas of inactive York Rite Bodies and second, areas where York Rite Bodies are weak and in danger of closing.
- B. The presenter or the local Commandery should provide refreshments. This would benefit the local York Rite Group by possibly picking up prospective members.
- C. To qualify a list of presenters, we would have to view the program ourselves to determine the type of presenter that is needed. Hold a Battalion meeting invite prospective presenters, have them view the presentation to see if they are confident that they can do it.

 Educate the presenters chosen at the Battalion level. Each presenter has a different unique style. Let us help them to use their qualities and put the presentation in their own words. We should keep in mind, the exact wording of each presentation may differ slightly, but the resulting information on the relationship of the York Rite to Blue Lodges, the natural extension of the Blue Lodge Degrees are a result of the York Rite, our charities and benefits.
- D. Geographically assign the presenters and area of responsibility and have a standard form letter to go to the Masters, Wardens and Brethren of Lodges for invitation to attend. We should make all efforts to have an Officer of the Grand Commandery at each session to help answer only those questions that the presenter may not have an answer to. (i.e.: nearest local York Rite Group, classes being held, contacts for petitions, etc.) not to interfere with the presentation, but just to be available as an advisor and insure that promotional materials and pamphlets are available. Our Dep. Grand Commander is working to organize a school for the presenters to be educated in Templary. These plans should come together in May 2006.
- E. Allow the presenters reimbursement for refreshments for these meetings if needed.
- F. Andy Jackson showed a version of his Power Point Program at the Winter Meeting.

It's quite evident that somebody stated your fire. That's why you're here that's why you're doing what you're doing. On behalf of the Red Cords we would like to thank you for your hospitality you have shown to us and our ladies. We appreciate this so very, very much and extend to you an invitation to attend our sessions. If you make them all we'll be very happy.

Report of Holy Land Pilgrimage

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander Officers and Sir Knights:

The Holy Land Committee for 2006 we had six Christian Ministers who went to the Holy Land February 21, 2006, on their way for spiritual enrichment in the place where Jesus walked. Now this brings a total to 170 Pastors that have gone from Indiana, these joined with 155 other Pastors from varied Grand Commanderies in the United States. Indiana participated in 24 of these Pilgrimages which began in 1977 Our Grand Commandery ranks second in out efforts to send Ministers to the Holy Land. Michigan of course is first and Ohio is third. One thousand five hundred and sixty-four Christian Ministers have been awarded the trip through your generosity and God's love, God bless you Sir Knights. This year from we had Columbus Commandery #14 Reverend James C. Campbell, E. H. Gary #57, Reverend William L. Hudson, Hammond Commandery #41 Reverend Geraldine Colvin, Grant County Commandery #21 Reverend Blake J. Neff, Seymour Commandery #56 Reverend Rosa E. Harris, and Reverend Gene Pogue. A very exciting time was had on this trip, particularly on our crossing of the Atlantic Ocean. We got into a storm, I had 61 of these Ministers scattered throughout the plane 450 passengers in all. I leaned over to the person next to me and said I think we are going down. Well the hydraulic system had gone out of the airplane and here we are flying across the ocean at 37,000 feet. I turned and thanked those 61 Pastors because I know that 61 prayers had been offered up to God and that he had answered those prayers. Things were just a bit different on this trip. To appreciation of the tension which has been brought on by the tension in the Middle East of course. Much stricter security on the air line, this is one reason we fly El Al.

We went to Jaffa, but since our plane got in lat it was dark before we even got to go through Joppa. The first evening we spent at the Grand Beach hotel in Tel Aviv. After dinner we had a get acquainted session and the Pastors in the following morning were on their way. We went along the costal road to Caesarea built by Herod the Great. It was there that Peter was imprisoned for two years. We visited the Crusader fortress and Roman ruins. We drove to Beit Shearim ancient city of the Sanhedins and visited the Catacomb that was once the most important synagogue in Israel. We went to Megego, the ancient chariot city of King Solomon and Ahab. We visited Mt. Tabor the traditional site of the Transfiguration. We always enjoy that trip up and down the trip up and down to Mt. Tabor. Friday we went to the Mt. of the Beatitudes this is traditionally the site of Jesus sermon on the Mt. A reading was held there by the sea by the 61 Pastors we had there in our Group. In our group there was six lady Ministers and guess where they came from, Indiana. And you Sir Knights I sure appreciated you sending those girls over, because I rode on that bus four days and no the other bus two days. It was kind of dull on the other bus but these galls would sing and go on and everything, boy I tell you it was something else. On Saturday we drove to Cana of Gallia where Jesus preformed his first miracle, turning the water into wine and then to Nazareth to visit the Church of the Annunciation. Joseph's workshop and Mary's well. At Belvoir we visited the Crusader's Castle upon the Mt. which was built back in the twelfth century. At Beit She'an we saw the excavations and visited the Roman Theater. Sunday we attended Church together in the church across from the Garden Tomb. The only thing about the Church was that it lasted about an hour and a half and being a Baptist, I am use to only about half and hour, but we got by, had communion.

Monday we prayed at the West Wall for peace in Israel. On our procession of the 14 Stations of the Cross along the Via Dolorosa then to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher then on to Mt. Zion to see David's Tomb. We were all conducted through the tunnel that runs under the Wall; then driven to the Israel Museum and the Shrine of the Book.

Tuesday we had communion at the Garden Tomb they still have services there but not on Sundays due to the unrest in the Middle East and it being near a Palestine bus terminal. What beautiful day the sunshine the clouds drifting over and the birds singing. We had eight days of beautiful weather and it was really great. We went to Bethlehem and of course when you go to Bethlehem you go to the check point between the two countries and get off your bus and get on the Palestine bus to go to Bethlehem which we did. Visited the Church of the Nativity where Mary had the Christ Child at birth.

On Wednesday we drove to the Yad Vashem memorial to the six million Jewish martyrs of World War II. Sir Knight I was surprised at the changes that had taken place in the five years that we didn't go on our trip. We used to have to through rock and mud paths to get to it but it is no more.

