Warrant from W. B. Hubbard, General Grand Master of the General Grand Encampment, of the United States, to form a State Grand Encampment for the State of Indiana was dated at Columbus, Ohio, on April 24, 1854.

The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

Sir Knight William Howard Koon, II Most Eminent Grand Master Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, USA

S.K. Koon was born in Lima, Ohio on March 12, 1949 to William H. and Vivian Brown Koon. He is a graduate of Bath High School, and attended the Ohio State University. He is a member of the Columbus Grove United Church of Christ. Bill is married to Elizabeth Jane Thornley, and they reside less than a mile from the family farm where he grew up near Columbus Grove, Ohio. They have a daughter, Andrea Koon Gillespie; son-in-law, Adam Gillespie; two grandsons, Adam Kade Gillespie, Silas Robert Gillespie; and son, William Steven Winebrenner. Bill is the President of Lord's Enterprises Inc. and Republic Mills Inc., both family agri-businesses including, livestock feed manufacturing, grain elevators, and a farming operation. He is involved in many professional and civic organizations, both locally, and statewide.

Masonically, Bill is a Senior DeMolay of Fidelity Chapter in Lima, and holds the Chevalier, Cross of Honor, Active Legion of Honor, is an Active Member of the International Supreme Council Order of DeMolay, and in 2006 was invested with the DeMolay Grand Cross. He was raised a Master Mason in 1970 in Ada Lodge No. 344, and demitted to Rufus Putnam Lodge No. 364 in Columbus Grove, where he served 3 years as Worshipful Master. In 2001 he became a dual member of Ft. Amanda Lodge No. 706 in Lima. He is a Past High Priest of Lima Chapter No. 49 RAM, and Past Illustrious Master of Lima Council No. 20 R&SM. In 2008 Bill was appointed the Grand Representative of the Grand Council of Romania R&SM near the Grand Council of Ohio. He was knighted in Shawnee Commandery No. 14 by his father on March 13, 1971, and was elected Eminent Commander in 1980. He is a member of Shawnee Commandery No. 14 Drill Team, marching in 7 Triennial Drills beginning in Chicago in 1973, including twice as Captain. He is a member, and Charter Commander of St. George Commandery No. 76, Ivanhoe Commandery No. 54, Van Wert, OH, St. Bernard Commandery No. 41, Denver, CO, Frankfort Commandery No. 4, Frankfort, KY, and Blaney Commandery No. 5, Tremont, IL. In addition to Ohio, Bill is a member and voting delegate of the Grand Commanderies of Ohio, Colorado, Illinois, and Kentucky. In 2006, Bill was elected an Honorary Member of the Wyoming Black Horse Troop.

Sir Knight Koon first served the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio, as an Aidede-Camp to S.K. William J. Faul, KCT, during his term as Grand Commander and received the Meritorious Service Award for his efforts in 1981. Bill served the First Division of the Grand Commandery of Ohio as Deputy Division Commander from 1985 - 1987, and was appointed Grand Sentinel by Sir Knight Frank W. Crane, KCT, REGC in 1987. He was elected Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio on September 13, 1996. In 2007 he was declared a Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Virginia. In June 2009 he was elected an Honorary Past Commander of King Ferdinand Commandery No. 1 in Bucharest, Romania, and at the LXIV Triennial he was elected an Honorary Past

Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Romania, which was the first official action taken after the formation of that Grand Commandery.

Bill served the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the USA, as a member of the Easter Sunrise Breakfast Committee, and an ad-hoc member of the Committee on Drill Regulations from 1991 - 1994, and was Co-Chairman of the Committee on Drill Regulations during the 1994 - 1997 Triennium. He served 8 years as the personal Aide to S.K. Ned E. Dull, GCT, MEPGM of the Grand Encampment, and as the Affinity Coordinator for the Knights Templar Eye Foundation MasterCard program from 1991 to 1999. Bill was invested with the rank and dignity of Knight Commander of the Temple by the Grand Encampment in 1992, and is currently the Deputy for the Ohio KCT Program. He was appointed Department Commander of the East Central Department for the 1997 - 2000 Triennium. Bill was elected Right Eminent Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment on August 15, 2000 in Nashville, Tennessee. Upon Installation into that Office, he was invested with the Knight Grand Cross of the Temple. On August 16, 2006, he was installed as Right Eminent Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Encampment. In 2007, he was appointed Grand Representative of the Great Priory of the United Masonic, Religious and Military Orders of The Temple and Sepulcher and of The Hospital of Saint-John of Jerusalem and of Palestine, Rhodes and Malta for France near the Grand Encampment, and in 2009 was advanced to the Honor and Dignity of the Knight Grand Cross (pro causa). Upon the resignation of S.K. Richard B. Baldwin, GCT, MEGM on August 28, 2007 for reasons of health, he was installed as Most Eminent Grand Master by S.K. Thurman Cleveland Pace, KGC, MEHPGM. On August 18, 2009, he was elected by acclamation as Most Eminent Grand Master for the LXV Triennium, and was installed the next day, again by Sir Knight Thurman Cleveland Pace, KGC, MEHPGM. Five Days later he was made an Honorary Member and Honorary Past Supreme Grand Master of the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada.

Illustrious Brother Koon is a member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Valley of Toledo and a dual member of the Valley of Dayton, receiving the Thirty-Third Degree from the Supreme Council Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, NMJ, in Grand Rapids on September 23, 1997. In June, 2004 he was elected to the Board of Trustees of the Valley of Toledo, and in 2008 was elected Chairman. In 2007 he was made an Honorary Knight Commander Court of Honor (KCCH) of the Valley of New Orleans, Louisiana.

He is a member of appendant organizations including, Royal Order of Scotland; Zenobia Temple AAONMS of Toledo, OH, their Crusader Unit, and the Lima Shrine Club; Charter Sovereign and current Recorder of Charlemagne Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine in Lima, OH, Dual Member of Holy Grail Conclave, in Dayton, OH, Honorary Member of St. Leonard Conclave, in Jackson MS, St. Hilary Conclave, Ft. Wayne, IN, Lafayette Conclave, Athens, OH, St. Columba Conclave, Cincinnati, OH, and served the United Grand Imperial Council of the Red Cross of Constantine as Grand Herald 1999 - 2000, Intendant General at Large 2002 - 2003, and was invested with the Knight Commander of Constantine by the Imperial Council RCC of France in 2007; Past Preceptor of Prince of Peace Tabernacle X, HRAKTP, Past Grand Preceptor of the Grand College of America, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, and awarded the GC (Grand Cross) of the Order, One of Five Honorary Members of the Grand College of Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, York, England, and recipient of their Certificate of Merit. In 2009 he was Knighted in Rose of Sharon Priory No. 2, Knights of the York Cross of Honor and advanced to the rank and dignity of Knight Grand Cross of the York

Cross of Honor with one Quadrant. He is an honorary member of Lily of the Valley Priory No. 1.

Duane L. Vaught was born February 17, 1956 in Crawfordsville, Indiana. He graduated from North Montgomery High School and from Indiana University, the latter with a Bachelors of Science degree in Accounting. He was baptized and confirmed as a member of the Methodist Church. In December 2000 he married Georgia Jean Nagai Goode.

Duane Vaught began his professional career with a national accounting firm, during which time he was licensed as a Certified Public Accountant. Since 1995 he has been with Stampfli Associates, CPAs, P.C. in Bloomington IN. Since October 2008 he has been president of that firm. Professionally, not-for-profit entities are his primary specialty. He is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, Indiana State CPA Society and the Bloomington Chapter of the Institute of Management Accountants.

