Warrant from W. B. Hubbard, General Grand Master of the General Grand Encampment, of the United States, to form a State Grand Encampment for the State of Indiana was dated at Columbus, Ohio, on April 24, 1854.

The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

# Inspecting Officer Sir Knight William Howard Koon, II Most Eminent Grand Master Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, USA



# William H. Koon II, GCT M. E. Grand Master (2007 - 2012) of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar President of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc.

S.K. Koon was born in Lima, Ohio on March 12, 1949 to William H. and Vivian Brown Koon. He is a graduate of Bath High School, and attended the Ohio State University. He is a member of the Columbus Grove United Church of Christ. Bill is married to Elizabeth Jane Thornley, and they reside less than a mile from the family farm where he grew up near Columbus Grove, Ohio. They have a daughter, Andrea Koon Gillespie; son-in-law, Adam Gillespie; two grandsons, Adam Kade Gillespie, Silas Robert Gillespie; and son, William Steven Winebrenner. Bill is the President of Lord's Enterprises Inc. and Republic Mills Inc., both family agri-businesses including, livestock feed manufacturing, grain elevators, and a farming operation. He is involved in many professional and civic organizations, both locally, and statewide.

Masonically, Bill is a Senior DeMolay of Fidelity Chapter in Lima, and holds the Chevalier, Cross of Honor, Active Legion of Honor, is an Active Member of the International Supreme Council Order of DeMolay, and in 2006 was invested with the DeMolay Grand Cross. He was raised a Master Mason in 1970 in Ada Lodge No. 344, and demitted to Rufus Putnam Lodge No. 364 in Columbus Grove, where he served 3 years as Worshipful Master. In 2001 he became a dual member of Ft. Amanda Lodge No. 706 in Lima. He is a Past High Priest of Lima Chapter No. 49 RAM, and Past Illustrious Master of Lima Council No. 20 R&SM. In 2008 Bill was appointed the Grand Representative of the Grand Council of Romania R&SM near the Grand Council of Ohio. He was knighted in Shawnee Commandery No. 14 by his father on March 13, 1971, and was elected Eminent Commander in 1980. He is a member of Shawnee Commandery No. 14 Drill Team, marching in 7 Triennial Drills beginning in Chicago in 1973, including twice as Captain. He is a member, and Charter Commander of St. George Commandery No. 76, Ivanhoe Commandery No. 54, Van Wert, OH, St. Bernard Commandery No. 41, Denver, CO, Frankfort Commandery No. 4, Frankfort, KY, and Blaney Commandery No. 5, Tremont, IL. In addition to Ohio, Bill is a member and voting delegate of the Grand Commanderies of Ohio, Colorado, Illinois, and Kentucky. In 2006, Bill was elected an Honorary Member of the Wyoming Black Horse Troop.

Sir Knight Koon first served the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio, as an Aidede-Camp to S.K. William J. Faul, KCT, during his term as Grand Commander and received the Meritorious Service Award for his efforts in 1981. Bill served the First Division of the Grand Commandery of Ohio as Deputy Division Commander from 1985 - 1987, and was appointed Grand Sentinel by Sir Knight Frank W. Crane, KCT, REGC in 1987. He was elected Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio on September 13, 1996. In 2007 he was declared a Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio and its Jurisdiction, PHA. In 2009 he was made an Honorary Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Virginia.

In June 2009 he was elected an Honorary Past Commander of King Ferdinand Commandery No. 1 in Bucharest, Romania, and at the LXIV Triennial he was elected an Honorary Past

Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Romania, which was the first official action taken after the formation of that Grand Commandery.

Bill served the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the USA, as a member of the Easter Sunrise Breakfast Committee, and an ad-hoc member of the Committee on Drill Regulations from 1991 - 1994, and was Co-Chairman of the Committee on Drill Regulations during the 1994 - 1997 Triennium. He served 8 years as the personal Aide to S.K. Ned E. Dull, GCT, MEPGM of the Grand Encampment, and as the Affinity Coordinator for the Knights Templar Eye Foundation MasterCard program from 1991 to 1999. Bill was invested with the rank and dignity of Knight Commander of the Temple by the Grand Encampment in 1992, and is currently the Deputy for the Ohio KCT Program. He was appointed Department Commander of the East Central Department for the 1997 - 2000 Triennium. Bill was elected Right Eminent Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment on August 15, 2000 in Nashville, Tennessee. Upon Installation into that Office, he was invested with the Knight Grand Cross of the Temple. On August 16, 2006, he was installed as Right Eminent Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Encampment. In 2007, he was appointed Grand Representative of the Great Priory of the United Masonic, Religious and Military Orders of The Temple and Sepulcher and of The Hospital of Saint-John of Jerusalem and of Palestine, Rhodes and Malta for France near the Grand Encampment, and in 2009 was advanced to the Honor and Dignity of the Knight Grand Cross (pro causa). Upon the resignation of S.K. Richard B. Baldwin, GCT, MEGM on August 28, 2007 for reasons of health, he was installed as Most Eminent Grand Master by S.K. Thurman Cleveland Pace, KGC, MEHPGM. On August 18, 2009, he was elected by acclamation as Most Eminent Grand Master for the LXV Triennium, and was installed the next day, again by Sir Knight Thurman Cleveland Pace, KGC, MEHPGM. Five Days later he was made an Honorary Member and Honorary Past Supreme Grand Master of the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada.

Illustrious Brother Koon is a member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Valley of Toledo and a dual member of the Valley of Dayton, receiving the Thirty-Third Degree from the Supreme Council Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, NMJ, in Grand Rapids on September 23, 1997. In June, 2004 he was elected to the Board of Trustees of the Valley of Toledo, and in 2008 was elected Chairman. In 2007 he was made an Honorary Knight Commander Court of Honor (KCCH) of the Valley of New Orleans, Louisiana.

He is a member of appendant organizations including, Royal Order of Scotland; Zenobia Temple AAONMS of Toledo, OH, their Crusader Unit, and the Lima Shrine Club; Charter Sovereign and current Recorder of Charlemagne Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine in Lima, OH, Dual Member of Holy Grail Conclave, in Dayton, OH, Honorary Member of St. Leonard Conclave, in Jackson MS, St. Hilary Conclave, Ft. # SIR KNIGHT DUANE LEE VAUGHT, P.G.C. (IN) Right Eminent Grand Captain General

Duane L. Vaught was born February 17, 1956 in Crawfordsville, Indiana. He graduated from North Montgomery High School and from Indiana University, the latter with a Bachelors of Science degree in Accounting. He was baptized and confirmed as a member of the Methodist Church. In December 2000 he married Georgia Jean Nagai Goode.

Duane Vaught began his professional career with a national accounting firm, during which time he was licensed as a Certified Public Accountant. Since 1995 he has been with Stampfli Associates, CPAs, P.C. in Bloomington IN. Since October 2008 he has been president of that firm. Professionally, not-for-profit entities are his primary specialty. He is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, Indiana State CPA Society and the Bloomington Chapter of the Institute of Management Accountants.

His Masonic history began on April 30, 1971 when he was initiated into Montgomery Chapter of the Order of DeMolay. In DeMolay he served as Master Councilor of his Chapter, Illustrious Knight Commander of DeMolay Order of Knighthood in Indiana and two years as an appointed officer of the DeMolay State Council. He has received the DeMolay honors of Representative DeMolay, Chevalier, and Legion of Honor (Active)

Vaught was initiated, passed and raised a Master Mason in Montgomery Lodge, no. 50, in Crawfordsville IN. He served as Worshipful Master of Spencer Lodge no. 95 in 1993 receiving the Grand Master's Award with Distinction. He also served as Worshipful Master of Dwight L. Smith Lodge of Research. He served on several Grand Lodge committees and was appointed as the Grand Representative of Oregon. He was elected the 157<sup>th</sup> Most Worshipful Grand Master of Indiana for 2007 – 2008. In May 2008 he was elected a Trustee of the Grand Lodge and in 2009 became president of the board of Trustees.