We did not visit Bethany, we didn't visit Jericho, we didn't get to go to the Good Samaritan Inn, or Jacob's well, and the told us we couldn't go to the Dome of the Rock, but ole Frank persisted or insisted and we had our guide convinced that we were going even if we had to get off at the check point and go ourselves. So what does he do but, calls up six Israeli Solders and has them escort us to the Door, it didn't help matters but we did get to go up to the Dome of the Rock. Of course all these Pastors give us a survey of how the feel about the trip and of their appreciation. He then read some of the survey praising the Sir Knights for their efforts an expressing their experience with God. Praise the Lord and please consider a contribution to this Ministry. The next pilgrimage for Indiana will be February 19th Through February 28 in 2007. So you will have time to have application coming soon.

Eulogy for Herbert A. Newman, KCT, PGC, GT

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana:

In Memoriam: Herbert A. Newman Grand Commander 1974-1975.

Sir Knight Herb the 113th Right Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana was born July 10, 1918 in Indianapolis, Indiana

He attended public school in Indianapolis and graduated from Emerick Manual Training High School in 1936 and received his BS Degree from Butler University in 1940.

Sir Knight Herb worked in the International Harvester Farm Machinery Business with Doctor Millard Dill who later became the Superintendent of the Indiana Masonic Home. In 1946 he joined the Ace Auto Radiator Company where he remained until 1955. He then sold his interest in the Radiator Company and took a position with R.R. Howard Company a distributor of Bailer twine. September 1966 Sir Knight Newman joined the Glen Roy Construction company as the Secretary Treasurer.

July 1946 he was joined in marriage with Kathleen M. Hill, in the Methodist church in Shelburne, Indiana. From this union came two sons and two daughters, Sir Knight Herb and Kathleen were members of the Irvington United Methodist Church.

His Masonic record; Sir Knight Herb was raised to the sublime degree of a Master Mason in Irvington Lodge No. 666 free and Accepted Masons on June 27, 1942. He served as Worshipful Master in 1948; he was Secretary 1950 to 1969 Treasurer 1970 until his death. He was exalted a Royal Arch Mason in Irvington Chapter 158 Royal Arch Masons. He was greeted Royal and Select Master in Indianapolis Council No. 2 Royal and Select Masters. He was knighted in Raper Commandery No. 1 on October 2, 1949 and served as Eminent Commander in 1962. A member of Raper Drill Team since 1949 and participated as left Guide in 19 Triennials. He was elected as Captain of the Guard Knight for the Grand Commandery Templar of Indiana in 1965 in South Bend. He was a member of Bartimaeus Lodge. He was active in the Irvington Chapter Order of DeMolay received the DeMolay Cross of Honor. Member of Indianapolis Valley of the Scottish Rite receiving the Illustrious Honor of 33 degree. Herb was also belonged to Murat Shrine, St. Andrew Tabernacle XXXV Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, Past Intendant General for Indiana Red Cross of Constantine; The York Rite Sovereign College of North America; and several other Masonic bodies.

From this Sir Knight, I was most impressed as a real true friend. When I came in this morning I looked down at the end of the officers and Herbie wasn't there. We all miss Herb. Life is eternal, the Good Lord said, so don't think of our loved ones as dead. For death is but a stepping stone to a beautiful life we have never known. A place where God promised man he would be eternally happy safe and free, God speed Herby good speed.

In Memoriam: David Robert Poling, Jr., Grand Commander 1976-1977.

It is with great sadness that I report to you another of our Illustrious Sir Knights has departed this life to be united with the Supreme Architect of the Universe.

Sir Knight David Robert Poling, Jr. passed away on Wednesday March 22, 2006 at his home.

David was born on March 8, 1918 in Perry county Ohio. He was wed to Leona Mae Rittgers on June 10, 1946 who survives.

He was an Army veteran having served in the U. S. Signal Corps in Puerto Rico and the South Pacific. He was an employed by General Telephone Company beginning in 1946 and later became construction supervisor in charge of the cable department. He was a former member of the Lafayette Presbyterian Church. After moving to Logan Ohio he attended the Ebenezer Baptist Church in Maxville, Ohio.

David began his Masonic career in West Lafavette where he was raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason and later served as Worshipful Master of that Lodge. He was a member of Lafayette, In York Rite. He was Exalted a Royal Arch Mason in Lafayette Chapter No. 3 on 2/14/1949 and served as High Priest in 1970, Greeted a Royal and Select Master in Tippecanoe Council No. 68 on 3/14/1949 and served as Illustrious Master in 1968, Created a Knight Templar in Lafayette Commandery No. 3 on 2/18/1950 and served as Eminent Commander in 1959. He began as Grand Captain of the Guard in the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana and progressed through the line and was elected Right Eminent Grand Commander and served the year of 1976-1977. When I approached his steps I saw that the steps were rotted and they were in need of repair. The exterior of his home was in need of repair also but the interior was immaculate. This man had spent his life in education; he had given so much to many. So many people had benefited from his teaching. He found himself in his twilight years, frankly he needed someone. I called the Master of the Lodge in Paoli and I asked him, "have you called on him, have you seen him?" He said maybe no. I took that to mean, no. I said you know I would like for someone from the Lodge to call on him and see if they could repair the steps and his porch. He said, "Yes, Grand Master, I am going to do that as soon as my two son in-laws return from vacation and I am going to call on him and we'll see what we can do." Today you can drive by and old porch is gone and it is now extended, they put his glider upon the porch and it didn't have a roof over it but now it has one. They installed hand rails so he wouldn't fall. And you know, these brothers who did this work, really enjoyed themselves and even the newspapers were out there and took pictures. They received a lot of good PR but that's not what they were looking for. What I am saying today is we have those people out there who need our attention. They aren't going to ask for it, we need to be vigil; we need to see and call on these brothers to see what we could do and how we could help them. I have a Secretary in a Lodge in southern Indiana that mowed another brother's lawn for about two years now. This man is about 94 years of age and can no longer do it. This takes the time from his busy schedule and mows his lawn and never takes or asks for anything. This is Masonry in action. This is as it should be. This is what we each need to be doing.

Brethren, I do thank you to for being able to be here again. I wish you great success in your endeavors and I see great things coming from York Rite Masonry. I look about this audience and I see some of the finest Masons in our Grand jurisdiction. - 6. Each Commandery shall at the time of its Annual inspection have a minimum of eleven of its Rituals in good condition on the Recorder's desk to be inspected by the inspecting officer. (Adopted 1965)

Whereas paragraph 4.states:

4. That Rituals may hereafter be purchased only by Commanderies; that said purchases shall be made through the office of the Grand Recorder for the sum of seven (\$7.00) dollars; that a credit will be given upon the purchase of a Ritual of three (\$3.00) for each worn or used Ritual tendered to the Grand Recorder at the time of the purchase of a new Ritual.