His Masonic history began on April 30, 1971 when he was initiated into Montgomery Chapter of the Order of DeMolay. In DeMolay he served as Master Councilor of his Chapter, Illustrious Knight Commander of DeMolay Order of Knighthood in Indiana and two years as an appointed officer of the DeMolay State Council. He has received the DeMolay honors of Representative DeMolay, Chevalier, and Legion of Honor (Active)

Vaught was initiated, passed and raised a Master Mason in Montgomery Lodge, no. 50, in Crawfordsville IN. He served as Worshipful Master of Spencer Lodge no. 95 in 1993 receiving the Grand Master's Award with Distinction. He also served as Worshipful Master of Dwight L. Smith Lodge of Research. He served on several Grand Lodge committees and was appointed as the Grand Representative of Oregon. He was elected the 157th Most Worshipful Grand Master of Indiana for 2007 – 2008. In May 2008 he was elected a Trustee of the Grand Lodge and in 2009 became president of the board of Trustees.

Vaught received the degrees of Royal Arch Masonry, Cryptic Masonry and the Orders of Chivalric Masonry in 1977. He Served as High Priest of Crawfordsville Chapter No. 40 and Illustrious Master of Montgomery Council No. 34 in 1983. In 1995 he was appointed as Grand Representative of the Grand Chapter of Oregon and in 2007 the Grand Representative of the Grand Council of Arkansas.

Sir Knight Vaught served as Eminent Commander of Crawfordsville Commandery No. 25 in 1981 and 1982 and has received the Distinguished Service and Knight Commander of the Temple awards. He is Grand Representative of the Grand Commandery of Illinois near Indiana and also holds memberships in Bloomington Commandery No. 63 and St Anselm Commandery UD. He served ten years as an officer of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana culminating in serving as the 140th Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana in 2001 - 2002. Sir Knight Vaught was later appointed to the finance committee of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA.

Vaught is a Past Governor of Banks of the Wabash York Rite College No. 72 and has received the Gold Honor Award and Order of the Purple Cross. He is a Past Excellent Chief of Indiana Council No. 15, Knight Masons and Past Director General of Indianapolis Preceptory, Yeomen of York. In the Allied Masonic Degrees he is a Past Sovereign Master of St. Bernard de Clairvaux Council 256. He is a Knight Commander of the Red Branch of Eri and has served as Secretary of his council for the last ten years. He is currently chairmen of the Grand Council AMD finance committee.

Duane Vaught is currently serving as Puissant Sovereign of St Basil Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine and as an officer of St Andrew Tabernacle XXXV Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests He is a member, IX degree, Knight Grand Cross, of Indiana College, Masonic Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis, MSCRIF, and serves as Treasurer General of the High Council, MSCRIF of the United States.

He is a member of J. Herbert Nichols and Robert A. Woods Priories of KYCH, Terre Haute Valley, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Royal Order of Scotland, Murat Shrine AAONMS, Sahara Grotto MOVPER, Knights of Pythias, Grand College of Rites, Order of Knights Preceptor, and Indiana Past Commanders Association. In 2005 he was crowned a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33°, NMJ. He is a Grand Cross of the Royal Society of Knights Occidental and an Honorary Kentucky Colonel.

In August 2007 he was appointed and installed to the office of Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment KT when that office became vacant upon the regretted resignation, due to health, of Grand Master Richard B. Baldwin and the advancement of the other members of the Grand Encampment line.

Robert Keith Cronk was born June 20, 1940 in Earlham, Iowa the eldest son of Robert and Mabel Cronk. 

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) I recommend that the Grand Commandery hold two Templar Academies or leadership development classes, one in the North and one in the South.
- 2) I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue to support the Job's Daughters, the Rainbow Girls and the DeMolay.
- 3) I recommend that the Grand Commander appoint a special committee which would include himself and selected members of the Jurisprudence Committee to provide performance reviews of all elected and appointed officers.
- 4) I recommend that the Elected Grand Officers meet with their counterparts of the York Rite and plan a state-wide York Rite Class honoring the Grand Master.
- 5) I recommend that the Triennial Committee be expanded to help prepare for the installation of Duane L. Vaught as Most Eminent Grand Master in 2015 and to see that preparations are in place for the Triennial of 2018, which Indiana will host.
- 6) I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue to push for the formation of drill teams either at individual Commanderies or on a Battalion Basis.
- 7) I recommend that the Grand Commandery of Indiana maintain a closer relationship with the Grand Chapter of the Order of Eastern Star to benefit the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. The Eye Foundation committee and Campaign Chairman should be ready to make presentations to raise funds within the Districts of the Order of the Easter Star on behalf of the Eye Foundation. Appearing in uniform would be an asset and a recruiting tool.
- 8) I recommend that the Grand Line Officers meet with the Grand Commander and Grand Recorder in an effort to educate the officers as to their upcoming roles in the Grand Commandery.

As was reported last year, the Eye Foundation has moved to making grants to researchers rather that direct grant to patients. In this way more people may potentially benefit from the Foundation and given governmental participation in medical assistance and rules concerning patient confidentiality, the Foundation may be most effective under present conditions.

The 44th Annual Voluntary Campaign will end next month. For the 43rd Voluntary Campaign, Indiana donated a total of \$33,699.16 which ranked us 10th in total donations, and 17th per capita with an individual per capita amount of \$8.37.

At the Reception for the Grand Commander held last fall at New Albany, our own Sir Knight Duane L. Vaught, Right Eminent Grand Generalissimo, presented a grant in the amount of \$35,000 to Timothy W. Corson of the Indiana University School of Medicine.

To date \$6141.37 has been sent to me and passed on to the Eye Foundation under the Voluntary Program. As always, we are most grateful to the Indiana Grand Chapter Order of Eastern Star for a most generous donation. To those Sir Knights who are members of the Eastern Star we thank you very much and ask that you extend these thanks to the other members.

We also received voluntary donations from several organizations including local Chapters of the Order of Eastern Star and Bethels of Jobs Daughters

Also, as usual, we thank Angola Commandery for their \$10 + per member yearly voluntary donation.

SIR KNIGHT KARL EDWIN APPLEGATE

Past Grand Commander, Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana 1969 - 1970 Past Department Commander of the East Central Department, GRAND ENCAMPMENT KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Date of Birth: July 21, 1923; Date of Death: July 9, 2011;

Sir Knight Applegate was a committed leader and public servant to the State of Indiana and to his country.

Upon recovering from wounds he sustained in France during World War II, Applegate earned an undergraduate degree in business management at Indiana University in 1946 and a law degree from the Maurer School of Law in 1948. He opened his first law firm in Bloomington in 1949 and retired from Applegate, McDonald and Associates in 2011.

Sir Knight Applegate had a distinguished record of public service, serving from 1951-1958 as U.S. Commissioner, Southern District of Indiana; from 1958-1965 as Deputy Prosecutor for Monroe County and Municipal Judge for Bloomington; and in 1965 as a representative in the Indiana General Assembly, where he was primary author of the bill that established Ivy Tech Bloomington's first Community College.

In 1967, President Lyndon B. Johnson nominated him as U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana, a position he held until 1970.

