## SIR KNIGHT DUANE LEE VAUGHT, GCT, PGC (IN) Most Eminent Grand Master

Duane Lee Vaught was born in 1956 in Crawfordsville, Indiana, the first of three sons of Lloyd E Vaught and Maxine Vaught.

He was baptized and confirmed as a member of the Methodist Church. In 2000 he married Georgia Jean Nagai Goode. Sir Knight Vaught has two brothers, both residing in Indiana. Georgia has a sister, living in Atlanta, Georgia.

Duane Vaught began his professional career with a national accounting firm in its Indianapolis office, during which time he passed the CPA exam and was licensed as a Certified Public Accountant. He subsequently moved to a local accounting firm in Bloomington Indiana. He advanced in that firm to the level of partner. In 1995 he joined the firm of Stampfli Associates CPAs as Vice-President. In 2008 he became President of that firm. Although he works with individuals and many kinds of businesses, not-for-profit entities are one of his primary specialties. He served as president of his chapter of Kiwanis, is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, its Not-For-Profit practice section, Indiana State CPA Society and the Bloomington Chapter of the Institute of Management Accountants, in which last organization he served several years as Vice-president for Professional Education. Duane Vaught began his Masonic career in 1971 when he was initiated into Montgomery Chapter of the Order of DeMolay. In DeMolay he served as Master Councilor of his Chapter, Illustrious Knight Commander of DeMolay Order of Knighthood in Indiana and two years as an appointed officer of the DeMolay State Council. He has received the DeMolay honors of Representative DeMolay, Chevalier, and Legion of Honor (Active)

Sir Knight Vaught was initiated, passed and raised a Master Mason in 1977, in his hometown of Crawfordsville Indian. He served as Worshipful Master of Spencer Lodge no. 95 in 1993 during which year the lodge received the Grand Master's Award with Distinction. He has also served as Worshipful Master of Dwight L. Smith Lodge of Research.

From May 2002 through May 2008 he served as an officer of the Grand Lodge F&AM of Indiana, the last year of that period as Most Worshipful Grand Master. He is also the Grand Representative of the Grand Lodge of New York near Indiana. In 2008 he was elected to a three-year term as trustee. For five years he also served on the Board of Directors of the Indiana Masonic Home. Vaught received the degrees of Royal Arch Masonry, Cryptic Masonry and the Orders of Chivalric Masonry on October 22, 1977 in a festival, held in Muncie, in honor of then presiding Most Eminent Grand Master, Willard M. Avery. He Served as High Priest of Crawfordsville Chapter No. 40 and Illustrious Master of Montgomery Council No. 34 in 1983.

Sir Knight Vaught served as Eminent Commander of Crawfordsville Commandery No. 25 in 1981 and 1982 and has received the Distinguished Service Award, Knight Commander of the Temple, and Knight Grand Cross of the Temple awards. He is Grand Representative of the Grand Commandery of Illinois near Indiana and also holds memberships in Bloomington Commandery No. 63 and St Anselm Commandery UD in Indiana. He also holds memberships in Commanderies in Ohio and Colorado. He holds honorary memberships in several other Grand Commanderies. He served ten years as an officer of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana culminating in serving as the 140th Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana in 2001 - 2002. Sir Knight Vaught is a Past Sovereign of St. Basil Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine. Past Governor of Banks of the Wabash York Rite College No. 72 and has received the Gold Honor Award and Order of

the Purple Cross. He is a Past Excellent Chief of Indiana Council No. 15, Knight Masons and Past Director General of Indianapolis Preceptory, Yeomen of York. In the Allied Masonic Degrees, he is a Past Sovereign Master of St. Bernard de Clairvaux Council 256. He is a Knight Commander of the Red Branch of Eri and served over ten years as Secretary of his council.

Vaught is a Past Preceptor of St Andrew Tabernacle XXXV Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests and an officer of the Grand College. He is and officer of the Grand College of Rites. He is a member, IX degree, Knight Grand Cross of Indiana College, Masonic Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis, MSCRIF, and serves as Treasurer General of the High Council, MSRICF of the United States.

He is a member of J. Herbert Nichols and Robert A. Woods Priories of KYCH, Terre Haute Valley, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite NMJ, Royal Order of Scotland, Murat Shrine AAONMS, Sahara Grotto MOVPER, Grand College of Rites, Order of Knights Preceptor, Indiana Past Commanders Association, Goose and Tater, and Royal Order of Zanzibar. In 2005 he was crowned a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33 Degree. He is a Grand Cross of the Royal Society of Knights Occidental and an Honorary Kentucky Colonel.