Whereas: The costs of all supplies are subject to the supplier charges and:

Whereas: the Commanderies are not returning the worn or used Rituals, and:

Whereas: the present cost of the Ritual is more than the stated seven (\$7.00) dollars.

Therefore be it resolved that: Paragraph 4 of Section (new 835) (Old Resolution 2) be amended to read:

4. That Rituals may hereafter be purchased only by Commanderies; that said purchases shall be made through the office of the Grand Recorder.

INSPECTION OF COMMANDERIES APPOINTMENT, PAY AND DUTIES OF INSPECTION

SECTION 851 (473): Commanderies of this Grand Jurisdiction shall be inspected annually under the direction and control of the Grand Commander, who may, subject to the approval of the Committee on Jurisprudence, appoint one competent Sir Knight to make all of the inspections at a salary of \$1,200,00 per annum, which shall include his expenses, or the Grand Commander may assign a Line Officer to each of the districts as now constituted and established, to make such inspections, who shall receive his actual expenses only. The duties of such inspector shall be to inspect, correct errors and give such instruction and information immediately after inspection, as the inspector may deem necessary and in accordance with the interpretation of the ritual and tactics as provided by the Grand Encampment. Such inspector shall make a report to the Grand Commander immediately after each inspection; provided that in the event any inspector shall be unable to perform his duties as such, then the Grand Commander shall appoint another competent Knight Templar his stead as such inspector. It shall be the duty of each Commander to assemble his Commandery for inspection at such time as may be designated by the inspector It is further provided that the Grand Commander may from time to time call such school or schools of instruction as may seem fit and proper, and require the attendance of such inspectors thereat.

And Whereas: This paragraph could cause confusion under the present Battalion Structure

Therefore be it resolved that said paragraph be modified to read as follows:

INSPECTION OF COMMANDERIES APPOINTMENT, PAY AND DUTIES OF INSPECTION

SECTION 851 (473): Commanderies of this Grand Jurisdiction shall be inspected annually under the direction and control of the Grand Commander, who may, subject to the approval of the Committee on Jurisprudence, appoint one competent Sir Knight to make *some or* all of the inspections at a salary, *which shall be set in the Annual Budget of this Grand Commandery*, which shall include his expenses, or the Grand Commander may assign a *Grand Officer* to each of the *Battalions* as now constituted and established, to make such inspections, who shall receive his actual expenses only. Whereas the time has come after many years when a change in the per capita assessment is appropriate and

Whereas more regular small changes are preferable to large sudden changes brought about by a desire to avoid modification of our Grand Law and

Whereas it is desirable to not require reprinting or re-issuance of our Grand Laws whenever a change in per capita is made and

Whereas many Masonic organizations, such as Indiana Symbolic Lodges are successfully adopting annual setting of dues

Therefore be it resolved that section 610 of the laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana which now reads:

SECTION 610 (403) The revenues of the Grand Commandery shall consist of fees for Charters issued to Commanderies within its jurisdiction, which shall be the sum of \$100.00, a fee of \$10.00 for each Knight Templar created therein and an annual per capita of \$4.50, plus such annual per capita amount as shall from time to time be assessed by the Grand Encampment, K. T., U. S. A., upon each member thereof, and all fees and dues that may be charged to or provided to be paid by the Commanderies and the members thereto to the Grand Commandery, all of which shall be paid on or before the 1st day of February each year; and 20 cents of the per capita is to be set aside as a special fund to be expended under the direction of the Triennial Committee, as approved by the Grand Commander; and 15 cents of which is to be set aside for Annual Conclave expenses to be expended under the direction of the Finance Committee, as approved by the Grand Commander; also said revenues shall consist of interest and profits on deposits and invested funds. Provided, that Commanderies may remit by vote at a Stated Conclave the dues of any member having attained a record of 50 years as a Knight Templar and the Commandery shall not be required to pay Grand Commandery dues upon such members whose dues shall be thus remitted.

Nor shall the Commandery be required to pay to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation the assessment upon those members whose dues were remitted because of their inability to pay dues. (Section 19 Grand Encampment 1961) The Commandery shall be required to pay to the Grand Commandery the annual Knights Templar Eye Foundation assessment upon those members whose dues were remitted because of 50 years of membership. (1992)

Be amended to read:

SECTION 610 The revenues of the Grand Commandery shall consist of 1) fees for Charters issued to Commanderies within its jurisdiction, which shall be \$100.00, 2) a fee of \$10.00 for each Knight Templar created therein and 3) an annual per capita as

approved each year at the preceding annual Grand Conclave, plus such annual per capita amount as shall from time to time be assessed by the Grand Encampment, K. T., U. S. A., upon each member thereof, and 4) all fees and dues that may be charged to or provided to be paid by the Commanderies and the members thereto to the Grand Commandery, all of which shall be paid on or before the 1st day of February each year; also said revenues shall consist of interest and profits on deposits and invested funds. Provided, that Commanderies may remit by vote at a Stated Conclave the dues of any member

having attained a record of 50 years as a Knight Templar and the Commandery shall not be required to pay Grand Commandery dues upon such members whose dues shall be thus remitted.

Nor shall the Commandery be required to pay to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation the assessment upon those members whose dues were remitted because of their inability to pay dues. (Section 19 Grand Encampment 1961) The Commandery shall be required to pay to the Grand Commandery the annual Knights Templar Eye Foundation assessment upon those members whose dues were remitted because of 50 years of membership.