Sir Knight Applegate was an active civic leader, including serving as President of the IU Varsity Club and on numerous boards of directors in Bloomington and Monroe County. He was also active in Knights Templar and Freemasons. He was active in the Monroe Lodge # 22 for over three decades, also serving in 1973 as the Sovereign Grand Inspector General, Honorary 33rd Degree, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction, and in 1976 as the Department Commander for the East Central Department of the Grand Encampment of the Knights Templar of the United States and served the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana as Right Eminent Grand Commandery from 1969-1970. He received many awards throughout his decades of service, including being selected by Governor Evan Bayh in 1992 for the Outstanding Government and Civic Service Award and, in 1999, for the Indiana Bar Foundation's Distinguished Service Award for fifty years of service. In 2011 Applegate was inducted into the Academy of Law Alumni Fellows from the Maurer School of Law at Indiana University. Induction into the Academy represents the highest honor the School bestows on alumni. Fellows have distinguished themselves in their chosen career fields and have continued to enhance the national reputation of the Indiana University Maurer School of Law through their personal achievements and dedication to the highest standards of their profession.

In 1944, Applegate married his grade-school sweetheart and love of his life, Betty Applegate (Dilts) of Winamac Indiana, a union that celebrated its sixty-seventh year in 2011 and resulted in four children, Eric, Ray, Bob and Beth Applegate.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by his sister Virginia Baumgartner, son Raymond Applegate (Rachel) of TX; son Bob Applegate (Vicki) of WI and daughter Beth Applegate (Trish Kerle); of Bloomington, IN. He also is survived by six grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

Ed was preceded in death by his mother Gladys Applegate; father Karl Applegate; and son Eric Applegate.

Visitation will take place at Allen Funeral Home (4155 S. Old State Road 37, Bloomington, IN 47401) from 4 PM to 7 PM on Thursday, July 14, 2011 with a Commandery Honor Guard.

Memorial Services were held at the First Methodist Church on the corner of 4th Street and Washington Street, Bloomington, IN on Friday, July 15 at 11:00am.

His body will be cremated and his remains will be placed in the First Methodist Church, Columbarium where his eldest son Eric also rests in peace.

SIR KNIGHT WILLARD MEREDITH AVERY

Past Grand Commander, Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana 1956 - 1957 MOST EMINENT PAST GRAND MASTER OF THE GRAND ENCAMPMENT KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA 1976 – 79

The ninety-fifth Grand Commander of Knights Templar in Indiana was Willard M. Avery, who was born on February 2, 1907 at Palmyra, Indiana and died at Greenfield, Indiana on February 11, 2012

Sir Knight Avery was raised a Master Mason in April of 1936 in New Castle Lodge No. 91. Later in the year he transferred his membership to Golden Rule Lodge No. 16 in Knightstown where he served as Worshipful Master. In 1963, the Grand Lodge of Indiana awarded the Caleb B. Smith Medal of Honor to Sir Knight Avery.

He holds membership in all the Knightstown York Rite Bodies and has served in the East in all three bodies. Sir Knight Avery is a Knight of the York Cross of Honor. He was awarded the Order of the Purple Cross by the York Rite Sovereign College.

In 1947, Sir Knight Avery was elected Grand Captain of the Guard and progressed to be elected Grand Commander in 1956. During his tenure as Grand Commander, an invitation was issued to hold the 47th Triennial Conclave of the Grand Encampment in Indianapolis. Sir Knight Avery acted as legal advisor to the Triennial Conclave Corporation and served as Vice President of the local Triennial Committee.

Sir Knight Avery was elected Grand Captain of the Guard of the Grand Encampment in Detroit in 1967; Grand Generalissimo in Denver, 1970; Deputy Grand Master in Chicago, 1973; and was elected the forty-ninth Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar in Kansas City in 1976.

He served as Department Commander of the East Central Department of the Grand Encampment and was Editor of the *Knight Templar Magazine* for five and one-half years until 1967. Sir Knight Avery was awarded the Grand Commander of the Temple in the Grand Encampment College of Honors.

A member of the Valley of Indianapolis, Sir Knight Avery was crowned an Honorary 33rd Scottish Rite Mason in September, 1967.

Sir Knight Avery is Past Grand patron of the Indiana Grand Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star. Other Masonic memberships include the Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, and the Red Cross of Constantine. He was the first President of the Board of Directors of the Indiana Foundation of DeMolay, Inc., and a model for other DeMolay foundations throughout the United States. Sir Knight Avery holds the DeMolay Honorary Legion of Honor. (1956 Indiana Grand Commandery Proceedings VII, 1979 Indiana Grand Commandery Proceedings 6-7, and Knight Templar Magazine, October 1976)

A Knights Templar Memorial Service was conducted at the Knightstown United Methodist Church on Wednesday February 15th with Sir Knight William H. Koon, II, GCT, Most Eminent Grand Master, Grand Encampment, United States of America presiding at 8:00 PM, Sir Knights

As we have lost the leadership of two of our Past Grand Commanders and the guidance, and Brotherly Love of these many Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery and may the mercy of God be with us all and give us strength in our hour of Loss.

Dispensations Granted

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Indiana:

The Jurisprudence Committee finds that the majority of Dispensations granted were in proper order.

However, the following dispensations need to be amended:

The April 29, 2011 Dispensation to replace the Commander of New Albany Commandery No. 5 was written in violation of Section 72, and should have stated that the Generalissimo move up to Generalissimo and permission granted to elect a new Captain General.

The October 7, 2011 dispensation authorizing Levant Preceptory to confer an Order of the Temple in Detroit, Michigan should have been issued to Raper Commandery No. 1, under which Levant Preceptory resides.

The January 2, 2012 dispensation to Frankfort Commandery No. 29 should have provided the Captain General to move up to Generalissimo and a new Captain General elected.

With that said, I move to ratify the actions taken at the above Commanderies.

If our finances remain as they are at the present time we will be in position to start returning funds to the permanent fund in the two years.

As we proposed in 2010, a \$.50 cent increase in per-capita each year for the next five years was to offset the drop in membership. This increase was to be voted on each year.

The finance committee recommends that this .50 cent increase continue.

GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS MARCH 31, 2012

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments the organization carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses on investment are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statement of activities.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) Restricted and Unrestricted Revenue Contributions received are recorded as increases in unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.
- (h) The Organization has evaluated subsequent events through July 11, 2012, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS

The organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be tax exempt under Section 501(c)(10) of the Internal Revenue Code and not determined to be a private foundation.

WEBSITE COMMITTEE REPORT

Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers of the Grand Commandery, Past Grand Commanders, Officers and Sir Knights:

Indiana Grand Commandery Website:

The new and improved Indiana Grand Commandery website was launched on August 15, 2011. Over the past 5 months, we have received many positive comments from around the State of Indiana.

The website that you currently see represents a time investment of about 150 man hours of work, or approximately a month of full time work.

The site has currently received over 1,500 hits since its launch.

On November 22, 2011, the website was moved to another server, and domain names were switched to www.indianaknightstemplar.com and .org. The reason for this change was that we

were not receiving the proper support from our server liaison, and incremental upgrades to the website were being held back.

In addition, the Grand Commandery will realize about a \$150 per year decrease in hosting costs that we were paying to our other source.

Upon the subsequent change of servers, new email re-directs were established for all GC Officers, so that they could be contacted via the website, without publishing their private email addresses. This will be a tremendous asset going forward.