Sir Knight Vaught was appointed Right Eminent Grand Captain General, Grand Encampment, and Knights Templar on August 29, 2007 by Sir Knight William Koon II, Grand Master and was elected to remain in the office of Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment at the 64th Triennial Conclave, August 2009, in Roanoke Virginia. He was advanced to Right Eminent Grand Generalissimo on November 22, 2010 following the Death of Sid C. Doris III, elected Deputy Grand Master in Alexandria VA. in August 2012 and elected Grand Master of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar in August 2015 in Buffalo NY.

## Biography of James Lee Bolinger 154<sup>th</sup> Grand Commander Knights Templar of Indiana

James Lee Bolinger was born in South Bend, Indiana on August 13, 1950 to Jack Laverne and Galelah (Johnson) Bolinger. Jim graduated from South Bend John Adams High School and attended a four-year electrical apprenticeship program. Jim married Deborah (Debbie) Manspeaker in 1971. They have two children, James and Rebecca (Dundek) and three grandsons, David, Andrew and Jacques.

Jim was employed as a construction electrician/foreman for 42 years in several cities in Indiana and Illinois which included many projects at the University of Notre Dame, Goshen College and several area hospitals.

Jim's Masonic history began in South Bend, Indiana with Portage Lodge #675 where he was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason on March 20, 1979. He served Portage Lodge #679 as Worshipful Master in 1983 and 1999. Portage Lodge #675 merged with St. Joseph Lodge #45 in 2001 and Jim Bolinger served as Master of St. Joseph Lodge #45 in 2009 and Secretary of the Lodge from 2001 to 2006.

Jim became a member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite Valley of South Bend in 1979. He completed the Lodge of Perfection line as Thrice Potent Master in 2005 and was coroneted a 33<sup>rd</sup> degree Scottish Rite Mason in 2007 in Washington, DC.

Jim was exalted to a Royal Arch Mason in South Bend Chapter #29, greeted as a Cryptic Mason in South Bend Council #82 and became a Knight Templar in South Bend Commandery #13 on March 19, 2005. He served as Excellent High Priest of South Bend Chapter #29 in 2010, Illustrious Master of South Bend Council #82 in 2006/2007, and Eminent Commander of South Bend Commandery #13 in 2008/2009. He is a dual member of St. Anselm Commandery and became a dual member of Angola York Rite in 2012.

In 2009, Sir Knight Jim was appointed as Grand Sword Bearer of the Grand Commandery of Indiana. He also served as Grand Standard Bearer before being elected to the progressive line of the Grand Commandery as Grand Junior Warden.

Jim and Debbie have taken on the responsibility of organizing and managing the annual Grand Encampment Easter Pilgrimage to Washington, DC, including the laying of the wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier for the past four of years.

Other Masonic memberships and honors include membership in Orak Shrine in Michigan City since 1979, Yeoman of York Elkhart Preceptory No. 5, Northwest Indiana York Rite College #73, J. What's in the system that day is the number of Knights the Grand Commandery will be charged for period...... Grand Encampment shows 3,326 and my report show 3,255 or some 71 additional Knight I need to pay \$9.00 for in my Annual Report to Grand Encampment. So, those of you who updated your recorders before Dec 31 Thank You. Not only for keeping your recorders up to date but for helping to pay for those who did not.

That said how can I avoid the same thing next year.

The answer is very simple. COMMUNICATIONS!!! Recorders and Commanders of our constituent Commanderies I need your help.

The 1<sup>st</sup> step is passage of proposed legislation today concerning Establishing Dues in June for the coming year and notifying the Grand Recorder's office of the amount, will set the stage for the Annual report being completed on time.

2<sup>nd</sup> I have established an email list of Recorders and Commanders. I will send emails to them for any updates from the Grand Recorders office. As a follow up that day or the day after I will use a "Call em All" Phone system to remind the Recorders and Commanders to check their email for information. Don't have email, contact your Recorder. Each Recorder has an email address.

3<sup>rd</sup> Specifically; for the MMS or Masonic Membership Solutions. If you don't want to learn the MMS system; Call me after your meeting and tell me the activities which happened at that Conclave. Or a step up, I will send to ALL the Recorder and Commanders a monthly report form. If you want to make reports via paper, I ask you to make copies of the "monthly report form" write any OR No Activities for the month and send it to me via US Mail. Step up. Or a step up, Use the form on your PC to type the information save that information for the month attach it to an email to me and send it. In each one of these, I will input the information into the system and keep your Commandery updated.