RESOLUTION ON PERMANENT FUND

Whereas the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana established a permanent fund to ensure the continued financial viability of the Grand Commandery and

Whereas a resolution was passed in 1992 to collect \$1 per year per capita to increase the fund for at least the following five years and

Whereas that annual per capita has been continued and it is considered wise to continue this investment in the future indefinitely and

Whereas the use of funds in, or generated by, the permanent funds have been regulated loosely and Whereas it is now considered prudent to make the use of these funds more stable

Therefore be it resolved that section 612 of the laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana which now reads:

SECTION 612 (Resolution No.7.) It is the sense and purpose of this Grand Commandery that for so long as it is budgetarily feasible, and in no case for less than a five-year period beginning with the per capita paid in January of 1993. \$1.00 of the per capita of this Grand Commandery shall be paid into the Permanent Investment Fund of this Grand Commandery in order to build it into a fund that will be adequate to finance the operations of this Grand Commandery during the balance of this decade. (Adopted 1992)

Be amended to read:

SECTION 612. For each member subject to, and for which per capita fees are received, \$1.00 of the per capita of this Grand Commandery shall be paid into the Permanent Investment Fund of this Grand Commandery in order to partially finance the operations of this Grand Commandery.

The permanent and un-expendable portion of the fund shall be \$279,096, as of December 31, 2005 plus all per capita fees and contributions contributed to the fund after that date.

Each year, beginning with the 2007-2008 Grand Commandery year, the permanent fund shall transfer to the general fund, for operations, five percent (5%) of the previous calendar year end value of the permanent fund except that such transfer shall be limited as follows. The maximum annual transfer shall be no more than the amount that would reduce the permanent fund as of the previous calendar year end to the permanent, un-expendable balance of the fund.

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana:

Your Committee on Ritual and Tactics wishes to report the following recommendations:

- 1. As to the correct point in the Tactics for "Return Swords" at the time of forming the Triangle, it is the opinion of your committee that the traditional command should be used. If the Triangle is correctly formed, there should be space for the "Return Swords" order to be given at the Triangle and not prior to formation of the Triangle.
- 2. The optional method for the Standard Guard to return to the West after the Flag is returned to the East at the conclusion of the Flag Ceremony is being used successfully by several Commanderies and should be accepted as an alternate method.
- 3. Upon request of the Committee on Inactive Participation, the Ritual and Tactics Committee is recommending the addition of a 25 Year Award Presentation to the Tactics. This ceremony may be used by a Commandery to honor a Sir Knight who has achieved 25 years of service to Templary. Additionally, it can serve to bring back to the Asylum Sir Knights who may not have attended regularly for some time. The full ceremony is attached to this report.
- 4. Finally, your committee has received a proposed addition to the tactics for a reception line to welcome guests into the Asylum at the time of the Public Opening. Your Committee recommends that since this is a separate section of tactics and does not affect the remaining tactics, that Commanderies may use this on a trial basis during the 2006-2007 Templar Year. Your Committee would not recommend that this ceremony be counted in any scoring at this time. A copy of this welcoming ceremony is attached to this report.

Your committee wishes to thank the Grand Commander for his confidence and all who had input into this report.

Ritual and Tactics For 25 Year Award Presentation

Every Knights Templar who has attained 25 years in good standing is entitled to be presented with a Grand Commandery 25-year award which will be supplied by the Grand Recorder upon request of the local Recorder. The ceremony is recommended to be conducted at a meeting open to the public. The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Battalion Commander, or his representative should present the award.

General Guidelines

- A) The Asylum or meeting room should be arranged as shown in the diagram.
- B) The officers and Sir Knights taking part should have at least one practice and should make an attempt to recite the ceremony from memory.
- C) If possible, there should be a short musical program before the ceremony. Five minutes before the scheduled start time, the Dais Officers and Prelate assume their stations. The Sir Knights chosen for detail should be seated three on the south and three on the north.
- D) The Recorder should have as complete of Masonic Record of the honored Sir Knight as possible, including Blue Lodge and other appendant body affiliations and offices held.

Ritual

C: At the scheduled time should rise, and after a short welcome to all present continue:

Twenty-Five years ago, outside our Asylum stood a poor and weary Pilgrim, who desired to join with us in the noble and glorious work of defending the innocent, the helpless, and the Christian Religion.

His journey to knighthood was filled with revelations and danger; however, his courage, faith, and purity of heart guided his journey to a safe ending. At the conclusion of his trials, he sealed his vows and his desire to be numbered among us was fulfilled. He knelt at the foot of the lines to be dubbed and created a Knights Templar.

Today, we gather to pay honor to Sir Knight ______, who for 25 years has practiced the virtues of a Knights Templar.

C: Sir Knight Captain General, *hand salute*, Form the lines for the reception of our honored Sir Knight.

Captain General arises; steps forward one pace, salutes the Commander, faces west, and draws sword and commands:

CG: Detail, Attention. Fall In.

At the command of Attention, all Sir Knights Chosen for detail come to attention, including the Generalissimo. At the command of Fall In, the detail marches from their chairs into line. The Generalissimo descends from the dais and takes his position at the foot of the line on the North. The C.G. descends dais and takes his position at the foot of the line on the South.

CG: Detail. Draw...Swords. Present Swords.

All but the Captain General comes to Present Sword.

Captain General faces Commander, salutes and reports.

CG: Eminent Commander, the detail awaits your pleasure.

C. salutes C.G. who then steps into line (at carry).

CG: *quietly commands* Carry. Swords.

C: Sir Knights Senior and Junior Warden, *hand salute*, escort our 25-year Knight Templar to the foot of the line.

SW: Quietly to JW: Left wheel -- March

The JW closes ranks with the SW.

Left Wheel....March. Left Wheel...March.

SW and JW march directly to honored guests chair, salute the honored guest, and ask him to arise. The SW and JW about face, honored Sir Knight falls in between them and they march one pace west of the foot of the lines.

Prelate: Marches out to behind the Honored Sir Knight, raises his right hand, places his left hand on the right shoulder of the honored Knight.

C: Commandery, Attention.

CG: Detail. Order...Swords.

C: Uncover.

P: Almighty Father, giver of life, we ask that you wrap your protective arms around our beloved Sir Knight, who for 25 years has dedicated his life to thy service. O Lord, grant him continued health and strength to defend against the evils of this world and the detractors of the Christian Religion. This we ask in the name of Jesus Christ, who taught us to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy Kingdom Come, thy will be done, in Earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not, into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the Kingdom, the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

Prelate returns to his seat.

C: Recover. Sir Knights on the sidelines be seated.

CG: Detail. Carry...swords.