Going into the future, a few areas that I would like the website to address:

- 1. With the permission of the REGC, Grand Commandery Officers should complete their biography and submit a picture to be published on the website. This will allow the SK's of Indiana to come to know their Grand Commandery Officers even better.
- 2. Many requests have been made to have access to the Password Protected downloads section. Additional consideration needs to be given to what information can become public knowledge and be dispersed to all SK's of the State of Indiana.
- 3. The website committee would like to propose a new Program for the REGC. Taking our model from the GL of the State of Texas, they have a program that exists that will allow for any newly made Eagle Scout rank to fill out a form and receive a Certification of Congratulations from the REGC. This certainly would leave a lasting impression in a young man's mind, and further show the path towards Masonic Light. This will be a form on the website that can either be filled out digitally, or downloaded and mailed in. We would need a Coordinator and a small budget to pay for Certificates, Printing and Postage.
- 4. Continued use and proper updating of the online calendar. Many of the SK's from around the state have commented on how useful the calendar is. Bringing the current information on all the Commandery activities has been very helpful.
- 5. Publish the Red Book digitally on the website. This is a great tool for use in contacting appropriate members of our Order.
- 6. Access to SKYPE through the website.

As always, any and all suggestions for improvement are welcomed.

INACTIVE PARTICIPATION

The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers of the Grand Commandery, Past Grand Commanders, Officers and Sir Knights All,

Inactive Participation:

This is a VERY difficult subject as to how to get activity back in the Asylum. We are of the mind that we need do more things than just sending cards and using calling lists. They are good and have their place.

However what we need to do is find the reasons as to why they are not coming back. It may be as simple as assigning a mentor to the new Sir Knight to offer rides to the meetings, Orders, and answer any question that he may have. For the younger members it may also be family and work pressures, which we fully understand. They maybe active in their Blue Lodge and do not want to take on the extra work for the York Rite. But we need to maintain contact with the new members. Along with the cards and calling list, the Commanderies may want to think about setting up a web page or a "Facebook" account so that activities of the Commandery can be posted online.

Many of our members are getting older and are not able to attend because they cannot drive at night or their memory is not what it once was. Form a car pool to pick up these older Sir Knights so that they can attend and have input in the running of the Commandery or offer advice on the practice nights if they choose to attend. By all means if family outings are planned be sure to invite the older Sir Knights and their wives.

We need to find more activities than just meetings and the Orders. Perhaps we could encourage the Commanderies to plan and have family picnics, or going to a ball games etc. during the summer months. During the winter months maybe go ice skating, sledding, host a Holiday Party or bowling for the Family. As the different families meet and come together during these activities, the Commandery will become an extended family. We would like to propose that if a Commandery has four family outings during the year they receive an additional 50 points per event on their "Activities Sheet" at inspection time.

We would encourage the Commanderies to do as much of their own work as they can possibly do and less of the one day events. While the one day classes have their place, we feel that it deprives the candidate of the experience of going through the Degrees and Orders by himself. With the Commanderies doing their own work this will build team work and hopefully lead to more participation in the Asylum.

What we propose is, to those members that show up to the practice sessions, give them parts to learn and then hold practices sessions to help and offer mentoring by the more experienced members, with the understanding that they will not have to do the part until they are comfortable with it.

We propose that if a Commandery can do all of the Orders in full form, with **NO** outside help, that they receive an Award from the Grand Commandery in recognition for being able to do the work.

As a way to encourage learning the ritual, we would like to recommend that the Grand Commandery create a "Ritual Award" comparable to "Ritualistic Award" in Blue Lodge.

Ritual Award for Sir Knights

What we are proposing is that a Ritual Award be created for work done in the Commandery for the three Orders conferred. The award is to be a lapel pin, to be worn on a suit or sports coat, along with a certificate to be printed with the level of proficiency. **All work is to be done from memory and in full form**. All work done is to be attested by the Recorder in the minutes as to what part was done and by whom.

Cost

Our plan for now is to design the pins and then get a quote on their cost. As in the "Blue Lodge" program, there would be an application fee and this would be based on the cost of the pins. As in the "Blue Lodge" program, as the Sir Knight advances in the awards he would return the pin for the earlier awards or be charged for the newer pin.

Administration

We are proposing that the Battalion Commanders would administer the program within their Battalions and then forward the names and level of award to be given out at the Grand Conclave and/or appoint a state wide chairman and then the awards could be given out in a timelier manner.

Adoption of the Program

We are proposing to bring this up at the Grand Conclave in April 2012. Let it lay over until the 2013 Conclave. The Battalion Commanders could then see if there would be interest in the program.

Point System

The total points for each Order are based on the number of words for that part. Then that number is divided by 10 and then rounded up or down to the next 5.

The point system will be similar to that used in "Blue Lodge". There will be three levels of proficiency:

We also want to recognize the work done in the past and suggest that the awards be given out on the word of the Sir Knight as to what work he has done.

In closing we would like to point out that the problem of inactive participation has been an ongoing problem for many years and that we should not expect to see a quick turnaround. This will take years of hard and innovative work. Many of the above proposals are not new and have been suggested and met with limited success in the past. It is up to the individual Commanderies to use all or some of these ideas, or come up their own ideas as to how to get more activity in the Asylum. Ultimately, it is up to the local Commandery.



As of December 31, 2011, a total of 396 life memberships have been issued since the start of the plan. With 191 members deceased, suspended or demitted, the plan currently has 205 active members. Four new Life Members joined in 2011. The total cash received into the plan as of December 31, 2011 was \$97,691. The Grand Trustees are holding the assets in long-term certificates of deposit and money market accounts. On December 31, 2011, there was \$61,015.09 in assets, in various forms of savings Certificates of Deposit and saving accounts.

REMARKS BY SIR KNIGHT ROBERT CRONK RIGHT EMINENT DEPARTMENT COMMANDER OF THE EAST CENTRAL DEPARTMENT GRAND ENCAMPMENT KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF THE USA

Sir Knights, please be seated.

Right Eminent Grand Commander, Right Eminent Grand Generalissimo, Most Worshipful Grand Master, Sir Knights all, It is indeed a pleasure for me to be in Indiana once again. I been coming over here off and on for several years, I knew a lot of you Sir Knight when I first came over. Since then I have met many more.

I would like to thank all the Sir Knight I have met in the last three years for all the courtesies they have shown to me and to express my sorrow in going out of office, but I will still come back to Indiana. I think you have inherited me for years to come.

The Grand Commander then thanked him and remarked that we always enjoy see you here in the great State of Indiana.

REMARKS BY SIR KNIGHT DUANE L. VAUGHT RIGHT EMINENT GRAND GENERALISSIMO GRAND ENCAMPMENT KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF THE USA

Sir Knights be seated please, be comfortable.

I to have been here before and those of you Past Grand Commanders and some of you who have presided over a body know it's a lot of work to be up here.

I enjoy coming to these things. So much of Freemasonry is about the opportunity of getting together with good people and just spending quality time with each other.

I would like to speak a moment about the Knight Templar Eye Foundation. We are having a tremendous amount of success with shift in direction. Evolution is necessary, programs become out dated, and we need to move on, so that we can be relevant and effective and have real impact on the subject matter that is the root of what we want to do. Helping individuals was very satisfying but the mission was never to help a discreet number of individuals but its mission was to elevate problems with eye sight on as broad of a scale as we were physically able to achieve. With the changes in society because the world is not the same place as it was in the 50s, when Grand Master Delamier said hospitals is all about the way to go. The new approach is we are more effective for positive good for far more people than we were ever going to be able to get to with individual surgery.

There are many fundraisers for the Eye Foundation, and many of you have seen those too. One of the programs that all of you may have seen is sending out wall calendars and cute little calendars that you can place on your refrigerator and tear off the top month. If you are a past donor or regular donor, you probably got some of these in the mail, but if you haven't been a regular donor, and would like to start. I do have a limited number of calendars the big ones and the small ones here. If you would like one take it, but we would appreciate a little gift for the Eye Foundation. There is so much more we can accomplish.