Vaught received the degrees of Royal Arch Masonry, Cryptic Masonry and the Orders of Chivalric Masonry in 1977. He Served as High Priest of Crawfordsville Chapter No. 40 and Illustrious Master of Montgomery Council No. 34 in 1983. In 1995 he was appointed as Grand Representative of the Grand Chapter of Oregon and in 2007 the Grand Representative of the Grand Council of Arkansas.

Sir Knight Vaught served as Eminent Commander of Crawfordsville Commandery No. 25 in 1981 and 1982 and has received the Distinguished Service and Knight Commander of the Temple awards. He is Grand Representative of the Grand Commandery of Illinois near Indiana and also holds memberships in Bloomington Commandery No. 63 and St Anselm Commandery UD. He served ten years as an officer of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana culminating in serving as the 140<sup>th</sup> Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana in 2001 - 2002. Sir Knight Vaught was later appointed to the finance committee of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA.



He is a Knight Commander of the Red Branch of Eri and has served as Secretary of his council for the last ten years. He is currently chairmen of the Grand Council AMD finance committee.

Duane Vaught is currently serving as Puissant Sovereign of St Basil Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine and as an officer of St Andrew Tabernacle XXXV Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests He is a member, IX degree, Knight Grand Cross, of Indiana College, Masonic Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis, MSCRIF, and serves as Treasurer General of the High Council, MSCRIF of the United States.

He is a member of J. Herbert Nichols and Robert A. 

#### ROLL CALL OF GRAND REPRESENTATIVES

The Grand Commander then called upon the Grand Recorder to call the roll of the Grand Representatives. The Roll Call showed that there were 40 Grand Representatives present, 5 excused, 3 absent and 2 open. Grand Commander Bertch thanked the Grand Representatives for their work in keeping the Grand Commanderies of other jurisdictions informed of our doings and them of ours, and dismissed them.

#### **Deputy Grand Commander assumed command of the Grand Commandery**

Deputy Grand Commander Brown then assumed command of the Grand Commandery while the Grand Commander delivered his allocution as follows:

# GRAND COMMANDER'S ALLOCUTION April 24, 2009

To the Officers, Past Grand Commanders and Members of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana:

It is an honor to welcome you to this One Hundred Fifty-Fifth Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Indiana. To our Distinguished Guests from the Grand Encampment and our good friends from other Grand Jurisdictions, your presence here today might be called the icing on the cake of this session. We hope you all have an enjoyable time. If there is anything we can do to make your stay with us more pleasant, please feel free to contact any of the Officers.

My term as Grand Commander is about to end. For better or worse therefore it is my duty to give an accounting of my activities during this past Templar Year.

At the Winter Meeting in January 2008, I presented a brief outline of the program which I wished for the Grand Commandery to undertake in the 2008 - 2009 Templar Year. Since there had been rather large and ambitious modifications to the general program the previous year, and since the Officers of the Grand Commandery had agreed to support that new program for at least two years with minor modifications, the program which I presented was one of continuity with some clarification and needed house keeping.

- 1. For ceremonial purposes the Officers in the West were installed at the end of the Grand Session in 2008. Those officers are primarily Battalion Commanders and 99% of what they do is the work of a Battalion Commander. However, there are times during the Templar Year when the Officers in the West are needed for official duties such as a Color Guard.
- 2. The Responsibilities and Duties of the Battalion Commanders were clarified. It is now in writing that no matter who the Inspecting officer might be, the Battalion Commander is responsible for seeing that all pre-inspection paperwork related to the Inspection of a Commandery is to be forwarded to the proper local officers and that all post Inspection paper work is be forwarded to the proper officers of the Grand Commandery. Battalion Commanders also select their own Deputy Battalion Commanders

<u>Project Inner Focus</u>, instituted by Past Grand Commander Ronald Ellis, continues. This effort to retain members and close the back door should continue to be an essential part of our membership program. By making personal contact with members about to be suspended for non payment of dues, we are able to slow some of the drop in membership numbers and make those non attending members feel wanted.

During the last Templar Year, then Grand Commander Andrew Jackson began the process of sending a personally signed letter to members simply thanking them for being a Knight Templar. There was no mention of money or dues in the letter, just thanking them for their membership and urging them to take pride in being a Knight Templar. I continued the process this past year – leaving one third of the membership still to be contacted.

**New Member and Officer Mentoring:** was continued. Only by working with our new members, one on one can we make them feel welcome and get them involved in our organization. Only by mentoring our Officers as they come up through the line either at the local level or the state level can we train and maintain an effective Officer Corps.

<u>Communication between the Officers of the Grand Commandery:</u> One of my goals was to increase the level of communication between the Officers of the Grand Commandery. While efforts were made to do this, I regret that it did not succeed as I had wished.

York Rite Cooperation on the state level: I am pleased to say that cooperation and coordination between the three Grand York Rite Bodies has been good this year. On August 9, 2008 a one day York Rite Class was held at the Murat Center in honor of Most Worshipful Grand Master Jeffrey P. Zaring. The class resulted in fifty-one Knighting and the work presented was excellent. Also, the three bodies had an event day at Huntington on November 1, 2008 which was deemed a success. I can honestly say that the friendship developed between me and my counterparts in Grand Chapter and Grand Council has been wonderful and I am confident that it will continue.

Membership and Public Relations: The DVD and tri-fold York Rite membership flier created two years ago continues to be most useful and have been available for member recruitment. The bumper sticker, which says Knights Templar / Christian Mason, continues to show our pride of membership. The Templar Crusader program, begun last year continued this year. Templar Crusaders are men trained to visit Symbolic Lodges and present the York Rite story. Last year Templar Crusader jackets were awarded to top line signers which resulted in five Knightings and local Commanders whose Commandery had a net gain of one also received a jacket. This year the jackets will again be awarded and Sir Knights who received one last year and have accumulated an additional five top line singings resulting in Knighting will receive an additional emblem to be placed on the jacket they have already received. Sir Knight James L. Dove, Grand Generalissimo has been conducting a study of the effectiveness of the Templar Crusaders and will report on that later in this session

Working with and for the Grand Lodge: What a pleasure it has been to serve as Grand Commander at the same time that Most Worshipful Brother Jeffrey P. Zaring has served as Grand Master of Masons in Indiana. This past year, immediately following the installation of the Officers of the Grand Lodge, the Grand Commandery led a procession to Freemason's Hall to begin celebration of the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of that edifice. The Grand Commandery was honored to present the United States Flag at the Indiana Masonic Home on Memorial Day and lead the parade at Home Day in August. SK's Paul Cole, Carson Smith and I were also present at the observance of Veteran's Day at the Home. I was a guest at the banquet the evening prior to the Convocation of the Grand Lodge this past May and was received by then Most Worshipful Grand Master Duane L. Vaught with other guests during the opening portion of

the meeting. The three Grand York Rite Bodies also participated in Masonic night at Symphony on the Prairie at Conner Prairie on August 31.

#### **NECROLOGY**

This past Templar Year has seen the passing of 136 of the Fraters of this Grand Commandery. We miss their friendship and kindness and extend the sympathy of all of us to their families.

This past year we experienced the sudden loss of Sir Knight Willard R. Clutter KCT, PGC, and PDC. I know we all extend out best wishes to Lady Donna on his passing. I wish to personally thank Sir Knight Brian Harms Grand Sentinel for organizing the Templar Guards for Sir Knight Clutter's calling. Sir Knight Kenneth E. Gibson KCT, PGC will speak further of Sir Knight Clutter later in the session.

# GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS OF TEMPLAR OF INDIANA NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS MARCH 31, 2009

#### NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments -the organization adopted the Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations." The provisions of the standard require that investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities be measured at fair value in the statement of financial position. The unrealized gain on investment is reflected in the statement of activities.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) The Commandery adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, "Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Organizations." Under SFAS No. 117, the Commandery is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted and permanently restricted.

#### REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

To the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana

The finance committee met to consider the budget for templar years 2009-2010 and 2010-2011. The Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder and two of the dais officers were also present.

First it should be observed that the last year, and in particular the last eight months, have been financially difficult. Perhaps some of you may have noticed that for yourselves. It might be nice to think we can gather and enjoy ourselves without concern for such mundane matters but alas such is not the case. The permanent fund which was anticipated to provide between 25% and 30% of the discretionary funds for this Grand Commandery has been badly hurt by the economy. Our trustees will be reporting to you about this.

We also have the routine problems of a membership still in decline (even if not as fast as in the past) and inflation in costs, gasoline for example.

In order to produce a balanced budget it was necessary to take some steps. The Grand Recorder and Grand Trustees did not transfer funds from the permanent to the general fund in either of the last two years. Although we would prefer not to do so we must now take those funds and they have been included in the budget in the amounts of \$10,000 each the next two years. The money raised from the Templar Crusader has previously been used only for charity. Our current budget provides that \$2,000 and \$1,000 of those funds be contributed to the general fund in the next two years.

Expenses have also been cut. It has been the desire of the committee for several years to pump some money each year into the life membership fund to assure its stability. This will be cut back to \$500 for 2010-2011 and nothing for the coming year.

We have held the line on other expenses where possible and in fact the budget presented shows decreased total expenses two years out.

The final budget for 2009-2010 shows a surplus of \$11. The preliminary budget for 2010-2011 shows a surplus of only \$143. However even under these conditions it will necessary to increase Per Capita. The committee therefore recommends that the Per Capita to be collected on each dues paying member and remitted to the Grand Commandery in the early 2010 be set at \$9.00 to which will be added the Per Capita for Grand Encampment. This is an increase of 50 cents.

The committee thanks the Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder and Grand Trustees for their assistance in projecting our income and expenses.

Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers, Sir Knights, The Educational Foundation about three years ago decided to try to get out loan end and get into the scholarship business. In the last two years we have been awarding a \$5,000.00 scholarship to the Christian Theological Seminary here in Indianapolis. This scholarship of \$5,000.00 each year is for a student who is working on his or her Master or Doctors Degree in Divinity. We have promised CTS that we would work with them for two year guaranteeing them \$10.000.00 in scholarships and then we would review and at that time hoped to continue with them and at that time had hoped to start another program in another part of the state with another Seminary school. As the trustee stated in the financial report due to the financial conditions we will not be able to start another scholarship, but we will continue with the one \$5,000.00 scholarship. We are again talking to CTS but also to some Seminary schools in the northern part of the state. We may, on the decision of the committee decide move the scholarship there. In the loans we current have nine active loans who still owe us money, in the amount about \$23,000.00 two of those are just now coming due and we have no worry on those. The seven others are in late payment the committee decided we are going to file in small claims court against those after notification we are going after that part of the \$23,000.00.

You will also note the budget in the preprinted report. While we don't have much of a budget for expenses we have \$1,500.00 for mailings, attorney fees and such to collect the outstanding loans. So I also ask for the approval of the Budget for the Educational Foundation.

# TEMPLAR UNIFORM COMMITTEE 2008-2009 Annual Report

To: The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar Indiana

Your committee for the 'Templar Uniform' makes the following report:

#### Item 1)

Legislation has been prepared and presented to the Jurisprudence Committee for the review and adoption of the use of a **Summer Uniform** for the benefit of the Commanderies interested in such.

The results of this legislation should be announced at the upcoming Grand Session and copies distributed as required.

#### Item 2)

A verbal inquiry has been received from a specific Commandery regarding the Malta Jewel. This request consists of defining the proper form for wearing the Malta Jewel for the State of Indiana, specifically regarding the metallic color and ornamentation of the hardware of which the jewel is composed. The inquiry concerns the interest of style and rank.

After discussions held at the Winter Meeting, it was determined that matters of style can subjective by each individual Commandery, so long as the minimum design, per that described in the Ritual book, is complied with.

#### Item 3)

This committee is still observing jewels being worn on the Templar Uniform which are inconsistent with the Sections 920 (483 (b)) & 920 (d) Resolution No. 10. As every effort is being made to correct errors as possible, another suggestion could be to have each Commandery sent a copy of these Regulations along with a copy of the DVD prepared for this matter urging each Eminent Commander to put on an inhouse presentation (showing the DVD where possible) and distributing written copies as required to the Sir Knights of each Commandery.

#### **Summer Attire Resolution**

#### **GENERAL**

SECTION 993 (A) The summer attire will consist of a white garrison cap, white short sleeve pilot's shirt with epaulets and two (2) flat pockets on the breast, black necktie, black trousers, black belt, sword & scabbard together with black shoes and black hose. The appearance of a Sir Knight in public shall be permitted at parades and civic activities, drill exhibitions and drill competitions and Stated and Special Conclaves held between Memorial Day and Labor Day, and at the discretion of the officer in charge of the detail. The summer attire is not to be worn for the conferral of the Order of the Temple.

#### **CAP**

SECTION 993 (B) The cap shall be a regulation U.S. Navy CPO, Officers frame or garrison cap. The cap shall have a black headband and visor with a white top. The chin strap and buttons shall be regulation silver for all Sir Knights below the rank of Commander and gold for all Sir Knights with the rank of Commander or higher. The visor shall be plain black for all Sir Knights below the rank of Grand Commander and shall have a single row of acorns and oak leaves in gold for the rank of Grand Commander and Past Grand Commander.

#### **CAP DEVICE**

SECTION 993 (C) The metallic cap device shall be worn centered above the cap headband and shall consist of a 2-1/4" (inch) Templar Cross in purple for Past Grand Commanders, the same Templar Cross in red for Grand Commandery Officers, a 1-3/8" (inch) Passion Cross with a red center surrounded by gold rays for Past Commanders and Commanders, and a 1-3/8" (inch) Passion Cross with red center surrounded by silver edging and without rays of light for all other Sir Knights.

#### **SHIRT**

SECTION 993 (D) The shirt shall be a white, short sleeve, of military style with shoulder epaulets and two (2) flap pockets, one on each breast, consisting of a cotton or cotton blend fabric. The collar will be plain versus button-down, snap-tab, or collar pin types. The weave of the fabric will be plain rather than a patterned weave.

Pinned over the center of the wearer's right pocket flap and with the bottom edge touching the top flap seam shall be an optional gold metal name badge with the wearer's full name in black letter conforming to SECTION 914 (483(m))

Pinned over the center of the wearer's left pocket flap and with the bottom edge touching the top flap seam shall be a metal bar representing the three (3) Orders of the Commandery. The metal bar shall contain three (3) black panels, each surrounded with a silver line. Each of the panels shall be ½" (inch) wide by 1" (inch) long.

#### **SHOULDER INSIGNIA**

SECTION 993 (E) A Cross shall be worn in the center of each shoulder epaulet with the long axis of the Cross following the shoulder line, and the base of the Cross toward the outside of the shoulder. In each case, a 1-1/2" (inch) wide colored grosgrain ribbon shoulder loop shall be worn around each epaulet and under the appropriate Cross and centered thereon.