C: Sir Knights Junior and Senior Warden, conduct our honored Sir Knight through the lines.
Wardens and honored S.K. wait until: CG: PresentSwords.
Then step off with their left foot, and march through the lines until 2 paces past the C.G. and G.
After Wardens and honored S.K. pass the C.G., he commands:
CG: Detail, Carry Swords. Return Swords. About Face. Dismissed. S.K's in the detail return to their chairs. C.G. and G. reassume their stations on the dais. SW and JW stay with the honored Knight, and step two paces to the rear.
C: Sir Knight Recorder, you will read the Masonic history of Sir Knight
Recorder should read all Masonic history of the honored S.K. that is available.
C: Sir Knights, Ladies, and Guests, it is my honor to present Sir Knight Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana who will present the 25 year Commandery Award of Silver to our beloved Sir Knight.
Alternate forms:to present S.K Battalion Commander of Battalion Number, Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana
Or:to present S.K, personal representative of S.K Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana
G.C.: Eminent Commander, Distinguished Guests, Honored Sir Knight, Sir Knights and friends. We have heard the Masonic record of our faithful Frater who we are honoring at this time. For 25 years, you have dedicated your life to the ideals of Knights Templar and the Christian Religion.
G.C. Draws sword
GC: We are taught that the sword is endowed with three excellent properties, the hilt with Justice, its blade with Fortitude, and the point with Mercy. Let this day serve as a reminder to your dedication to living your life by these principals.
G.C. returns sword.
GC: Therefore Sir Knight, in recognition of your dedication to God and to Knights Templars, the Grand Commandery of Indiana has seen it fit to prepare and bestow upon you a silver cross as a fitting reward for 25 years of service.
C: Commandery, Attention.

GC: This symbol of faith, the Christians Hope and Trust, we again place upon your breast, there to remain until the last trumpet shall sound, forever to be worn as a visible mark as a 25 year Christian Mason and Knights Templar.

By virtue of the authority in me vested, by the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of the State of Indiana, it now becomes my privilege for and on behalf of all Knights Templar to present you with your 25-year award of Silver.

Wife, family member, friend, or Grand Commandery may place the Silver Cross upon the honored S.K.

C: Commandery, Be Seated.

Conclusion



Report of the Educational Foundation Committee

To: The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights

The Education Foundation Committee met on January 6 and February 4 of 2006 to determine the future of our commitment to the education of the youth of Indiana. Initially, it was decided to keep the loan program that is in place and to offer scholarships to deserving students from Indiana attending Indiana colleges and universities. The outstanding loans, as they are re-paid, will provide the money for future loans. Commercial interest rates should increase to make our loans attractive once again. The interest from our current investments will amount to \$1 OK in 2006 and this money will be available for scholarships or grants in 2007.

Several curricula for scholarships were proposed that are consistent with Templar teachings including bio-medical engineering, education and ecclesiastical. The latter two were selected as of primary interest. In order to make our awards prestigious, we decided to offer two scholarships of \$5k each in these areas. We will select a college or university offering these curricula and ask that they choose 2 candidates and we review their credentials (transcripts of high school and college courses, as well as, an essay) and select the winner. The agreement with the college will be for 2 years subject to review to continue the program.

Student commitment is of primary importance to us. So, we concluded that we would sponsor a seminary student and a primary or secondary teacher at a summer seminar or workshop. The seminar should be in the area of special education, math or science and it should enhance his or her teaching skills. A workshop may last for 6 weeks, meeting once a week, at a cost of \$50 or more each. So, the teacher seminar idea needs further review. At our March 4 meeting a representative from the Indiana Department of Education was asked to attend to offer insight into how we may help, through charity, teachers, who are already committed, to be more effective in the classroom. However, the meeting was canceled.

In the future, the committee will continue to research Indiana seminaries and summer programs for teachers, so that we will be ready for the 2007 academic year.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

To the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana

At the 2005 Annual Grand Conclave, Past Grand Commander Irvin L. Bitting reported that the Grand Commandery Per Capita fees had not been increased since 1992, and that at that time the finance committee promised that there would be no increase for at least five years. He reported that changes would be required this year and he was correct. It has now been 14 years and it is time to act.

The finance committee spent considerable time over the last year reviewing our financial condition and developing a plan for long term stability. This plan is composed of several parts.

First the budget categories have been reorganized to make that document more easily understood and provide greater flexibility in the day to day operations.

The resolution on Revenues will allow the per capita fees to be adjusted annually so that large changes can hopefully be avoided in future.

The resolution on the Permanent Fund will allow an increasing source of investment income so that in coming years a large part of routine operations can be financed from that source without resorting to per capita increases.

The budget for the 2006 — 2007 Templar year must be based upon the per capita fees already collected since December. It was therefore necessary to significantly limit expenditures for programs which are of great importance. Nonetheless, we completed a budget which is sufficient to operate the Grand Commandery for the coming year and the committee proposes the adoption of that budget.

We have also prepared a draft budget for the 2007 — 2008 and computed our needs. Based on those needs we propose that the per capita to be paid to the Grand Commandery next year be \$8.50 per dues paying member not including the Grand Encampment and Knights Templar Eye Foundation assessments. The committee considered the large one time assessments that several of our sister states have adopted but decided that a smaller annual amount would be more sustainable and more easily collected by our constituent Commanderies.

We believe that with these adjustments we will again be in a good sustainable position for the next several years.

General Order No. 1 Kaminsky

April 29, 2005

Annual Inspection of Constituent Commanderies

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 473 and 474 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of this Jurisdiction be inspected.
- 2. The Battalion Commander shall inspect each Commandery within the Battalion with the following exceptions:
 - The Grand Inspector General will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each elected Grand Officer, excluding the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder.
 - A fellow Grand Line Officer will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each appointed Grand Officer, if it is within the Battalion of the latter. Only the Grand Commander may authorize other exceptions or substitutions.
- 3. Each Inspecting Officer will send a "Notice of Inspection" courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder at least 30 days prior to the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and request the completion of specified reports. The Recorder shall provide the <u>completed</u> reports to the Inspecting Officers upon his arrival.
- 4. The records Inspection shall consist of:
 - A report on the membership efforts.
 - Examination of the books, records, and accounts.
 - Examination of the paraphernalia and property of the Commandery.
 - Examination of the Activity sheet.
- 5. No Inspection will be deemed complete until the Inspecting Officer has reviewed all books and financial records. If they are not presented at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the responsible Officer (Treasurer or Recorder) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within seven (7) days. Failure to comply may cause the Commandery to be placed upon probation until the obligation has been fulfilled.
- 6. Each Inspection shall start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Inspecting Officer. The inspection process may be completed over two meetings, with one meeting for the Reception inspection and another meeting for the conferral of the Order of the Temple. The full inspection may be done in one day, if desired. A full meal without green beans is optional. All inspections must be complete by November 30, 2005.
- 7. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the Reception and Order conferral. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to provide any needed assistance. If an actual candidate is present, the quality of the work is of prime importance.