Step up, IF you want to learn the MMS Date system. Pick up the phone call me and I will help you get on line to use the system. Then help you to sign in and for the next year after any meeting or information which changes your Commandery numbers, (to include Knightings, Affiliations, Reinstatements,

Demits, Suspensions, Expulsions and Deaths) call me and I will help you get the information into the system. <u>YOU</u> cannot break the system. If something you did happens and we can't fix the problem. I will call Grand Encampment and tell them "<u>I</u> made a mistake please help." NOT YOU....

Step up and over the top. You feel comfortable and can make your changes, HAPPY DAYS are here. Go for it.

November 1, November 15, December 1, December 15, I will send an email and make a call to remind you to get your information updated. See above for assistance. What I see in the system Jan. 1, is what you will be charged for.....

You will receive your Re-Cap Statement via email by Jan. 3 at the latest. That will allow you time to print and take it to your January Stated Conclave and the Commandery can then pay the Per Capita by Jan. 31.



## NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments the organization carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses on investment are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statement of activities.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) Restricted and Unrestricted Revenue Contributions received are recorded as increases in unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.
- (h) The Organization has evaluated subsequent events through July 5, 2016, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

Sir Knight Willson served as Right Eminent Grand Commander of Texas in 1973-1974. He was appointed Right Eminent Department Commander for the South Central Department in 1985-1988. He was elected to two nine-year terms (1979-1988 and 1997-2006) as Trustee of the Permanent Fund. He was appointed Right Eminent Grand Treasurer on Friday, November 17, 2006, by Sir Knight Richard Burditt Baldwin. He was subsequently re-elected Right Eminent Grand Treasurer: on Tuesday, August 18, 2009, at Roanoke, Virginia; on Tuesday, August 14, 2012, at Alexandria, Virginia; and, on Tuesday, August 11, 2015, at Buffalo, New York. Sir Knight Willson was elected an Honorary Past Grand Master on Tuesday, August 18, 2009, in Roanoke, Virginia.

Sir Knight Willson laid down his sword and entered the Supreme Asylum above on Saturday, April 9, 2016.

It is my order that the Charters of all Commanderies under the Jurisdiction of the Grand Encampment be draped in Sir Knight Willson's honor at their next Stated Conclave following receipt of this notice. The Charter is to remain draped until the following Stated Conclave.

I further direct that the Charters of all Grand Commanderies under the Jurisdiction of the Grand Encampment be draped in Sir Knight Willson's honor during their Annual Conclave.

Each Commandery and Grand Commandery is expected to pay appropriate tribute to Sir Knight Willson at their Annual Memorial Service. Please remember Sir Knight Willson's family in your prayers.

Larry was widely known as a man of exceptional integrity, was devoted to his family, and was an advocate of higher education, in all forms. He graduated from George Rogers Clark High School in 1959, and went to work at AMF, Junior Toy Division in Hammond while attending Purdue University Calumet. He then attended IBM

school and was then employed at Hartford Insurance in Chicago. In 1963 he married Janet C. Gard. During his career, Larry also worked at Contemporary Books, Inc., Huntington Industries, Inc., and retired from the Quaker Oats Co. He received an Associate Degree in Management from Purdue University Calumet; Bachelor of Arts from St. Joseph College in Management; Associate Program in Logistics Excellence at the University of Wisconsin, Madison; and earned the certification as a Certified Data Processor at the Institute of Certification of Computer Professionals. He worked with the Boy Scouts of America at many levels for over 16 years and served as an assistant Chapter Advisor in the Willis R. Ford, Order of DeMolay for several years. Larry received his Masonic degrees in Garfield Lodge #569, Hammond, IN during 1970, served as Worshipful Master in 1981, served as assistant secretary from 1971 through 2010 and served as treasurer for 10 years. He joined the Hammond York Rite bodies in 1975 and served as High Priest in 1999, Illustrious Master 1997 and Eminent Commander in 1999. He served as Secretary/Recorder of the Hammond York Rite 2000-09. Larry served at the state level with the Grand Council Cryptic Masons as the Group Officer for the Arch 1 from 1995-1999. He started his Grand Commandery service as a Deputy Battalion Commander in Battalion 1 in 1996, was appointed as Grand Warden in 1999, elected and served as the 144th Grand Commander, Knights Templar of Indiana for the Templar year 2005-06. He had served as the Grand Recorder since 2006. He was a member of many other Masonic-affiliated organizations and earned many accolades, degrees, and recognition for his lifetime of devoted service. Funeral services were held on Friday, December 4, 2015 at Glory to God Church, 3711 Ridge Road, Highland at 10 AM with Pastor David Adams officiating. What the above information fails to mention is, that he was a great Mentor. While you were discussing things with Larry and feeling you were imparting great wisdom to him, in fact he was allowing you to find the answers to the questions you were asking him for assistance. Thus in truth by his listening skills you left felling you had given him knowledge and yet in fact you had learned a great deal more by his silence or asking you for advice. He was a strong person who believed and practiced the art of two ears and one mouth meaning you should listen twice as much as you talk, in order to educate those who knew all the answers.