For Past Grand commanders, it shall be a purple metal Templar Cross surrounded by a gold line and shall be 1"x 1" (inch). The shoulder loop shall be of purple color.

For Grand Commandery Officer, it shall be a red metal Templar Cross surrounded by a gold line and shall be 1"x 1" (inch). The shoulder loop shall be of red color.

For Past Commanders, it shall be a red metal Passion Cross surrounded by a gold line and rays and shall be 1"x 1" (inch). The shoulder loop shall be of red color.

For Commanders, it shall be a red metal Passion Cross surrounded by a gold line and rays and shall be 1"x 3/4" (inch). The shoulder loop shall be green.

For other Commandery Dias Officers (Generalissimo, Captain General and Prelate), it shall be a red metal Passion Cross surrounded by a silver line and without rays and shall be 1"x 3/4" (inch). The shoulder loop shall be of green color.

For all other Sir Knights, it shall be a red metal Passion Cross surrounded by a silver line and without rays and shall be 1"x  $\frac{3}{4}$ " (inch). The shoulder loop shall be of silver color.

#### SHIRT COLLAR INSIGNIA

SECTION 993 (F) For Past Grand Commanders and Grand Commandery Officers shall be two (2) die cut gold metal state insignia (IN) to be worn one on each collar tip. For Past Commanders and Commanders shall be one (1) die cut gold metal state insignia (IN) and one (1) die cut gold metal Commandery Number. For Sir Knights, both collar insignia shall be the same as for Commanders except the color shall be silver. The state insignia shall be worn on the wearer's right collar and the Commandery Number shall be worn on the wearer's left collar. These insignia shall be worn centered on an imaginary line which bisects the angle of the collar tip and the center of the pins shall be located 1-3/4" (inch) back from the tip. Both collar insignia will appear to be parallel to the floor.

#### **TROUSERS**

SECTION 993 (G) The trousers will conform to SECTION 930 (483(h)).

#### **BELT**

SECTION 993 (H) The preferred belt is a standard military black web belt with gold metal buckle for the Commanders and higher in rank and silver metal buckle for Sir Knights below the rank of Commander. Optionally, a plain black leather belt shall be permitted with either gold or silver metal buckle as would be appropriate to the rank indicated.

#### **SWORD SLING**

SECTION 993 (I) The preferred method of wearing the scabbard shall be a black leather frog or black leather belt sling with two (2) clips for attaching the scabbard rings and worn over the wearer's belt on the left side of the body. Optionally permitted shall be only the white, over the shoulder sling. Old style Commandery belts and chain are not permitted with the summer attire.

#### **SWORD & SCABBARD**

SECTION 993 (J) Sword and Scabbard shall conform to SECTION 945 (483(k)).

#### **NECKTIE**

SECTION 993 (K) Necktie shall conform to SECTION 928 (483(d)).

#### **GLOVES**

SECTION 993 (L) Gloves shall conform to SECTION 945 (483(e)).

#### **HOSE**

SECTION 993 (M) Hose shall conform to SECTION 932.

#### **SHOES**

SECTION 993 (N) Shoes shall conform to SECTION 934.

Whereas the continuity of officers, the opportunity for officers to obtain experience and the opportunity to train and evaluate the future leaders of our Fraternity are matters of great importance,

And whereas the officers of the Grand Commandery, having been duly elected to their respective offices deserve the opportunity to take reasonable actions in furtherance of those duties,

And whereas the system of officers reestablished during the term of office of Dwight E. Lanman, Jr., Past Grand Commander has been a great success.

Therefore be it resolved that section 412 which reads:

### **NOMINATIONS-ELECTIONS**

SECTION 408. The elected officers of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana shall be:

- 1 Right Eminent Grand Commander
- 2 Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander
- 3 Eminent Grand Generalissimo
- 4 Eminent Grand Captain General

- 5 Eminent Grand Senior Warden
- 6 Eminent Grand Junior Warden
- 7 Eminent Grand Treasurer
- 8 Eminent Grand Recorder
- 9 A Grand Trustee

Each such officer shall receive a majority of the votes cast by the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana.

The Eminent Grand Prelate shall be appointed by the newly elected Right Eminent Grand Commander prior to his installation.

The elected officers enumerated above, as well as the Grand Prelate, shall be installed as soon after their election as practicable, and before entering upon the duties of their respective offices.

The appointment of Eminent Grand Standard Bearer, Eminent Grand Sword Bearer, Eminent Grand Warder, and Eminent Grand Sentinel may be announced by the Right Eminent Grand Commander at the winter meeting prior to the Grand Commandery session over which he will preside The Right Eminent Grand Commander may install such appointments, at his convenience, prior to the opening of the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery The duties of such appointed officers shall be at the discretion of the Right Eminent Grand Commander Their appointment shall terminate with the adjournment of the Annual Conclave for which they were appointed, and no Past Grand Rank shall accrue to a member by virtue of such temporary appointment.

Where more than one name is in nomination the election shall be by ballot and where one name is in nomination the election may be by acclamation.

In putting names in nomination, no nominating speeches shall be made further than to give the name of the nominee, his residence, his business, his church affiliation, and the Commandery of which he is a member.

Shall be amended to read:

SECTION 408. The elected officers of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana shall be:

Each such officer shall be elected by a majority of the votes cast by the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana in lawful session.

Where more than one name is in nomination the election shall be by ballot and where one name is in nomination the election may be by acclamation.

In putting names in nomination, no nominating speeches shall be made further than to give the name of the nominee, his residence, his business, his church affiliation, and the Commandery of which he is a member.

The Eminent Grand Prelate shall be appointed by the newly elected Right Eminent Grand Commander prior to his installation.

All officers elected or appointed, shall be installed as soon after their election as practicable, and before entering upon the duties of their respective offices.

The Grand Commander may appoint an Eminent Grand Standard Bearer, Eminent Grand Sword Bearer, Eminent Grand Warder, and Eminent Grand Sentinel. ### DISPENSATIONS AND CHARTERS REPORT April 24, 2009

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Members of the Grand Commandery:

Jeffersonville No. 27 - Chartered April 26, 1876. Charter surrendered October 13, 2008, and merged with New Albany No. 5.

The Committee on Dispensations & Charters has received a request to change the name of Oriental Commandery No. 62 (Currently called Trinity Commandery) to Prather Commandery No. 62.

In March of 1969, there was a petition to move Oriental Commandery No. 62 from Irvington Lodge No. 666 to move to the Temple at East Washington and Johnson. Motion to move was made and seconded at the Stated Conclave on March 10, 1969 and laid over to the April Stated Conclave, where it was approved. At the 115<sup>th</sup> Annual Conclave in 1969, the petition was read and voted on to allow the move, but no mention was made of a name change. The move was approved.

In the 1970 proceedings of the 116<sup>th</sup> Annual Conclave Bulletin No. 1 "Annual Conclave Digest" of the 115th (1969) Annual Conclave was printed. There it stated that the move and name change was approved.

The list of Constituent Commanderies in the 1969, 1970 and 1971 proceedings still said the Commandery was named Oriental (DeMolay). I can only assume it was missed when printing the proceedings. In 1972 the name in the proceedings changed to Trinity (DeMolay) in the Constituent Commandery list.

This petition will clear up the confusion by renaming (DeMolay, Oriental, Trinity) Commandery to Prather Commandery No. 62. The Committee is in favor of this request and recommends approval of this petition. This will require a vote at the annual Conclave by the Sir Knight's.

### MEMBERSHIP-PUBLICITY AND PUBLIC RELATIONS

To: The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers of the Grand Commandery and Sir Sir Knights All of Indiana.