Last night at the dinner, how many of you were at the dinner? Oh, good show good show. Well you saw something a bit unusual last night. The Cryptic Masons have been supporting a Chair at Indiana University School of Medicine for years now. They have a budget that allows them to do a very intense focus support for very narrow program and try to achieve one very specific thing. They have been funding that to the tune of something like two hundred thousand a year. The Eye Foundation takes a little different approach. We're funding a number of programs to a smaller scale. Our hopes are that some of them will show sufficient promise that they can pickup programs to the National Institute of Health who we hope will say WOW, you got some terrific data we can now, support you to the tune of millions. But of course the catch is you can't go to the National Institute of Health until you have the data and until you can get somebody to give you some funding, you can't put together the initial data. That's the kind of a nitch we've chosen.

Last night you saw that unusual case where our philanthropy and the philanthropy of the Cryptic Masons over-lapped. Where a program that they have been funding for years or a piece it, applied for our program and our scientific advisory committee, which are some very heavy hitters in the profession of ophthalmology, made it into the list of something like the top twenty-five percent of applications for funding. Seventy-five percent of the applications would not make the top. So here we have a program at Indiana University that is getting funded by both our charities. That shouldn't be so unusual. It's a happy coincidence that we don't have different interests than other Masonic bodies. We don't have different interests than Capitular Masonry, or the Scottish Rite or the Eastern Star whatever your particular interest may be in. Surprise! I spend most of my time in Templary. Well Grand Lodge; but whichever organization or organizations you concentrate on. It's not a surprise to you that other people have different tastes, and are more involve that in organization than another, but aren't we all trying to do the same thing? Supposedly we have the same principles supposedly we all want this fraternity to be better. This fraternity is better

when every piece of it is better. No part of this part of this fraternity benefits when another part suffers. Now, very few people who have a problem with that.

I am going to say something that is controversial. Some of you were in the same place I was about two weeks ago a session of a Grand Masonic Body. The body would not do this but a certain number of people did and they were trying to make changes in Law. They wanted future Grand High Priests to be absolute Dictators. They wanted to abolish all rights of members to have a trial in Grand Chapter. The Grand High Priest will decide who gets expelled! He will pick the jury! They wanted to award the Grand High Priest the right of all powers of the Grand Chapter. I'm sorry, your Charter is revoked. I am sorry, I've decided to write a new law that you can't wear a purple coat, you're expelled. I don't like how you voted in the election, you're expelled. I think Grand Chapter needs more money, we're increasing Grand Chapters per-capita to one hundred dollars a person, send the check. All of that would have been legal if that legislation had passed. The legislation was defeated and frankly that's no big surprise.

What I want to tell you is if you believe in Freemasonry and I believe you do or you wouldn't be in this room. You need to support Symbolic Lodge, and Templary, and Cryptic Masonry and you need to support Capitular Masonry. I think Capitular Freemasonry is as fundamental to the York Rite as Symbolic Lodge is to all of Freemasonry. Freemasonry has no meaning without Symbolic Lodge and let be clear York Rite has no meaning without Capitular Masonry. Those degrees are so fundamental to all the series of further light that none of the York Rite makes sense without the Chapter. The Grand Chapter of Indiana is a fine and outstanding organization but understand that just like this Grand Commandery, these people up here are not the Grand Commandery They are the officers of the Grand Commandery. Grand Chapter of Indiana is a fine organization, not all their officers are. You can tell them I said so. Some of them were actually going around over the last thirty days bragging that, that legalization was for the sole purpose of revenge against Commandery and certain individuals. I am one of them, but I'll take my chances.

If you read those reports that you heard; you shouldn't be participating in other Masonic Bodies. You shouldn't meet with other Masonic Bodies. Grand Commandery and Grand Council take the position of that's up to you. Grand Chapter says you shouldn't, but they have not made that a law, let's be clear. They suggest that you shouldn't participate in other bodies. But I keep hearing people tell me that if you are a Grand Chapter officer you are entitled to be a member of some honorary organizations. Sorry guys, I've been fortunate, I've been lucky, but most of you are never going to get invited to join some of the organizations that some of these people claim that they have a right to be a member of.

I am not going to tell you who I have an issue with but want you to know the truth because sometimes you just have to stand up and tell the truth. If you think some of those things I am telling you are right, vote for them. But if you think the fraternity will advance by us working together, then that's how you ought to act and share that with other people because none of us up here should be so big as to think that our little corner of the fraternity is what this is all about.

I've not laid this on you like this before, Right? I don't get up before you and give a speech like this but I am not representing Grand Encampment today, somebody else is doing that so I get to do this. Again this is a very few people.

If you stayed to the end of that Grand Chapter session what you saw was General Grand High Priest Ken Harrison making an impassioned plea for all of us to work together. That's the General Grand High Priest. The Most Illustrious Grand Master of the General Grand Council firmly believes that we are all working together. There is a program going on right now between the General Grand Chapter, General Grand Council and Grand Encampment because we have a common good for the fraternity just as each of you have a common good for your local bodies. Thank you.

REMARKS BY SIR KNIGHT WILLIAM H. KOON, II MOST EMINENT GRAND MASTER GRAND ENCAMPMENT KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF THE USA

Sir Knights, be seated.

In listening to Duane, I remember something that happened a long time ago that attracted me to his style and his manner. He and I are different people. He's an accountant. I am a farmer. I was also a grain trader. Indecision is one of the things that would kill anyone that is in the grain trading business. To not make a decision always cost you money. To be slow to make a decision cost you money. Even a wrong decision wouldn't be as expensive as no decision at all.

When it comes to our fraternity different styles and different kinds of people can lead. What I've always been proud about Duane is he always says what he thinks he's the only accountant I have ever met that has guts. That he will stand here and give it to you the way it really is. Some people find that offensive, Frankly, I'd always rather have a man come straight at me rather than come around my back. That's what I always admired about Steve Barton he always came at me all the time, still comes straight at me.

I will tell you this there has been a new page turned since the last Triennium General Grand Chapter and General Grand Council. The attitude of the Ed Harrison and George Sellers, they are both fine outstanding York Rite leaders and I am proud to call both of them friends. We've seen a new dimension in working together in an opennes on their part that has enabled this to happen. I am pleased with the results.

I'll tell you some of the things we are working on and some of you partook of them at the department conference when you saw a bit on the emerging leaders program. In order to survive in this fraternity we have got to train out leaders so that they will be prepared to take over when we pass the torch, we are all going to pass the torch. I believe that there needs to be a plan, there has always been a plan in the things I have worked with. When it was the Grand Commandery of Ohio, Shanee Commandery number fourteen, or my time in the Grand Encampment, there has always been a plan for future leadership we were looking at people. Larry Kaminsky would you put your pen down and turn off you recorder because there is a story I don't want in the minutes. On behalf of our Most Worshipful Grand Master I bring you warm fraternal greetings from the Grand Lodge of the State of Indiana. By the way Right Eminent Grand Recorder, please turn the microphone back on you can record mine. We are in this controversy and we ain't keeping track of what I said and get to come up next WOW! You talk about some tough acts to follow. The controversy that is there I understand that and we'll leave that one there. I think I'll walk down the middle of the fence for the next three weeks.