Larry, his wife Janet, my wife Karen and I were married the same day in 1963. We have celebrated our anniversaries together many of the last ten – fifteen years. While only a few of those were on August 31

- We find the legislative proposal on Finance Sec 612 to be in legal form.
- We find the legislative proposal on Commandery Dues Sec. 806 to be proper in form.
- We find the legislative proposal on Electronic Notification Sec 414 to be proper in form.
- We find the legislative proposal of the Annual Report Sec. 502 to be proper in form.

#### LEGISLATION PROPOSAL FINANCE

Section 612: currently reads:

**SECTION 612:** For each member subject to, and for which per capita fees are received, \$1.00 of the per capita of this Grand Commandery shall be paid into the Permanent Investment Fund of this Grand Commandery in order to partially finance the operations of this Grand Commandery.

The permanent and un-expendable portion of the fund shall be \$279,096.00 as of December 31, 2005 plus all per capita fees and contributions contributed to the fund after that date.

Each year, beginning with the 2007-2008 Grand Commandery year, the permanent fund shall transfer to the general fund, for operations, five percent (5%) of the previous calendar year end value of the permanent fund except that such transfer shall be limited as follows. The maximum annual transfer shall be no more than the amount that would reduce the permanent fund as of the previous calendar year end to the permanent, unexpendable balance of the fund. (April 2006)

#### Section 612 change to read:

**SECTION 612:** The Purpose of the Permanent Investment Fund of this Grand Commandery is to partially finance the operations of this Grand Commandery.

The permanent and un-expendable portion of the fund shall be \$279,096.00 as of December 31, 2005 plus all per capita fees and contributions contributed to the fund after that date.

Each year, beginning with the 2007-2008 Grand Commandery year, the permanent fund shall transfer as necessary to the general fund, for operations, up to five percent (5%) of the fund effective December 31st of each year. Except that such transfer shall be limited to total return on investment earned (net income) and shall not include any of the un-expendable portions of the fund as described above, the previous calendar year end value of the permanent fund except that such transfer shall be limited as follows. The maximum annual transfer shall be no more than the amount that would reduce the permanent fund as of the previous calendar year end to the permanent, un-expendable balance of the fund. (April 2006) (May 2016)

#### Reasoning:

*Ist*: Replace the 1<sup>st</sup> sentence. The first sentence in effect lowers the amount available to the General Fund by the number of members in the Grand Commandery. In a year when the fund may have a down year with little income the 5% would not be available. The purpose of the Permanent Fund is to supplement the General Fund and thus in a bad market year the General Fund instead of receiving income from Permanent Fund would be supplementing the Permanent Fund. The 1<sup>st</sup> sentence now states the exact purpose of the Permanent Fund.

2<sup>nd:</sup> By adding "as necessary" "up to" Gives the Treasurer, Recorder and Trustees more flexibility to transfer funds while still maintaining a cap on the total amount to be transferred to the General Fund. Adding "December 31<sup>st"</sup> gives the Finance Committee the total amount available when necessary for transfer of funds from the Permanent Fund to the General Fund that year, and not a variable amount during the year.

#### **New Section Indiana Law**

#### Commandery Dues

#### Section 806.

(a) Commanderys shall include in their by-laws the first stated conclave in June as the designated meeting at which dues of the Commandery shall be discussed and the amount set. Every Commandery shall designate in its by-laws the amount of dues to be paid by each member annually. The amount of these dues shall include the amount determined by each Commandery for their operation plus the amount set by the Grand Commandery for the Grand Commandery General Fund and the Grand Encampment Assessment, plus \$1.00 for all non-life or higher sponsors of the Eye Foundation.

All dues and assessments are payable in advance and must be collected when due or considered in arrears.