- 8. An Inspection may consist of up to three (3) separate Commanderies participating together for an official inspection, when approved by the Battalion Commander. Points for the inspection will only be awarded when a participating Commandery has <u>nine</u> (9) or more of its members present (subject to review by the Battalion Commander and the Grand Commander).
- 9. The participating Commanderies will open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form using the Ten Man or Twelve Man Opening in accordance with the most recent official interpretation of the Ritual and official Indiana Asylum Tactics. Fifty (50) points for a Closed Inspection and one-hundred (100) points for a public Reception will be added to the Activities Sheet for that Commandery or divided among the participating Commanderies.
 - A Commandery of Knights Templar shall be opened in Full Form with Rehearsal of Duties then closed (if the Order of the Temple is being done at another time).
 - Upon completion of each inspection and prior to closing, the Inspecting Officer shall give his remarks first, and then the Grand Commander, if present, will follow with his remarks. Whenever he is not present, the Inspecting Officer, acting as the Grand Commander's official Representative, shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him, as such. If the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana is present, he will speak after the Grand Commander; otherwise, the Grand Commander will be the final speaker.
 - Violating proper protocol as prescribed in Indiana Tactics General Regulations shall constitute a no score for your inspection and thus require an additional inspection scheduled by the Right Eminent Grand Commander.
 - The public may be invited into the Asylum while the Commandery:
 - o The Commandery receives the Commander
 - o The Commander receives Distinguished Guests
 - o The sword manual is performed
 - o The Commandery is inspected for uniform
 - o The Triangle is formed
 - o The United States Flag and lecture is given
- 10. The participating Commanderies will exemplify the Full Ceremonial of the Order of the Temple. Commanderies may separately or jointly confer the Ceremonies in accordance with one of the following options at the time and place with the consent of the Battalion Commander. The inspection of the Order of the Temple may occur anytime after May 1, 2005 and prior to November 30, 2005.
 - A single Commandery may perform the Order of the Temple for points as graded by the Order of the Temple score sheet by the Battalion Commander and staff, if the majority of parts are filled by the inspected Commandery or Commanderies.
 - Same as above with the exception that up to three (3) Commanderies in the Battalion may participate with the points divided among the Commanderies based upon the level and percentage of participation.
 - An Instructional meeting may be held instead of any, or all, ritualistic work when the Inspecting Officer, with the concurrence of the Grand Inspector General, deems that change to be in the best interests of the Commandery.
- 11. The Inspecting Officer shall make his inspection report of each Commandery to the Grand Inspector General and the Deputy Grand Commander as well as the Eminent Commander and the

Recorder of the inspected Commandery within fourteen (14) days following the completion of the inspection. A full report of the Inspections will be discussed at the winter meeting and presented for publication and appropriate recognition at the Annual Conclave.

- 12. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the score of the opening and closing combined with that of the Order conferred (Activity scores excluded). All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose.
- 13. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each battalion on the activity score sheet will also be recognized by a ribbon that may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.
- 14. This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and be made a part of the minutes.

ITEM NO. 4 Constituent Commanderies are strongly urged to recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag at the opening of each Stated and Called Conclave.

ITEM NO. 5 A Constituent Commandery is not required to obtain special permission in order to meet and conduct business jointly with Chapter and/or Council. Such authority is found in Section 65(c) of the Laws of the Grand Encampment.

Said nomination shall be forwarded to the Right Eminent Grand Commander no later than February 15 of each year for the preceding year. The Grand Commandery may appoint the Grand Recorder and the Special Activities Committee to assist him in the selection of recipients.
- 3. Those chosen to receive the award shall be made known by the Right Eminent Grand Commander at the Grand Commandery Conclave each year. The names of the nominees to receive the award shall be kept strictly confidential until announced by the Grand Commander.
- 4. The award shall be limited to one (1) member from each Commandery in Indiana each year starting with the year 1977.
- 5. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the recipient's Commandery, such presentation to be at a Stated or Called Conclave. It is strongly recommended that such presentation be open to the public, visitors and friends and is performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar uniforms.

In addition thereto, an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested to by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested to by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

151st CONCLAVE DIGEST

The 151st Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana, was held at the Marriott Hotel East, Indianapolis. The Sir Knights of Columbus Commandery #4, the home Commandery of the Right Eminent Grand Commander, served as hosts for the Conclave.

The lines were formed by New Albany Commandery #5 and Columbus Commandery #14, under the direction of S. K. Terry Smith. Distinguished guests were received under the guidance of S. K. Dwight E. Lanman, Jr., K.C.T., P.G.C. and Harrison E. Lackey, H.P.G.C. Inspecting officer was S. K. David D. Goodwin, Right Eminent Grand Captain General and Personal Representative of S.K. Kenneth B. Fischer, Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar of the United States of America. Also present was Right Eminent Department Commander of the East Central Department of the Grand Encampment, S. K. Steven J. Barton and S. K. Willard R. Clutter, Jr., R. E. Past Department Commander for Subordinate Commanderies of the Grand Encampment. In addition, S. K.'s K. Edwin Applegate, K.C.T., R. E. Past Department Commander; S. K. Robert E. Price, K.G.C., Honorary Past Department Commander; and S. K. R. Frank Williams, K.C.T., Honorary Past Department Commander were in attendance. S. K. Robert G. Elrod, 33rd, Deputy for Indiana for the Supreme Council, 33rd, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction; and S. K. Richard J. Elman, Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Indiana, were present and took an active part in all of the proceedings.

Roll call of Grand Representatives showed that 39 were present, 9 were absent, and 2 were excused. The report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 197 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest. The Grand Recorder reported a loss of 231 for the year 2004 with 153 new Sir Knights having been created.