I think I would like to relate to you my first Grand Conclave when I was in the local Commandery line was when I was in Scranton Pennsylvania. The person I am going to relate to the Grand Encampment Officers knows him. Very few of you will remember him. But I was what I called a slick sleeve I see a couple of slick sleeves in here. In Pa you didn't wear anything on your arm as you were a line officer and not on the Dias. So probably about 1982 in Scranton, PA I didn't have a clue about who anybody was and the only Sir Knight from my Commandery was a Past Grand Commander. He was he Grand Commander in 79 and I had just joined the York Rite in 79 so I was just new to everything. It really didn't have a lot of meaning to me but as I was sitting down to have dinner; there were rounds of ten with Sir Knights and ladies. They decided to have a search for a couple of guys for some honor. They finally stopped at the guy setting on my left and said come on Charlie. They awarded him this metal you wear on your chest. The guys name was Charlie Garners and he had run for Grand Commander probably ten or twelve years before that. He lost, got mad and went back to his Commandery and took it from two hundred Sir Knight to over four hundred Sir Knights. When the Grand Commandery lost him his Commandery gained an awful lot. I didn't know him or the history but have picked it up over the years. That little metal awarded to him and another Sir Knight, I did know him and for that matter didn't know Charlie either, but that was the Knight Templar Cross of Honor. Charlie deserved it probably deserved it long before he received that award and the Sir Knights who received it last night deserved it and deserved it long before.

When you have the opportunity to serve as Grand Commandery you have the opportunity to choose one or in this case two Sir Knights to receive the Knight Templar Cross of Honor and I have not seen one in any jurisdiction that have been awarded that particular award that isn't deserving. I thought I seen a couple in here who might have that award. Could those who have received the Knight Templar Cross of Honor recipient please rise. Thank you very much for being a part of this Grand Commandery.

Back to my original story, as I was bouncing around in the Grand line most of you know that I have visited two hundred and fifty-five lodge in last four year with about one hundred fifty to go. It was the same thing there in PA. I visited many Commanderies there and I finally understood what that Knight Templar Cross of Honor was. One award that I really wanted to receive fortunately for others I will never receive that honor but every time one is awarded I get a special feeling in my heart that I wish I could have stayed out of the way and perhaps have received it but for those who receive it it's a special honor for them and it's special for me when I see someone receive that award.

By the way Charlie ran for Grand Encampment against Richard Baldwin in Saint Louis and if you look at my chapeaux case you will see his campaign logo when he was out there. The night before the election I said to Charlie, I don't know Charlie it don't look that good out there and he said get out of

here I don't want to hear negative thoughts now. Not to be controversial and don't turn the switch off but I would have love to see Charlie have had the opportunity to serve as Grand Master of our Grand Encampment. He was a worker bee and I think he still is.

I'd like to get off this subject for just a minute. I am not going to keep us here very long because I leaned over to our Grand Master and suggested we'd be out of here by two fifteen. But I didn't know that we'd be controversial and turn off the switch.

The Grand Lodge: This Grand Lodge is not your Grandfather's Grand Lodge and it's not your Father's Grand Lodge. We've heard remarks about plans and your Grand Lodge has a Strategic Plan and I'd like to say that we are there and we are almost there. When a Grand Master or someone comes up with a program we look at it to see if it fits the Strategic Plan. I will say the plan does a lot of guidance along the way about what the decisions are and where we are going. You don't just walk in and say we are going to move the ship this direction. We need to look at the plan and see what's going on down the road. Yesterday, in your Father's Grand Lodge the Grand Master came in and you didn't have a clue what he was going to do, where he was going or what was going to happen. The next day after he is installed you were headed in this or that direction.

Today, I have to tell you guys I don't know that change is really necessary. I think we have a lot of good things that are going on. We have a lot of good programs in place. I just don't know that all of the members and all of the lodges know what those plans are. If you don't know what they are what we have why make new programs, just make sure everyone knows the present plans. Why do I need to put a brand new silver bullet out there that's probably the same thing we have. So I think we need to make sure that the membership and officers of the lodges understand what those plans are and what programs are available.

Along with that, in the last two years the Grand Lodge Officers were making conference calls, thet started out at 6:00 in the morning. Then that's not been working well so we moved to Sunday evening and for the last year and that's not working well. So, where we are at now and it started in January is are having face to face meetings. We all meet at a central point sit down and do some face to face time we are going to do that in the evening sit down and talk about what and which programs we need to move forward with and where we are going. I don't think that could have happened back then. I don't know that the Grand Masters of yester years would have allowed the officers to get together and plan for this year and future years. There is a plan there and the plan is to make sure that what happens this year goes forward to the next year and the next year and the next year.

With that it certainly has been a pleasure to be where with you today. As always most of you have seen me here before and I appreciate the opportunity to be here with you again today and appreciate the Friendship, Fellowship and Brotherly Love I see and feel in this Grand Commandery.

I have had the honor of being the Battalion Commander for Battalion 7 since October 2010. New Albany and Columbus held their own Reception and Inspection, while Bedford and Bloomington had joint Receptions and Inspections. Seymour attempted an Instructional, but was not held. For instance, in April of 2007, we invested \$299,622.96 and \$229,147.86 in the General Fund and Education Fund, respectively with Raymond James. The investment market turned sour in February of

2009. At that time the above investments declined to \$189,612.02 in the General Fund and \$141,106.12 in the Education Fund. As of this writing, the investments have not returned to the values of 2007, but they are very close. As of April 2010 the permanent fund sits at \$270,074.38 and the Education fund sits at \$195,344.22.

Necrology: The report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 134 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest. After Grand Prelate Charles E. Johnson gave his report, David M. Bertch, KCT, PGC read a eulogy in memory of Sir Knight Robert E. Price, KCT, KGC, PGC, HPDC and Grand Recorder Emeritus 1978-79. Sir Knight Steven J. Barton, KCT, PGC, PDC then gave a eulogy for Sir Knight Sid Cornelius Dorris III, PGM of Tennessee and was the current Right Eminent Grand Generalissimo of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA. Sir Knight Barton continued with an eulogy for Sir Knight William Henry Thornley, Jr., Past Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA.

Education Foundation: The Educational Foundation Committee will continue to award a \$5000.00 scholarship to Christian Theological Seminary (CTS). The committee has contacted several theological seminaries in the northern end of the state but we were unsuccessful in finding a seminary that would accept money from a Masonic organization.

Therefore, it was decided that we would enter into another three year agreement with Christian Theological Seminary (CTS) to supply a \$5000.00 scholarship for a student who is working on a master degree in divinity. CTS assumed the responsibility to research the needs of their best students and present to the committee a deserving student. The committee is looking forward to working with CTS again.

Crusader: The official Conclave Program Book, "The Templar Crusader", was again successful and Richmond Commandery No. 8 received the traveling award for selling the most ads.

Elections: The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies were represented by at least one delegate. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

Grand Commander-elect Paul A. Cole then announced the following appointments: Randal P. Ellington, GP; Marvin L. Rees, GO; Harrison E. Lackey, KCT, KTCH, HPGC, Grand Marshall; Irvin L. Bitting, KCT, PGC, GIG; Lawrence J. Williams, GStdB; Terry L. Kehrer, GSwdB;

Kurt A. Begue, GW; and David C. Willoughby, GS.

Finance: SK Irvin L. Bitting. KCT, PGC and Chairman of the Finance Committee gave a presentation on the finances of the Grand Commandery and that the past several years have been severely rough on the finances of the Grand Commandery. We had to take from the permanent fund to operate the Grand Commandery. With the assessment that we voted in last year, we generated enough funds to operate the coming year. If our finances remain as they are at the present time we will be in position to start returning funds to the permanent fund in two years. As we proposed last year a .50 cent increase each year to offset the drop in membership, this increase has to be voted on each year. The finance committee recommends that this .50 cent increase continue.