The following is the annual report of the Committee on the above titled programs:

**Membership**: The scheduled three (3) Templar Training Academies for the early spring of 2009 was not accomplished due to means beyond the control of the Committee. This training was to be scheduled in areas of weak York Rite recruitment and new membership activity. The tentative plans were to have training in the areas of Elkhart in Battalion #2, Muncie in Battalion #4 and Bedford in Battalion #8. We need to get more activity done in these areas and get trained personnel on board to get the York Rite message out to uninformed Mason. Plans are being made for the Templar Year 2009 to get this training program going with the resources of the Officers of the Grand Commandery. We hope that these 3 Battalions can get more visitations to Blue Lodges, give presentations and generate enthusiasm within the Commanderies. Battalion 2 is moving in the right direction and we hope the trend continues. Considerable effort was placed in 2007 to train roughly 58 Templar Crusaders that would visit Blue Lodges and give presentations for the York Rite. Roughly only about 20% have accomplished this task and many are still planning on doing visitations. During 2008 there were 196 Knightings, reinstatements, affiliations and does stop the downward trend because of the 360 Demits, Suspensions and deaths so far. We must pursue the road of stopping the Demits and Suspensions through education, revitalization and fellowship and attempt to assist those in need with help with dues in these rough times to avoid losing a great Templar because he is too proud. DON'T SAY GOODBYE, TILL YOU LOOK HIM IN THE EYE! WHAT EVER YOU DO, DON'T **GIVE UP ON HIM!** 

This Committee believes that in order to shut the back door on Demits and Suspensions concerned efforts must be taken by the Local Commanderies and they are: Actively promote and employ the Mentor Program for all members and Officers. Battalion Commanders are urged to visit Commanderies in their respective Battalion, meet with the Dais Officers and encourage them to follow the Mentoring Program as outlined in previous years. Battalion Commanders who are not aware of the program are urged to contact this Committee and we will get them the program. If the Battalion Commander does not believe in the Mentoring Program then how can he promote it effectively? Another means of maintaining interest in the York Rite of Freemasonry is to actively promote Family Functions in conjunction with York Rite events. Getting the spouse of a Sir Knight involved with other spouses by holding Christmas Observance's/Parties, Easter Observance's, Ascension Day Service at a local Church and Summer Picnics with the families. Each Commander should make an effort to communicate with the Sir Knights spouse personally, inviting them to the event.

Drill teams are also a way to get enthusiasm going in a Commandery to band Sir Knights together to form a group dedicated to helping each other and recognize the need to depend on each other. To actively participate in parades, as a proud band of Sir Knights displaying Templary in their communities. The Sir Knights of Battalion #1 are building a float to actively enter in parades.

<u>Public relations:</u> Community involvement is a great source of promoting Templary. If the public is aware of the Knights Templar then the uninformed Mason will also become aware of the York Rite of Freemasonry. A concrete pad was installed at the Indiana Masonic Home for the Knights Templar to continue to put up our Nativity Display each Christmas Season. The residents enjoy our display

and the pad can be used the rest of the year for a picnic/ sitting area for residents. We have in the past, taken out an ad in the DeMolay Conclave Souvenir Program and have sponsored a boy to attend the Annual Session, we encourage this to continue. This will promote young men of the DeMolay to continue their Masonic education by joining the Freemasons and the York Rite of Freemasonry. This Committee also encourages all Commanderies in the State to promote and support by donations to their local food banks, Salvations Army food Banks, local Boy / Girl Scouts, Rainbow Assembly, DeMolay Chapter and Job's Daughters. The leaders of tomorrow are here with us today and we must insure that we support them and their programs.

<u>Closing:</u> Without the leadership, education, determination, dedication, charity, involvement and a clear vision for the Knights Templar Membership Program, its mission will not succeed. It is up to all of us to promote, be visible and unafraid to go the extra mile to get the job done. This Committee represents a small group of Templars trying to get enthusiasm going but, without the support and execution from all, we will not succeed. We must first start with a vision, develop the strategy, agree on the time frame of engagement then all of us execute the plan. We cannot measure results with only a few participating in the program. The Battalion Commanders are our front line of information to the Commanderies in their respective Battalions and should be the first one to lead the charge.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- Develop a 25 Year Certificate to present to Sir Knights reaching that attainment to show appreciation for their years of dedication.
- Every top line signer of (5) petitions gets his dues remitted for the upcoming year by the Grand Commandery.
- Increase activity points for parades, public appearances in uniform and sponsorship of a local youth team.
- Have Grand Commandery fund the cost of the bus or subsidize the Easter Sunrise Service to get more attendance and have 2 pick up points in the State. This will reduce the cost of the trip and maybe we can get more to attend.
- Recognize and encourage the use of Summer Uniforms.
- Promote an outstanding Ritualistic Award.
- Promote the Indiana Commander of the Year, invite to the Banquets with spouse and publish in the Templar Magazine.
- Purchase benches or picnic tables for the pad we installed at the IMH, with a plaque as donated by the Knights Templar of Indiana.
- Hold instructional for Commanderies to assist them on Tactics and floor work on the Orders instead of Inspection.
- Award Activity Points for Public Receptions held with the 12 man opening.

He was elected as Treasurer in 2002-04. He was elected as Secretary in 2005-08. He was exalted a Royal Arch Mason in Noblesville Chapter No. 120, R.A.M. on May 9, 1984. He served as High Priest in 1986 and 1991. He was greeted as a Select Master in Noblesville Council No. 89, R. &S.M on May 31, 1984. He served as Illustrious Master in 1987 and 1988. He was created Knight Templar in Noblesville Commandery No. 61 on October 17, 1984. He served as Commander in 1988, 1990, and 1995. He received the Knight Templar Distinguished Service Award in 1995 from his Commandery.

Sir Knight Clutter was elected Grand Junior Warden of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana on April 26, 1991. He advanced through the Grand Commandery Line and was elected Grand Commander on April 26, 1996. Sir Knight Clutter was appointed a Department Commander in 2000 by William J. Jones, M.E. Grand Master of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA. He became a member of the Grand Encampment College of Honors and was awarded the Knight Cross of the Temple Award for his leadership and continued service to Templary in 1999.

Sir Knight Clutter was a member of Murat Temple, A.A.O.N.M.S. in Indianapolis.

He was a member of the Indianapolis Valley of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, N.M.J. He served as Thrice Potent Master in 2004. He was coroneted a Sovereign Grand Inspector General 33° Degree at Cincinnati, Ohio on September 29, 1998.

He served as the Grand Marshal of the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the State of Indiana in 1997. He served on the Masonic Home Board of Directors of the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the State of Indiana in 1999-2000. He served as Preceptor General of the York Rite Sovereign College of North America in 2006-07. He was appointed Personnel Representative of the Grand Master General of the Convent General of the Knight York Cross of Honor in 2004-2007. He was appointed Grand Sentinel of the Convent General of the Knight York Cross of Honor in 2007.

Sir Knight Clutter's Appendant Masonic memberships included: Radiant Chapter No. 200; Order of Easter Star, St Basil Conclave and St. Hilary Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine; Sagamore Valley No. 133, York Rite Sovereign College; St. Bernard de Clairvaux Council No. 256, Allied Masonic Degrees; Robert A. Woods, Priory No. 62, K.Y.C.H.; Gennesaret Tabernacle, H.R.A.K.P.; Royal Order of Scotland; Yeoman of York, Angola No. 2, Grand Council of Knight Masons, Indiana No. 15; Indiana College of Societies Rosicruciana; and the Indiana Past Commanders Association. He had served as the presiding officer in many of these organizations over the years.