The Holy Land pilgrimage Committee report again showed that due to the unrest in the Middle East, the Grand Encampment canceled the 2005 pilgrimage. If all goes well this year, the hopes are that they will be able to again make the trip in 2006. The Educational Loan Foundation Committee reported that 1 loan of \$3,000.00 was made during the year and that outstanding loans totaled \$43,731.40 at years end. There were 8 loans paid off last year totaling \$23,500.00.

The official Conclave Program Book, "The Templar Crusader", was again successful and Richmond Commandery #8 received the award for selling the most ads. Forty-Five Sir Knights, Ladies and guests attended the Easter Sunrise Service in Washington, D.C., and the Indiana delegation, joined by a number of others, including the M.E. Grand Master, again placed a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington Cemetery.

The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies were represented by at least one delegate except for No.'s 44 and 50. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

Bulletin No. 4 Mentoring New Members and Junior Officers

Maintaining interest in new Sir Knights and preparing Junior Officers for future leadership are important issues in the life of any Commandery. An active mentoring program can achieve these goals and the following program is directed for implementation and monitoring by each Commandery.

- Upon Knighting, each new Sir Knight will have a mentor assigned whose responsibility it will be to cause the new Sir Knight to remain an active member by inviting him to all functions personally, helping him become involved in the Commandery to the extent the new Sir Knight is able, and answering all questions that he and his family may pose.
- The mentor will also be responsible to provide a member packet to the new Sir Knight containing information about the Commandery and Templary. This may include a calendar, newsletter, Commandery history, philanthropies, and information on Conclaves, activities, and officers.
- Each new officer in the line will also be assigned a mentor, preferably a Past Commander or Dais Officer, to provide guidance and encouragement to the new officer and to instruct and answer questions he will have as he advances.
- The officer's mentor shall make certain that the new officer has the proper ritual, tactics, officer's handbook bylaws, and other information he needs to succeed. The mentor shall assist the new officer in preparing his uniform and equipment and assist him with proficiency in protocols, practices and the School of the Knight.

The Recorder will maintain a record of the assignment of mentors and include that information with his books for annual inspection. A suggested place for keeping this information is the membership book or log of the Commandery.

The Generalissimo will be assigned to administer and monitor the mentorship program and to oversee the development of new Sir Knights and officers. I have requested the Battalion Commanders and Deputies to assist you, the Generalissimo, in implementing the program.



GRAND COMMANDER'S CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

"Behold, the virgin shall be with Child, and shall bring forth a Son, and they shall call His Name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us." Matthew 1:23

Christmas peace to all people of good will on this great feast of our salvation! This Feast of the Nativity 2005, like every Christmas, is a celebration of the incarnation of God in the person of Jesus Christ. As in years passed, we marvel and rejoice that our God "took flesh, was born of woman, and dwelt among us as a brother." Again this year, in our liturgies, carols, cards and conversations, we will claim that the King of Kings, the Prince of Peace, and the Lord of Lords emptied Himself and joined our human family. We give thanks because it is precisely through this unity with our human condition that God was able to lift us up to the heights of His divinity.

This Christmas, however, there is something very different. Unlike any previous Christmas, I sense that we have new and deeper insight into the frailty of our human condition. I believe the pain and suffering that we have witnessed give us cause to look into the manger with fresh eyes, wide open to just how frail a humanity Jesus took upon Himself. God comes to us as a vulnerable, fully-human child, not even able to lift his head, just like the rest of us; "an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes." The striking aspect of this year's Christmas is the realization that the first incarnation was not a singular event at all, but the beginning of a process of salvation that is working its way out even to this day through and in frail human beings. Just as God lie frail in his mother's arms that first Christmas Eve, so Jesus Christ cries out today, in frail, compromised human flesh.

As we ponder the resplendent face of that infant Jesus in the manger this year, let's recall that God entrusts his mission today to that same frail humanity, sinfulness included. God needs us today as always. We celebrate this feast of our salvation amidst unprecedented darkness, cynicism, sinfulness, and fear. But we who walk in darkness have seen a great light and that light is the love of Christ shining through our human lives, shining out to those who need the love of Christ. The mission of that frail infant Jesus on Christmas morn was to be *God in the flesh: Emmanuel*. This Christmas that same mission is ours; to be united to broken humanity, and precisely in that way, to bring salvation to the world.

May the grace and healing, the reconciliation and peace of the newborn King, Jesus Christ, live in your hearts today and bless you every day of this New Year!

I grew up on the South Side of Chicago in a blue collar neighborhood called the Bush. It was right next to US Steel South Works, which was where most of my neighbors worked. It was a community rich in tradition and the Christian Faith. On Christmas Eve, it was my family's practice to go to Midnight Mass at our local Church. My first recollection of this event was holding onto my mothers hand when entering this magnificent structure (which was more like a Cathedral than a Church). We had to leave early, because there were so many people attending that if you arrived on time it would be standing room only. When you entered you would smell the scent of fresh cut pine trees which decorated the front of the Church. It was also very festive with hundreds of multi-colored candles around the altar.

The service would be long and contained many Christmas Carols accompanied by the huge pipe organ. Starting as the above child and continuing into young adulthood, a feeling of togetherness and peace came over me every time I attended this Midnight Mass. However, what sticks in my mind the most, was when we exited the Church at the end of the service, a feeling of Freshness and the Renewal of Life that the Christ Child gives us came over me. The Father gave Him to us and then sacrificed Him. He did this for us to atone for our sins and also so we could start anew. How many of us could do the same.

Praise Him for the incarnation, for the word made flesh. I will not sing of shepherds watching flocks on frosty nights, or angel choristers. I will not sing of a stable bare in Bethlehem, or lowing oxen, wise men trailing star with gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Tonight I will sing praise to the Father who stood on heaven's threshold and said farewell to his Son as he stepped across the stars to Bethlehem and Jerusalem. And I will sing praise to the infinite, eternal Son, who became most finite, a baby who would one day be executed for my crime. Praise him in the heavens, Praise him in the stable, and Praise him in my heart.

GRAND COMMANDER'S EASTER MESSAGE

"He has risen, He is not here." (St. Mark 16:6) A simple statement: brief, unadorned, and explicit.