- (b) Dues are chargeable to all Knights Templar in good standing and end on the date that his membership is terminated, or when he becomes a fifty-year member.
- (c) Should the membership of a Knight Templar terminate in any other manner than by his death before the end of the term for which his dues and assessments are paid, the Commandery shall refund to him the pro rata of his dues and assessments for the period during which he was not a member of the Commandery.
- (d) within ten (10) days following the June stated conclave the Recorder of the Commandery shall forward to the Grand Recorder the amount the membership of the Commandery shall be charged for the following year dues. Any Commandery failing to forward the information to the Grand Recorder in that time frame the last recorded dues shall apply.

**Reasoning:** Currently the majority of changes to Bylaws are for the increase of dues for the Commandery. Thus less cost to the Commandery, less book work for the Recorder and Grand Recorder. Notification of the amount of the dues in June or early July will give everyone the amount of the dues for the following and a part of the Annual Report can be completed. The process has been implemented in Grand Lodge for nearly fifteen (15) years and is very successful.

The By-laws committee has and will submit a Standard set of Commandery By-laws.

(1) The Recorder of each constituent Commandery and (2) each officer and past officer of the Grand Commandery The Grand Commander shall require the Grand Recorder to print the annual reports of the Grand Commander, Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder, and Educational Foundation Committee, in advance of the convening of the Grand Commandery and cause a copy thereof to be distributed to each member of that body registering for attendance upon the Conclave. Each of said officers and committees shall have a copy of their respective reports in the hands of the Grand Recorder for such printing and distribution not less than thirty days in advance of the date of the Annual Conclave at which said reports are to be presented. (*April 2006*)

#### Change to read:

**SECTION 414:** Within two weeks following the date of adjournment of a Grand Commandery Conclave, the Grand Commander shall require the Grand Recorder to prepare a complete digest and informative summary of all transactions of the Conclave, have the same printed as a general order or bulletin, and mail provide a copy thereof to. The Grand Commander shall require the Grand Recorder to print the annual reports of the Grand Commander, Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder, and Educational Foundation Committee, in advance of the convening of the Grand Commandery and cause a copy thereof to be distributed to each member of that body registering for attendance upon the Conclave. Each of said officers and committees shall have a copy of their respective reports in the hands of the Grand Recorder for such printing and distribution not less than thirty days in advance of the date of the Annual Conclave at which said reports are to be presented. (*April* 2006)

**Reasoning:** Deleting the words "have the same printed" and "mail" insert the word "provide" gives the Grand Recorder the option of using electronic mail or US postal service to provide the necessary information in either format to the Sir Knights listed.

## CHARTERS AND DISPENSATIONS Merger of Hammond Commandery #41 Into Valparaiso Commandery #28

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Members of the Dispensations & Charters Committee, Grand Recorder, Officers of the Grand Commandery, Past Grand Commanders, Officers and Sir Knights all:

I was assigned by the Grand Commander to act as a Special Deputy for the merger of Hammond Commandery #41 with Valparaiso Commandery #28.

On August 13<sup>th</sup>, 2015 Valparaiso Commandery #28 extended an invitation to Hammond #41 to merge with Valparaiso #28. A letter was then sent out to the membership of Hammond in September informing them of the invitation to merge with Valparaiso and that a discussion and vote would be held on that subject at their October stated conclave.

The stated conclave was held on October 5<sup>th</sup>. There were 14 members present from Hammond. After a lengthy discussion on the pros and cons of the proposed merger, the vote was taken with the following results: 8 in favor of the merger and 6 against the merger. (Final approval will be at Grand Conclave on April 29, 2016.)

On December 14<sup>th</sup> I, along with the Special Deputies from the Grand Chapter and Grand Council met with the Dias Officers of Hammond to discuss the final date of the closing and to audit the books for their respective bodies.

As stated above an audit was conducted on December 14<sup>th</sup> and everything was found in order. At the time of this audit report Hammond Commandery had two (2) outstanding checks, the first was for rent to Highland Lodge where they meet and the second was for the Per Capita to the Grand Commandery for 2015. They will be transferring \$23,253.82 to Valparaiso. (All funds have been transferred, as of January 31, 2016.)

On January 1, 2016, Hammond was effectively closed and the entire membership of 123 members was moved from Hammond #41 to Valparaiso #28 by the Grand Encampment in the MMS data base.

I returned the Commandery Seal, Charter and Beauceant of Hammond Commandery #41 to the Grand Recorder at the Winter Meeting.

Both the Grand Encampment, and the Grand Commandery, have incentivized new member recruitment efforts by offering medals, cordons and embroidered jackets.

The programs developed have enjoyed varying degrees of success, but the fact of the matter is that deaths and demits continue to thwart our efforts to increase membership.

Halting our decline, maintaining and increasing our membership, requires a three-fold approach that emphasizes (1) Recruitment, (2) Retention and (3) Restoration.