- Create a phone tree committee (possibly consisting of inactive members) keeping members abreast of events.
- Make personal requests of members to be willing to participate in a portion of an Order or on committee.
- Make personal requests of members to set-up/take down for Orders.

### **Inactive Participation (cont)**

- Create (where applicable) a drill team to participate in a minimum of a 'Pass-In-Review' at the next Grand Session.
- Have an education night providing information on the Eye Foundation, Holy Land Pilgrimage, Scholarship program and the DC Easter Sunrise Service trip.
- Create a committee for banquets consisting of: Father & child night; Widows and Wives night; Past Commanders Honor night and Family picnics.
- Create a committee for presenting the US Flag at: a Blue Lodge, School, Easter Star/Amaranth, Scottish Rite event and any youth group (DeMolay, Job's Daughters, and Rainbow Girls).

## REPORT OF THE GRAND INSPECTOR GENERAL, 2008-09 April 24, 2009

To: The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana:

We have completed the Inspection schedule for 2008-2009. I would like to address some issues that have surfaced during this period.

### **Problems**

- Several reports were not submitted until after both the Inspection and Reception were complete. I would have preferred that they be sent after each is completed.
- Many reports were not sent until after the two week limit for the inspection. This needs to be improved.
- Bray and Johnson County Commanderies did not have an instructional until January. This delay should be avoided in the future.
- Bloomington Commandery did not participate in the Battalion Inspection /Reception on the date that it was planned. This creates extra work for the inspecting officers because they must set another date for this Commandery to complete the inspection. And, this lack of cooperation creates a bad image for the rest of the Commanderies in the Battalion.
- Mergers should always be a concern for us. Jeffersonville Commandery No. 27 has merged with New Albany Commandery. The members of a merged Commandery, especially, if they must travel a distance to attend a meeting, may lose interest and eventually demit or not pay their dues.
- There were several By-Laws dates excluded from the Inspecting Officer's Report. This date indicates whether or not the By-Laws are current.

### **Strong or Weak Commanderies**

I can tell whether a Commandery is strong or weak by looking at the Activities Sheet, Activities Score and Leadership Score, in particular. The activities score indicates if the Commandery is doing anything of interest for its members. The leadership score shows if there is a plan of action (one year) or one for the future (5 years). Very few Commanderies have both plans. All other activity scores on the sheet are a reflection of these two scores.

#### **Kudos**

I wish to thank you, Right Eminent Grand Commander for the opportunity to serve as Grand Inspector General this year. It was a fulfilling experience that went smoothly with the Battalion Commanders and the help of the Deputy Grand Inspector Generals, SK Wayne Sheets and SK Stanton Davis.

### Recommendations

- All reports are to be filed with the GIG and DGC within 2 weeks after the Inspection or Reception date. This may have bearing on officer rating.
- There will be no Inspection/Reception/Instructional dates allowed after December 15.
- Continue to stress the importance of 1 and 5 year plans and keeping the By-Laws current (updated every 5 years) with the Commanderies in your Battalion.
- The Battalion Commanders need to review the results of the Inspection/Reception with the Commandery at their next Stated Conclave.

# **Annual Inspection of Constituent Commanderies**

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 851 (473) and 852 (474) of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of this Jurisdiction be inspected.
- 2. The Battalion Commander shall inspect each Commandery within the Battalion with the following exceptions.
  - a. The Grand Inspector General will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each elected Grand Officer, excluding the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder.
  - b. A Division Commander will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each appointed Grand Officer, if it is within the Battalion of the latter. Only the Grand Commander may authorize other exceptions or substitutions.
  - c. A Battalion Commander may not inspect his home Commandery, such inspection shall be performed by the Division Commander and if that is also the home Commandery of the Division Commander the inspection would be performed by the Grand Inspector General.
- 3. Each Inspecting Officer shall send a "Notice of Inspection" courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder at least 30 days prior to the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and request the completion of specified reports. The Recorder shall provide the <u>completed</u> reports to the Inspecting Officer upon his arrival.
- 4. The records Inspection shall consist of
  - a. A report on membership
  - b. Examination of books, records, and accounts
  - c. Examination of the paraphernalia and property of the Commandery
  - d. Examination of the Activity sheet.
- 5. No Inspection will be considered complete until the Inspecting Officer has reviewed all books and financial records. If such records are not present at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the responsible officer (Treasurer or Recorder) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within seven (7) days. Failure to comply may cause the Commandery to be placed upon probation until the obligation has been fulfilled.
- 6. Each Inspection shall start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the Inspecting officer. Dates and times may only be changed by permission of the Grand Commander. All Inspections must be complete by December 15, 2008.

- 7. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the Full Form Opening. If necessary, visitors or other members may assume some of the stations. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to provide any needed assistance. If an actual candidate is present, the quality of the work is of prime importance.
- 8. An Inspection may consist of up to three (3) separate Commanderies or of a Battalion participating together for an official inspection, when approved by the Battalion Commander and the Grand Commander. Points for the inspection will be awarded when a participating Commandery has nine (9) or more of its members present (subject to review by the Division Commander and the Grand Commander).
- 9. A Commandery of Knights Templars shall be opened in Full Form with Rehearsal of Duties. Any of the three Orders may be exemplified. If the Order of Red Cross or the Order of Malta is exemplified, work shall be suspended in the Commandery and a Council or Priory declared open. Upon completion of the Order the Council or Priory shall be closed and business resumed in the Commandery
- 10. Upon completion of the Inspection, the Inspecting Officer will give his remarks; he will then call on anyone else for remarks and then call on the Grand Commander or his official Representative for remarks. The Grand Commander or his official Representative speaks last.
- 11. A single Commandery may exemplify an order for scoring by the Battalion Commander based on the generally accepted score sheet, if a majority of the parts are filled by members of that Commandery.
- 12. Up to three Commanderies, or by permission, a Battalion, may exemplify an order for scoring based on the generally accepted score sheet. To receive a score in a joint exemplification, a Commandery must actually participate in the Order with a reasonable number of participants.
- 13. An instructional meeting on any Order may be held by the Battalion Commander or the Grand Inspector General at a Commandery which requests such meeting. This may be done instead of an Order exemplification. The Commandery will receive no points for this meeting.
- 14. The Inspecting Officer shall make his report to the Grand Inspector General and the Deputy Grand Commander within fourteen (14) days following the completion of the Inspection. The Inspection scores will be discussed at Winter Meeting and published in the Annual Proceedings.
- 15. The Battalion Guidon shall be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion having the highest Ritualistic Score. The Ritualistic score shall be the combined score for Opening and Closing and Exemplification of an Order.
- 16. The Commandery receiving the highest Ritualistic Score in the state, shall receive the Grand Commandery Guidon.
- 17. The two Commanderies in each Battalion having the highest Activity Score shall receive a ribbon which may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant.

18. This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and be made a part of the minutes.

## **Special Dispensations**

- ITEM NO. 3 Constituent Recorders are hereby requested, prior to requesting a Dispensation for any purpose, to first read the following Sections of the Constitution and Laws of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar 214, 215, 48(f)3, 177, 76, 145, and 48(f)1.
- ITEM NO. 4 Constituent Commanderies are strongly urged to recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag at the opening of each Stated and Called Conclave.
- ITEM NO. 5 A Constituent Commandery is not required to obtain special permission in order to meet and conduct business jointly with Chapter and/or Council. Such authority is found in Section 65(c) of the Laws of the Grand Encampment.

It is to be noted that this award is to be made only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order of Knights Templar far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an Officer or Member. No elected Grand Commandery or Grand Encampment officer, past or present, is eligible to receive this award. This honor is for the Sir Knight of your Commandery who you consider to have been, or is, outstanding in his Chivalric Labors.