And yet this concise statement confirms a fact, an event, a phenomenon, which was – and still is – beyond the realm of human experience. The man who had been dead and buried for three days – placed in a grave which was sealed with a huge stone and guarded by Roman legionnaires – had emerged from the tomb.

Christ's earthly mission, which was completed with His crucifixion and burial, should at best have been remembered only within the immediate circle of His followers. This, after all, had been the case with the missions of many of His contemporaries and predecessors. A few wonderful ideas, some sublime moral principles, perhaps the memory of a smile on a kindly face, would have been Christ's legacy in the annals of history.

And this would indeed have been the case – had it not been for His unimaginable, unprecedented and ineffable resurrection front the dead.

The Resurrection is the high point of Christ's life and mission: the seal of truth on the teachings He bequeathed to humankind. Although their Master had spoken to them about His resurrection, simple human rationality made this difficult to believe. Some of the disciples even found it astonishing that Christ was unable to save Himself from death on the cross. Yet the unimaginable came to pass. The impossible became possible. Christ rose from the dead!

Two millennia have elapsed since that morning when Christ left behind Him the tomb, and opened before us the gate to eternal life. They had laid Him in a grave, not realizing that Light, Truth and Justice do not tolerate the grave. To the contrary, through His resurrection Christ laid in the grave all things related to sin and death.

GRAND PRELATE'S EASTER MESSAGE

Easter is the extraordinary event of Christ's overcoming death, of his leaving the tomb, where he had been buried and mourned, and showing to us, definitively, the power of life everlasting. How shall we understand this day? How shall we profess and proclaim it? How are we to live now in its power? It is surely a primary, defining event of our faith, essential to our Christian understanding. So how, then, are our lives affected by it? How are they shaped and changed by it forever?

Let me invite you to look at it in this manner... Do you remember the story of the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River? Read it again in the third chapter of the Gospel of Matthew. In this event, Jesus joins in with the great multitude of people who had come to be baptized by the austere, compelling man named John. And when Jesus joined that great throng of people there in those muddy waters, he was identifying himself with them; he was emphasizing his humanity as one person in solidarity with all humanity, there in the midst of others. Through this action, both real and symbolic, he was proclaiming the truth of his humanness, of his full identification with and participation in our human life.

It's useful to think of the death and Resurrection of Jesus as the partner pieces to the action of his birth and baptism. "Fully human and fully divine," it's often said of him. And that is fully so. In the Easter event of Jesus' being raised from death and ascending to heaven, it is his divinity, his eternal oneness with God that is being proclaimed and affirmed. There isn't any way we can actually prove the miracle of his Resurrection, any more than we can prove the miracle of his birth - or than we can prove the power of love or forgiveness, of tragedy or sorrow, to change our lives forever. Yet we have all experienced these at some point, and somehow we know them to be real and true.

One way to try to grasp all of this is to bring into our deep and probing thoughts this consideration: that we human beings are a part of eternal life always. We live in eternal life before we are born on earth; we live in eternal life as human beings while we are on this earth; and we live in eternal life still after our human death. Each of us, always, is a part of eternal life. And Jesus, through his unique relationship with God and through the particularly powerful and transparent events of his own life, has revealed to us this truth, this Easter truth of life eternal.

A Prayer before Easter Sunday Dinner

Creative God and Lord of Life, You who call forth from the darkness of death all those who love you, we rejoice, on this Easter Sunday, in resurrection from the dead of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Visit our home and this table with Your bright blessing of peace and life. We pause in the midst of this prayer to remember all the holy dead of our family who live now in You and who await the final and glorious resurrection of the dead. May they and we, because of our faith in You, our God, taste in the victory of life over death. May the Risen Christ, our Lord and Savior, be our guest as we celebrate His resurrection with this Easter Sunday dinner. Bless those who's work to prepare this meal has truly been a work of prayer, and bless all of us who shall share it with Easter love and joy. May You then, bless this table and this food, and each of us in Your Holy Name. Amen





ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No.2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874,

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868, and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929 Revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990.

Plymouth No. 26 - Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974, and merged with South Bend No. 13.

Washington No. 33 - Chartered April 16. 1890. Charter surrendered July 14, 1985, and merged with Vincennes No. 20.

Cyrene No. 34 - Chartered May 2, 1891. Name changed to Columbia City No. 34 on May 9, 1947.

Columbia City No. 34 - Successor to Cyrene No. 34. Charter surrendered September 4, 1968.

Bluffton No. 38 - Chartered April 18, 1895. Chartered surrendered October 20, 1994, and merged with Fort Wayne No. 4

Delphi No. 40 - Chartered February 4, 1897. Charter surrendered December 11, 1972, and merged with Lafayette No. 3.

Lebanon No. 43 – Chartered January 31, 1899.

New Castle No. 44 Chartered April 19, 1900, Charter surrendered January 1, 2006 and merged with Knightstown # 9

Princeton No. 46 - Chartered April 26, 1903. Charter surrendered April 22, 1995, and merged with LaValette No. 15.

Brazil No. 48 – Chartered May 12, 1904, Charter surrendered April 21, 2006 and merged with Greencastle No. 11

Rushville No. 49 - Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered November 20, 1997, and merged with Connersville No. 6.

Mishawaka No. 51 - Chartered January 16, 1906. Charter surrendered March 1, 1973 and merged with South Bend No. 13.

Winchester No. 53 - Chartered July 18, 1906. Charter surrendered 1961 and merged with Muncie No. 18.

Sullivan No. 54 Chartered July 4, 1907. Charter surrendered September 20,1979.

Martinsville No. 55 - Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered on December 1, 1932.

Gary No. 57 - Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary No. 57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995.

Peru No. 60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash No. 37.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941, Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62. At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but No record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity No. 62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge No. 717

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. - Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, to open Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued May 9, 2000 to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 23, 2003

Lawrence Commandery No. 67 Chartered April 29, 1994. September 21, 2002, Move Charter to Millersville Lodge. Name changed to H. E. Lackey Commandery No. 67 on April 23, 2003.

Wright Commandery No. 64 Chartered April 29, 1988. Dispensation granted on April 29, 2005, to move their Charter to Echerty Lodge No. 719, Echerty, Indiana 47116 on a permanent basis. (05 -01-06)