#### **Communication**

By improving our communication, by every means available to us, and by meeting, and exceeding, the expectations of our Sir Knights, we can significantly reduce demits.

To reach a digital generation that lives online, we must communicate as they do, through frequent email, interactive websites and Social Media, including Facebook and Twitter.

If all that our Sir Knights ever receive from their Commandery is a dues statement, our younger members, in particular, will continue to leave, and our Commanderies will fold.

#### "Whither are you travelling?"

Unlike the Chapter and the Council, which are derivatives of Ancient Craft Masonry, the Commandery has a language, usages and practices that are peculiar to Templary.

While we recognize our position as one part of the York Rite, the unique aspects of Templary create a singular identity, and serve to foster pride of membership.

And there are Commanderies that draw Sir Knights from other Commanderies, by way of affiliation or transfer, due to their emphasis upon maintaining "a Templar culture".

To paraphrase Dwight L. Smith, in Whither Are We Traveling, "Let's try Templary."

# REMARKS BY SIR KNIGHT LOREN A. WINN, KCT EAST CENTRAL DEPARTMENT COMMANDER, OF THE GRAND ENCAMPMENT, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND PAST GRAND COMMANDER OF MICHIGAN

We do not talk politics in Free Masonry or Templary, but many of you know that our Most Eminent Grand Master is a student of political history. He's also a collector of political memorabilia. So, at this time, really, my chief purpose to be with you is I wanted to attend the first conclave of the 21<sup>st</sup> century with your favorite son, Indiana's own Most Eminent Grand Master, Sir Knight Duane Lee Vaught. Congratulations. I think Indiana should be very, very proud of all of your achievements as Most Eminent Grand Master.

With that, in closing, Right Eminent Grand Commander, I would like to congratulate you on your year as Grand Commander. It has been most successful and the Grand Commandery of Indiana has profited by your leadership. I would like to extend my best wishes to the Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander and along with those best wishes, if there's anything that I can do or the other officers of the Grand Encampment can do to assist you to make your year more successful than it otherwise would be, don't hesitate to call upon us. And with that, again, Sir Knights, thank you for the hospitality and courtesy extended to me. Thank you so much.

# REMARKS BY THE INSPECTING OFFICER SIR KNIGHT DUANE LEE VAUGHT, GCT MOST EMINENT GRAND MASTER, OF THE GRAND ENCAMPMENT, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA PAST GRAND COMMANDER OF INDIANA AND PAST GRAND MASTER OF THE GRAND LODGE ON INDIANA

: Thank you, please sit down. We've had a good day of business, haven't we? It's run just a little longer than the Grand Commander planned but we did the business.

We gave attention to what needed to be given attention to. People asked intelligent questions. People made observations. You Sir Knights, you participated. This is what this is supposed to be about. This is when we gather every year to do our business of our Grand Commandery. You're not here just to be spectators. You are part of this process and it is good that you come with that attitude and it's good that you come ready and willing and alert to participate. The Sir Knight that caught that there was, let's see, what was the error, oh the numbers weren't the same in the pre-printed versus the report that was read. My congratulations to you that you're being attentive. Thank you.

There are a lot of things I could say and a lot of them you have heard before. So I'm not going simply repeat many of those things. But I will want to highlight just briefly a few things. What Grand Encampment is trying to accomplish for all of us.