Should your Commandery desire to make a nomination for this award, your will use the following procedure:

- 1. Pass a resolution in your Commandery, naming the Sir Knight to be nominated.
- 2. Write to the Grand Recorder for a nomination form.
- 3. Read the instructions on the reverse side of the form, fill it out, and forward the form directly to the Grand Commander, David M. Bertch, 102 E. Seminary St. Liberty, IN 47353.

The nomination form must be in the hands of the Grand Commander prior to February 1, 2009. Incomplete forms and those mailed after that date will not be considered. Your Commandery should consider those submitted previously but who did not receive the award at that time.

# "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR" RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) In accordance with the provisions of Section 237½ of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, as amended at the 50th Triennial Conclave, the meritorious Award known as the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, shall be conferred by the Grand Master on behalf of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to deserving Sir Knights of Constituent and Subordinate Commanderies upon certain conditions hereinafter set forth.
- (2) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR shall be awarded "only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order, far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an officer or member." In deciding upon the award, precedents shall be entirely ignored and each case shall be decided upon its own unusual merits. No posthumous award shall be made, and no present or past elected Grand Officer of a Grand Commandery shall be eligible for the award.
- (3) Only one nomination may be made from a Grand Commandery membership of 5,000 or less, plus one additional nomination may be made by a Grand Commandery for each additional 5,000 of its members, or major fraction thereof, during any one year. Only one nomination may be made from the total of the Subordinate Commanderies during one year.
  - (4) The procedure to be followed for making nominations for this Award shall be as follows:
    - a. Any Constituent Commandery desiring to make a nomination shall first adopt a formal resolution, setting forth the full name of its nominee, and the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
    - b. The Commander of such Constituent Commandery shall thereupon cause to be filled-in a Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of his Grand Commandery, giving the date, full name of the nominee, address, Templar rank, name of his Commandery and a statement of the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
    - c. Such Nomination Form shall be signed by the Commander of such Constituent Commandery and shall be forwarded by him to the Grand Commander of his jurisdiction for consideration.
    - d. Such Grand Commander shall consider all nominations made by Constituent Commanderies of his Grand Commandery upon Nomination Forms and shall select only one nominee (more where qualified) in any one year; upon making such selection, the Grand Commander shall affix his written approval to such Nomination Form and shall thereupon send the name to the Grand Master.
    - e. Any Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination for this Award shall follow the same procedure as is set forth above for Constituent Commanderies, except that such Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination, shall forward the Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment, and the same shall bear the written approval of the Commander of such Subordinate Commandery before being sent by him to the Grand Master.
- (5) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR medal shall consist of a round, gold-finished medal, the outer circle of which shall bear the words "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR," showing through in black enamel, and in the center shall appear the Patriarchal Cross of the Grand Encampment in purple enamel. Such medal shall be suspended from a gold-finished bar by two small chain links on either side; upon the face of the bar shall be engraved the name of the Sir Knight who shall be the recipient thereof.

The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medal may be worn upon the Commandery uniform by the recipient upon all occasions.

- (6) A suitable Certificate of Award, issued by the Grand Encampment, signed by the Grand Master and the Grand Recorder, and bearing the seal of the Grand Encampment thereon, shall accompany the medal. The Certificate of Award shall contain a summary of the Citation upon which such Award is based.
- (7) It shall be the responsibility of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to provide the medals, the Certificates of Award for the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, without any cost to the recipient or to his Constituent or Grand Commandery, or his Subordinate Commandery. Presentation of the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medals, Certificates shall be made at an appropriate ceremony by Grand Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies, and a report thereof shall be sent by the respective Recorder to the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment within thirty days thereafter.

# **Distinguished Service Award**

To: The Officers and Members of the Constituent Commanderies of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana

In 1977, the Grand Commandery of Indiana established an award known as the "Distinguished Service Award." This award may be presented by the Right Eminent Grand Commander upon the recommendation of the Commander and dais officers of the Constituent Commandery to a Sir Knight who has given outstanding, loyal and devoted service to the Commandery. A lady or non-member may also receive this award as a "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FOR FRIENDS

Each Indiana Commandery may nominate two (2) Sir Knights and/or two (2) "Friends" per year upon the recommendation of its three dais officers. Nominations are made using the enclosed forms, and must be submitted to the Grand Commander no later than February 1, 2008. The cost of the jewel (about \$94.00 for Knights and \$40.00 for Friends) is billed to the Commandery presenting it. The Grand Commandery furnishes a certificate. Full details of the award can be found in Permanent Resolution No. 3, page 30 of the Indiana Grand Laws. Further questions may be address to the Grand Commander or Grand Recorder.

Each Commander is urged to take advantage of this opportunity to recognize outstanding service to Templary on a local basis. We have many Sir Knights who attend meetings, give a helping hand, do the little things in conferring the Orders, or support the activities of the officers year after year. Any Sir Knight is eligible and there are no restrictions other than he must be in good standing.

This General Order shall be read at the first Stated Conclave of each Constituent Commandery following it receipt and be made a part of the minutes.

It is strongly recommended that such presentation be open to the public, visitors and friends and is performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar uniforms.
- 6. The award shall consist of a jewel engraved with the words "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD, Grand Commandery of Indiana" In addition thereto an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

# Remarks of William H. Koon, II Most Eminent Grand Master Grand Encampment Knights Templar USA

Right Eminent Captain General, Right Eminent Department Commander, where is Steve Barton? Would you escort Sir Knight Dwight Lanman, remove his jacket, his hat, and assist me to get a chair out here. I tell you what, anyone who gets his head shaved for money for the Eye Foundation deserves my approbation, let's give him a hand. He then proceeded to shave Dwight's head with numerous remarks. [Dwight remarked afterward, "They didn't shave my head, they butchered it."] After completing the task he then returned to the East and continued with his remarks as follows:

Dwight I am proud of you give him a round of applause. I have watched this Grand Commandery operate and your Grand Commandery is fortunate to have a fine corps of officers to work with. In Ohio, is the Grand Commander in here? He left? He left and I am going to talk about him? He's got a fine corps of officer to work with him. We have a fine corps of officer to work with throughout this Grand Encampment.

Duane Vaught, it was my privilege to appoint when Dick Baldwin resigned for health reasons and you heard me tell you Dick died last February. Sid Doris is in charge of the magazine David Goodwin is in charge of the Eye Foundation. Everything that Dick Baldwin inherited from Ken Fisher because of Ken's efforts to get the office moved to Houston was in varying shades of disarray for whatever reasons. Our Grand Encampment Decisions carry a date of 1988. Our Constitution carries a date of 87. So isn't it great that this is 2009 and no updates have been done in the last twenty years. The data processing was state of the art in 1985 the Knights Templar magazine was straight out of the 50s. This corps of officers started by my good friend Dick Baldwin is tried to move us forward within the confines of the 64<sup>th</sup> triennial. Duane Vaught, stand up Duane when I am talking about you, has taken on the job of updating the constitution. Now before we had a Constitution and we stuck addendums in the front of the book, and if you wanted to know what going on you, don't sit down yet, you had to pull the addendums out to see what it said; problem with the addendums is they weren't correct. Couple that with the fact that all the legislation which had been adopted since 1987 was current. They did have it all, Duane had to go back and read every proceeding to make sure he didn't miss any legislation which had been adopted. Today the Constitution is up to date it is on line and all you have to do is go on line, push the print and it doesn't cost you anything. He is going to finish up with putting the book of decisions with the constitution by Triennial, right Sir Knight Vaught? But as a Grand Commandery of Indiana you have a right to expect of your Grand Encampment your constitution ought to be up to date. How can you expect do the business you have to do, without having the current laws? Why we let that go on as long as we did is beyond me. But by golly we are year to date now and Bruce Basil is right in the middle of and I think Sir Knight Kaminsky is in the middle of the program YRIS. YRIS is an anagram for York Rite Information Service. We started working on coming up with a new data processing program almost since the last triennial, and there was some good people and I'll name them there was Kevin Samples Grand Recorder of Missouri, Andy Lovett, many of you may remember him through the St. Thomas Alcon ads the Grand Recorder of Georgia, and they came to the office and said if you're going to do the data processing system, why don't you do it for the entire York Rite? And that's what we did. By the end of this year we are going to have available the opportunity for every Grand Chapter and every Grand Council to us the same data processing system we are going to be using right now. Why did we do that? Because, right now there are 26 Grand Recorders of Grand Commanderies who are also Grand Secretaries of Grand Chapters and Grand Recorders of Grand Councils. How many of you are Recorders in your Commanderies? How many are also Secretaries and Recorder of you local York Rite Bodies? Quite a few, that's because the hardest job to fill in any York Rite Body is the Recorder, or Secretary of