In summary the per capita now looks like this: Grand Encampment: \$9.00. Grand Commandery: \$10.00. Eye Foundation: \$1.00 (not assessed if member is a Life Member of the Eye Foundation). In addition, the Grand Commandery also imposed a \$5 per member assessment on all members, including Life Members and 50-year members.

Easter Sunrise: As has been the custom for many years, the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana sponsored a trip to attend the Grand Encampment Easter Sunrise Service in Arlington, VA. This year, the itinerary consisted of the following: Depart Wednesday morning at 7:00 AM on April 20, 2011 from the Marriott East in Indianapolis, IN for Harrisonburg VA and spend the night at the Comfort INN. Thursday we toured the Quilt Museum in Harrisonburg, VA. The Kaleidoscope Collection by Jenny Beyer was on display. When this tour was over we on to tour Jefferson's Monticello and from there we went on into Alexandria, VA to the Hotel. On Friday, we toured the George Washington National Masonic Memorial and all of the monument areas on the mall. On Saturday morning, Grand Commander Dove had the great honor of placing a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery. We also took a tram tour of the Arlington Cemetery. In the afternoon we took a guided tour of the National Zoo. That evening, we attended the Grand Master's Banquet at the hotel. On Easter Sunday morning they enjoyed breakfast at the hotel before heading to the George Washington National Memorial for the Grand Encampment Easter Sunrise Service. The Knight Templars did get to march up Shooters Hill. This is a most inspiring event for Christian Knights. Those in attendance were blessed with the most beautiful sunrise that morning. After the service they returned to the hotel, loaded up their belongings and headed for Indianapolis.

Ministers who fall outside of these guidelines will rank lower in the process of selecting ministers from the pool of those nominated.

- Having <u>never traveled to Israel</u> before.
- Fully <u>Ordained ministers</u> (copy of Ordination Certificate or judicatory documentation must accompany the application). Youth coordinators, program directors, lay pastors, etc. rarely have ordination status.
- Serving in <u>full time</u> ministry, currently. This means that they are employed by the church full time and it is their primary source of income.
- Having <u>served at least four years</u> in full time ministry.
- Having <u>at least ten years of full time service</u> yet to go.
- Be of **good physical health** (if the idea of walking a brisk mile or more uphill, non-stop, with steps is a concern, this may not be the program from which this person would benefit).
- Willing to travel with an <u>ecumenical group</u> of other ministers from many denominations and religious groups, male and female.
- Willing to travel in a program sponsored by the **Knights Templar**, an appendant organization of **Freemasonry**.
- Willing to travel <u>without their spouse</u>. This is non-negotiable.
- Having the understanding that this is a <u>strenuous educational and spiritual</u> study seminar / historical & cultural immersion experience and not a vacation trip.

Sir Knights, to Your Devotions

We Sir Knights have to remember that the first Christmas was a time of miracles. God has often used special, heavenly lights to guide his people, such as the glory that filled the tabernacle and the temple and that shone upon the apostle Paul. Such visible signs of God's presence are known as the Shekinah Glory, or dwelling place of God. This special light is a visible manifestation of divine majesty.

The great mystery of the first Christmas is not the origin of its special star; it is the question of why the Magi were chosen to follow the light to the Messiah and why we are given the same invitation today.

In Matthew 2:1-9: Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, saying, "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him." When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. So they said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it is written by the prophet: 'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are not the least among the rulers of Judah; For out of you shall come a Ruler who will shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod, when he had secretly called the wise men, determined from them what time the star appeared. And he sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the young Child, and when you have found Him, bring back word to me, that I may come and worship Him also." When they heard the king, they departed; and behold, the star which they had seen in the East went before them, till it came and stood over where the young Child was.

We as Christian Masons need to continue to search for Light that Light in the East which will guide us through our daily lives especially during the Christmas Season. Christmas is a time of preparation and of celebration of the birth of our Lord, the Messiah, Jesus Christ. It is a time for fellowship, warmth, gifts, and song, good food, parties and memories, but we at times loose the real meaning of the Christmas season. General Order No. 1 Cole May 1, 2011

ANNUAL INSPECTION OF CONSTITUENT COMMANDERIES

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 473 and 474 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of this Jurisdiction be inspected.
- 2. Each Commandery shall be inspected by its respective Battalion Commander, with the following exceptions. The designated primary Commandery of each Elected Grand Officer excluding the Grand Treasurer, and Grand Recorder, will be inspected by the Grand Inspector General. Other exceptions or substitutions may be made as authorized by the Grand Commander.
- 3. The Inspection shall consist of a report on the Commanderies' membership efforts, examination of the books, records, accounts, paraphernalia, and properties of the Commandery. No inspection shall be considered complete until the Commandery shall have participated in a Reception as described in paragraphs eight and nine below.
- 4. Each Inspection shall start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Battalion Commander.
- 5. Each Inspecting Officer will send a Notice of Inspection courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder in advance of the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and request certain reports to be completed. The Recorder shall provide the completed reports to the Inspecting Officer upon his arrival.
- 6. No Inspection will be considered complete until all books and financial records have been made available to the Inspecting Officer. If not available at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the Officer involved (Recorder or Treasurer) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within fifteen (15) days. Failure to do so may cause the Commandery to be placed on probation until this obligation has been fulfilled.

- 7. The Inspecting Officer shall make his report of each inspection to the Grand Inspector General, Deputy Grand Commander, the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the Commandery inspected. A Full report of the inspection will be published and appropriate recognition given at the Annual Conclave.
- 8. Receptions: Each Commandery shall open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form, receive the Commander, receive and present such Distinguished Guests as may be present, conduct the Rehearsal of Lines, Personal Inspection, form the Triangle and perform the Flag Ceremony. Those will have the addition of 50 points for a closed and 100 for a public reception to the activities score sheet for that Commandery. For Commanderies joining with other Commanderies for the Opening, Closings, and Orders, the 50 or 100 points will be divided among the Commanderies participating in the work providing however, that there are at least 6 members of each Commandery present in order for a Commandery to accumulate points. For those Commanderies that will attend an Instructional no score will be awarded only Inst. shall appear in this column.
- 9. A Full Form Opening with subsequent Order shall be voluntary, and may be held with other Commanderies as agreed to by the Battalion Commander. An optional Instructional will be held in each battalion. Each Commandery must participate in one of the three options listed below.
 - a) Those Commanderies performing a separate Opening, Closing and Order will have the addition of up to 200 points to the activities score sheet for the Commandery.
 - b) Those Commanderies joining with other Commanderies for the Opening, Closings, and Orders, the points will be divided among the Commanderies participating in the work again provided there are at least 6 members of each Commandery present in order for a Commandery to accumulate points.
 - c) To assist in the proficiency of the work, eight different instructional meetings throughout the State will be scheduled and conducted by the Battalion Commanders. Commanderies in attendance will receive additional points on the activity sheet on a per-officer and member attending bases at the discretion of the Battalion Commander.
- 10. The full form Opening and the conferring of the Order shall be in accordance with the Ritual and Official Indiana Asylum Tactics, and the most recent official interpretations thereof. The Twelve Man Full Form opening or the Ten Man Officer opening may be used.
- 11. The Battalion Commander will schedule (2) two Battalion meetings for information and/or ritual instruction during the year.
- 12. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the visit. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to supply or provide any assistance that another Commandery may need. If an actual candidate is present the quality of the impression made upon such candidate shall be of prime importance.
- 13. Upon completion of each Reception, the Inspecting Officer shall give his remarks first. The Inspecting Officer will then call for comments from the sidelines. Finally, the Grand Commander, if present, shall be called upon for any remarks that he might wish to make. At all times, if the Grand Commander is not present, the Inspecting Officer shall act as his Official Representative and shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him as such. If the Grand Commander is present, he will

be the final speaker unless the Most Worshipful Grand Master is in attendance in which case the Grand Master will be the final speaker.

14. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion with the highest <u>activity</u> score. The Commandery with the highest <u>activity</u> score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.

15. This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and so noted in the minutes of the Commandery.

Mentoring New Members and Junior Officers

Maintaining interest in new Sir Knights and preparing Junior Officers for future leadership are important issues in the life of any Commandery. An active mentoring program can achieve these goals and the following program is directed for implementation and monitoring by each Commandery.

- Upon Knighting, each Sir Knight will have a mentor assigned whose responsibility it will be to cause the new Sir Knight to remain an active member by inviting him to all functions personally, helping him become involved in the Commandery to the extent the new Sir Knight is able, and answering all questions that he and his family pose.
- The mentor will also be responsible to provide a member packet to the new Sir Knight containing information about the Commandery and Templary. This may include a calendar, newsletter, Commandery history, philanthropies, and information on Conclaves, activities, and officers.
- Each new officer in the line will also be assigned a mentor, preferably a Past Commander or Dais Officer, to provide guidance and encouragement to the new officer and to instruct and answer questions he will have as he advances.
- The officer's mentor shall make certain that the new officer has the proper ritual, tactics, officer's handbook bylaws, and other information he needs to succeed. The mentor shall assist the new officer in preparing his uniform and equipment and assist him with proficiency in protocols and practices.

The Recorder will maintain a record of the assignment of mentors and include that information with his books for annual inspection. A suggested place for keeping this information is the membership book or log of the Commandery.

The Generalissimo will be assigned to administer and monitor the mentorship program and to oversee the development of new Sir Knights and officers. I have requested the Battalion Commanders and Deputies to assist you, the Generalissimo, in implementing the program.

This honor is for the Sir Knight of your Commandery who you consider has been, or is, outstanding in his Chivalric labors.

Should your Commandery desire to make a nomination for this award, you will use the following procedure.

- 1. Pass a resolution in your Commandery, naming the Sir Knight to be nominated.
- 2. Write to the Grand Recorder for a nomination form.

"KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR" RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) In accordance with the provisions of Section 237½ of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, as amended at the 50th Triennial Conclave, the meritorious Award known as the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, shall be conferred by the Grand Master on behalf of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to deserving Sir Knights of Constituent and Subordinate Commanderies upon certain conditions hereinafter set forth.
- (2) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR shall be awarded "only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order, far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an officer or member." In deciding upon the award, precedents shall be entirely ignored and each case shall be decided upon its own unusual merits. No posthumous award shall be made, and no present or past elected Grand Officer of a Grand Commandery shall be eligible for the award.
- (3) Only one nomination may be made from a Grand Commandery membership of 5,000 or less, plus one additional nomination may be made by a Grand Commandery for each additional 5,000 of its members, or major fraction thereof, during any one year. Only one nomination may be made from the total of the Subordinate Commanderies during one year.
 - (4) The procedure to be followed for making nominations for this Award shall be as follows:
 - a. Any Constituent Commandery desiring to make a nomination shall first adopt a formal resolution, setting forth the full name of its nominee, and the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
 - b. The Commander of such Constituent Commandery shall thereupon cause to be filled-in a Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of his Grand Commandery, giving the date, full name of the nominee, address, Templar rank, name of his Commandery and a statement of the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
 - c. Such Nomination Form shall be signed by the Commander of such Constituent Commandery and shall be forwarded by him to the Grand Commander of his jurisdiction for consideration.
 - d. Such Grand Commander shall consider all nominations made by Constituent Commanderies of his Grand Commandery upon Nomination Forms and shall select only one nominee (more where qualified) in any one year; upon making such selection, the Grand Commander shall affix his written approval to such Nomination Form and shall thereupon send the name to the Grand Master.
 - e. Any Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination for this Award shall follow the same procedure as is set forth above for Constituent Commanderies, except that such Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination, shall forward the Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment, and the same shall bear the written approval of the Commander of such Subordinate Commandery before being sent by him to the Grand Master.
- (5) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR medal shall consist of a round, gold-finished medal, the outer circle of which shall bear the words "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR," showing through in black enamel, and in the center shall appear the Patriarchal Cross of the Grand Encampment in purple enamel. Such medal shall be suspended from a gold-finished bar by two small chain links on either side; upon the face of the bar shall be engraved the name of the Sir Knight who shall be the recipient thereof.

The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medal may be worn upon the Commandery uniform by the recipient upon all occasions.

- (6) A suitable Certificate of Award, issued by the Grand Encampment, signed by the Grand Master and the Grand Recorder, and bearing the seal of the Grand Encampment thereon, shall accompany the medal. The Certificate of Award shall contain a summary of the Citation upon which such Award is based.
- (7) It shall be the responsibility of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to provide the medals, the Certificates of Award for the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, without any cost to the recipient or to his Constituent or Grand Commandery, or his Subordinate Commandery. Presentation of the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medals, Certificates shall be made at an appropriate ceremony by Grand Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies, and a report thereof shall be sent by the respective Recorder to the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment within thirty days thereafter.

ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874. Knightstown No. 9 surrendered their charter on March 31, 2008 and merged with Greenfield No. 39.

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868, and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929, revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Muncie #18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000, and merged with Anderson #32. Muncie charter was restored October 24, 2006 with 9 former members of Muncie # 18. The Charter surrendered December 31, 2010.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990.

St. John No. 24 - Chartered April 2, 1873. Charter surrendered January 2, 2012 and merged with Frankfort Commandery No. 29.

Plymouth No. 26 - Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974, and merged with South Bend No. 13.

Sullivan No. 54 - Chartered July 4, 1907. Charter surrendered September 20, 1979.

Martinsville No. 55 - Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered on December 1, 1932

Gary No. 57 - Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary No. 57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995.

East Chicago No. 58 – Chartered May 9, 1912. Charter surrendered December 31, 2000 and merged with Hammond No. 41 at the same location.

Greensburg No. 59 – Chartered May 12, 1920. Charter surrendered December 1, 2001 and merged with Columbus No. 14.

Peru No. 60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash No. 37.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941,

Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62; At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but the only record of a name change is noted in the Conclave Bulletin No. 1. No other record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity No. 62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge No. 717.

The Committee on Dispensations & Charters presented a request to change the name of Oriental Commandery No. 62 (Currently called Trinity Commandery no. 62) to Prather Commandery No. 62 to document the name change properly. Vote taken and passed to officially make the name of the aforementioned Commandery to be henceforth called Prather Commandery No. 62. (Approved April 24, 2010)

Wright Commandery No. 64 Chartered April 29, 1988. Dispensation granted on April 29, 2005, to move their Charter to Eckerty Lodge No. 719, Eckerty, Indiana 47116 on a permanent basis. (May 1, 2006). Dispensation was granted to Wright Commandery No. 64 to move its Charter to Dubois Lodge No. 520 at Huntingburg, Indiana, for the Stated Conclave on September 16, 2009. At that time, the

Lawrence Commandery No. 67 - Chartered April 29, 1994. Charter moved to Millersville Lodge September 21, 2002. Name changed to H. E. Lackey Commandery No. 67 on April 23, 2003.

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. - Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, to open Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued February 12, 2001 to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 23, 2003.