First, Masonic Membership Solutions, what we used to call YRIS, York Rite Information System, is now Masonic Membership Solutions. There's reasons for that. One of those reasons is that that software was the property of a vendor and we had a long-term license, a 10-year license for that software and we were paying for updates and improvements. Last fall, we purchased that software, the, all intellectual property rights to that software we purchased outright. So, you can now for good or ill, rest assured that Masonic Membership Solutions will be with you for a very long time to come because that license isn't expiring. We're the owner. We do, however, think very highly of the software vendor that we were working with. So, we made a long-term agreement with that vendor to remain with us to service the software, to make an added improvement and enhancements and we drew that up in a manner that is intentionally attractive to that vendor so that they have a strong incentive to stay with us for a long time, to work on that software and to keep it functional, and to keep it updated for the improvements we'd like to see made. One of those improvements is top line signers. This was something that was suggested by us here in Indiana early on in the process, that Indiana has been a leader in tracking the top line singers of petitions. Virgil Humphrey, I don't know if he's still here, okay, has been tracking that for a number of years and you see what the results. There are other states that have a membership program very similar to ours with the lanyard cords. And yet, although they might be a bigger Grand Commandery, we give out more awards. How is that possible? Because in some places they wait for somebody to come forward and say, "I think I'm entitled to an award" but some people are humble. Here in Indiana, we don't wait for them to turn themselves in. We keep track and when we see they've earned an award, we put it out there. We make sure that our people get recognized for their accomplishments. We do a lot of work to keep track of those top line signers. I know it's a lot of work because I had that job before Virgil Humphrey did. And before me was Duane Stucker and for those of you who remember him and it was a hard job when he did it. Point is, Masonic Membership Solutions now has a feature to track top line signers. So, while it will be a long time before there is enough history in there to be totally useful, especially since we have 30 years of history already in our files, the day is coming and it will certainly facilitate future use to be able to know who has signed a lot of petitions. And we make a lot of improvements. We had some comments from the Grand Recorder here earlier about corrections to the system. Well, some corrections we can allow, some can't. We're not going to allow people to go back in time and change the history because there's got to be a cut-off some place and we're just going to make the cutoff and go on. But other changes do become necessary. I believe it was a year before last, you'll be happy to know that your Grand Encampment can now resurrect people from the dead. It seems that some recorders, some local recorders when they couldn't find people they just assumed they were dead and write them off the list of the living and then they'd show up again later. So, we had to have a way to resurrect people. And we can do that now. We can un-decease them. Hallelujah. Perhaps more exciting is the Eye Foundation. Now, we give generously to the Eye Foundation and I'll tell you there's exciting things going on there. Number one, just since we last met in Grand Conclave here in Indiana, three things come to mind. One is the Apldeap Foundation in the Philippines. Philippines, Grand Commander of the Philippines is part of us. We've never done very much for them with the Eve Foundation. You know, all those decades that we did eye care, that was limited to the Continental United, well, to the United States anyway. So the Philippines contributed just like all of you but they didn't necessarily see much result Apldeap Foundation was founded by a gentleman by the name of Allan Pineda. Anybody, any signs of recognition in the room? I guess we're all too old for that. I'm told that young people recognize that as one of the principle people in the group Black Eyed Peas. He's blind. He's blind for the same reason that a lot of premature births are blind and the Eye Foundation puts a lot of effort into research on. Anyway, he has established a foundation in the Philippines, clinic, to try to help a lot of the people who don't have access to medical care. The Eye Foundation came up with \$95,000 one and only time to get some very needed equipment into that clinic. There will be probably in years to come hundreds, hundreds fewer blind, because of that contribution. We were invited to go to the Philippines for a special reception to thank us for that donation and to do the grand opening of the clinic. Now, I can be a little on the cheap side sometimes and whether it was our wallet or whether it was my back, I decided we did not want to go to the Philippines and back just to attend a Tuesday afternoon reception. So, we asked the Grand Commandery of the Philippines if they would like to send some representatives and they said sure. I believe they showed up on that Tuesday afternoon in the middle of nowhere with something like thirty-two Sir Knights to celebrate the grand opening of this clinic. I'll leave it to you to try to guess who was more impressed and who was more excited, the clinic or our Sir Knights in the Philippines but I think everybody had a good afternoon.

Another, there's a group called ARVO, Association for Research and Vision and Ophthalmology. This is an international convention where people get together to compare research on vision issues and meet other people in those fields. Last year was the first year that we made a contribution to that group. Their conference was in May of last year, as it is again this time. In fact, I will not be with you for drill tomorrow. I have an early flight in the morning. I'm going to Seattle for this year's ARVO. Why? Because, aside from the fact that they invited us, we give these starter grants to people. I think you're mostly familiar with the starter grant program where we pick young PhD's and give them funding to get their research started in the hopes that they can get enough data in a year that they can now apply for serious grants. ARVO captures an entirely different group. It captures the group of people who aren't even quite that far. They're not even quite PhD's, but they're working on it. These are travel grants. These are people for whom they are at a stage in their career, put it that way, they are at a stage in their career where a \$1,000 is the difference between whether they can afford to go to the conference or not. I think we can all remember when \$1,000 to us personally was a lot of money. That's the stage these people are in. And for the cost of one starter grant, we can send 60 people to ARVO as their first introduction into the bigger world of eye research. So I will be there to celebrate with them, and attend a reception for our grant recipients. And there are other people who sponsor travel grants to ARVO but one in every four travel grants is us. When we came in, we made a splash.