that body. If we have a data processing system that's easy it won't be so hard to get Recorders. When you have all three filled by the same person we want to make the job easy. We should be full operational by this summer, by triennial the Recorders should be on it. By our next Department conferences Andy Lovett is going to travel and encourage Grand Chapters and Grand Councils to come in. There's going to be a buy in for Grand Chapters and Grand Councils, your dues are paying for your portion so that one of the things we are doing for you in Grand Encampment. Magazine changes are going to continue, if you just stay static you are going nowhere, that's what happened to us before.

Roanoke is coming up soon. It is one most beautiful parts of the country. Bruce Basil is here, stand up Bruce let them see you, he is taking care of your room reservations and is should be an outstanding time for all who attend. I noticed that you adopted the Summer Uniform, I'll give you all some warning, if your coming of the triennial bring your uniform. We are not going to encourage different uniforms. I am not going to say I am not going to let you in but on the other hand, this is an official meeting and you all need to look good and I think you all want to.

I heard Duane talk to you about your money, I would have thought someone might have stood up and said why don't we make our per capita an even \$20.00. I have watched for a lot of years and have been involved in a lot of financial things. When Ohio went after the five dollar assessment I wanted to do it for three. We were sitting in one of those cabins by a lake and the committee was meeting. We didn't have an excel format, that was back in 1996, there was no program that could do that we had to do it by hand. We presented it the finance committee and it was just about agreed it was going to be \$3.00 per year for 10 years. Paul Jonathon, I don't know how many of you remember Paul because he was the Department Commander at the time, my father was in the suite because he had the suite of rooms and was in the suite watching TV, he wasn't on the finance committee and Paul said Bill, my dad was a little hard hearing they had to say it three times, he said what do you think about this. My dad looked at him as said well I think you are making a mistake, you should go for \$5.00 for 10 years. He said I know my boy, he wants to cut is close, he wants to cut it close and not ask for more, just ask for what you think you can get by with. That whole committee turned on a dime. We went to \$5.00 per year for 10 years. It was the smartest thing we ever did. I am so glad Paul asked my dad what he thought. When you ask for just what you need you are never going to have anything for the future. I travel for you all over the country and it is not a-typical to come in and listen to people talking about money issues. But .50 cents, we wasted more than .50 cent on shave cream on Dwight Lanman. I think you need to take a look at your financial situation. Maybe it's time to try something a little different. I am not going to tell you what to do. You people are bright people, you can make it happen.

When we passed the Grand Encampment \$5.70 increase, I'll be candid with you the mandate was to go 15 to 20 years into the future before you ask for another per capita increase. And it took a little extra to make that happen. Are we on track? You bet we are on track because we have cut expenses and have managed your money better. We haven't lost as many members as we thought we would. Will we go 20 years into the future? We better. I am 60 years old I plan on being here until I am 85. I know some of you will be to and I am going to hear about it when I am standing here with my cane and Duane Vaught is Grand Master.

Which brings us to Duane Vaught, we need to make this happen. I've got the ball rolling. I've got him in front of the membership. This Department must get behind this and make it happen; we in this Department made the Grand Encampment stand in awe. We had the audacity to suggest the Grand Encampment ought to be more receptive to the membership. Grand Encampment is what we make it, if we elect people who don't care about the voting delegates of Grand Encampment you are going to get just that. There was a past Grand Commander who said if you start a ding-a-ling in the bottom of the line you are going to have a ding-a-ling Grand Commander, and he's right. Leaders are made not born, but there are people who no matter how much you work with them, they are stuck on something, we've met them all. We have to take charge of our own affairs in our Grand Commandery, especially in Grand Encampment,

Right now at this moment in time we have as fine a corps of officers as we've had in a long time because they go back to making me look good but these guys make me look good. It's going to be critical that we keep Duane there. It's going to be more critical who we get at the bottom of the line in 2012, because that's our future.

We are receptive right now to your needs, we are attentive to your needs and we are cleaning up the messes we have inherited and we expect the Grand Commanders, once we get our house in order, somebody said well, what's our next step? Well I said for the Grand Commanderies to get their house in order. Wisconsin are you guys as good as you could be? Well how are you going to get there and what can we do to help? Because right now people are coming to our classes, right now young people are coming to us. Young people are seeking Templary. Two weeks ago I was in Washington D.C. with a group of Croatians who were knighted in a DC Commandery; those guys are thrilled to be Knights Templar. A month and a half ago I was in Portugal those people are proud to be American Knights Templars. We're proud to be Templars as well we know that there are people out there ought to be a part of us. Sure we got to be able to pay for it. That is why you got to put these money problems behind you. I wish someone had stood up when Duane was talking and said I think it ought to be \$10.00, maybe next year.

We have a wonderful opportunity to make things happen you have some outstanding leaders. I have been coming to Indiana for a long time, I haven't been here recently, but some of the Past Grand Commanders you guys have got working, are not here to be obstructionist. I can remember Steve Barton when he and I were young, we were wishing the Past Grand Commanders would leave us alone; we were pretty smart; we knew what we were doing. But a lot of those guys weren't there to help you they resented your youth. But that's not true today. The Past Grand Commanders I have worked with in Indiana, Ohio or the East Central Department are glad to have young people who are interested. They are glad to have young people who are going to lead this fraternity and they are here to help. We need to capitalize on our assets and move forward.

I hope you come to Roanoke and please help us get Duane elected.

# ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874. Knightstown No. 9 surrendered their charter on March 31, 2008 and merged with Greenfield No. 39.

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868, and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929, revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Muncie No.18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000. Charter was restored on October 24, 2006.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990.

Gary No. 57 - Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary No. 57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995.

East Chicago No. 58 – Chartered May 9, 1912. Charter surrendered December 31, 2000 and merged with Hammond No. 41 at the same location.

Greensburg No. 59 – Chartered May 12, 1920. Charter surrendered December 1, 2001 and merged with Columbus No. 14.

Peru No. 60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash No. 37.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941,

Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62; At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but the only record of a name change is noted in the Conclave Bulletin No. 1. No other record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity No. 62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge No. 717.

Wright Commandery No. 64 Chartered April 29, 1988. Dispensation granted on April 29, 2005, to move their Charter to Eckerty Lodge No. 719, Eckerty, Indiana 47116 on a permanent basis. (May 1, 2006).

Lawrence Commandery No. 67 Chartered April 29, 1994. Charter moved to Millersville Lodge September 21, 2002. Name changed to H. E. Lackey Commandery No. 67 on April 23, 2003.

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. - Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, to open Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued February 12, 2001 to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 23, 2003.