Third thing I want to mention on Eye Foundation, and this happened just two weeks ago that some of us my Deputy Grand Master, myself, and some others we were at Baltimore, Johns Hopkins University. There is now a permanent endowed Professor of Ophthalmology, the Knight Templar Eye Foundation

Ophthalmology at the Wilmer Eye Clinic at Johns Hopkins University. That's two million dollars of our Eye Foundation money matched dollar for dollar by the university to provide that permanent position. And everybody I can tell you at Wilmer is thrilled to have that new professorship position. They have managed because of our help, they have managed to recruit a really top scientist, one of the top people in the field in the world.

I want to mention that it is the bicentennial of this Grand Encampment. 200 years ago in June members from the Grand Commanderies of New York and Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Pennsylvania a little bit, decided that this, our Knights Templar needed to become a much bigger organization, needed to expand to every part of this country and eventually beyond. And so they formed a Grand Encampment in order to facilitate that progress, 200 years ago. We talked that there's lapel pins available. We talked that there's Malta jewels for sale. We also have a celebration planned in July in New York City. This is where the original meeting forming the Grand Encampment was held so we felt it was only right to go back to New York City. Information on this is in the magazine if you want to consider going to New York City for a weekend to celebrate with us. I know, I'm from the Midwest too, and I know the trepidation of thinking, oh go to downtown New York City. Hmm, I don't know, you know, doesn't everybody who goes there get mugged or killed? I know, I've seen Law and Order so I know it's true. Well, maybe it won't be true if we're there as a group. In any case, it's going to be an interesting affair. We have a lot of things planned for it. Some of them are still in flux. You know how this works. There are things we do all the time. We do Grand Conclaves. We do one-day festivals. We do this, we do that. We know how to do those. Man, we could organize one of those in a couple of hours. We know exactly what we're doing. This is unique. It's not been done before. I don't think it's going to be done for another hundred years. So, it's a little bit three form. But I am confident it's going to be fun and anybody who comes with an open mind to just go with the flow of whatever we're doing, I think you're going to have a fine time. We are saving a fair amount of open time so that anybody who goes will have an opportunity to say, "Well as long as I'm here, maybe I should see something other than the airport and the hotel." So Times Square, close by. If you want to see a for real Broadway show, close by. The Grand Lodge building of New York, which is impressive, close by. Many other things are available and we will have people to assist you in anything you need to know to get around to do any of those things. My point of all that is partially to bring you up to date, to tell you what your Grand Encampment is working on. But it's also my hope that you will take that as an example. You elected us not just so that we could have titles, but in the hopes that we would do something worthwhile for our organization. And we think we're doing that. We don't always make the right call. But we're in there pitching, we're trying to move this Fraternity ahead to make it better. And the point of that is, that that's what the Grand Commanderies are for also. This Grand Commandery is not Templary in Indiana. Templary in Indiana is what happens in your Commanderies. This up here is overhead. This is about trying to provide the organization, the awards, the scale, the assistance to allow your Commanderies be more easily successful. And I want to say that I am pleased to be from Indiana because I come here and I see a Grand Commandery that functions. We had a crisis a few years ago with the money. The market wasn't good in 2008. I think we all remember that. We took a big hit on our money. Some Grand Commanderies would have said, 'well that's just really a shame. We'll just go on as if nothing happened. And they'd be in a lot worse shape today, well some of them are because that's what they did. Some Grand Commanderies, like some people, would probably panic. This Grand Commandery looked the question square in the eye and said, "Okay, this is a problem. How do we deal with it?" And proposals were made and not by me. I wasn't on the finance committee in those two or three years, but your finance committee year after year looked at the situation, said here's what we think we need to do to keep this Grand Commandery strong, strong so that it doesn't have to keep coming back to you for more per capita. And those strategies have changed a little bit. There was an emergency resolution. You, the members, supported that plan to put in more money for a limited period of time to get through the

problems. And that time period passed and that extra money stopped being collected. But this Grand Commandery is now much better off financially than it was before the crisis. And it's because the officers here and you, the members, are willing to step up and do what's necessary for our Templary and as long as Indiana has officers who can do that and as long as we have members sitting on this floor who are willing to deal with the real business of our fraternity, then we're going to be around to do the fun stuff, too. And for that, I am very glad. So thank you.

# REMARKS BY SIR KNIGHT WILLIAM A. REINERS MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER OF THE GRAND LODGE ON INDIANA

Thank you, you can be seated. Several of you heard me speak at Columbus so I'll try not to go over that material again. It's a pleasure for me to be here today as both a Sir Knight and as your Grand Commander. I have worked closely with the Grand Commandery. What? Oh Grand Master, sorry about that. I do not want that office.

Anyway, I do that all the time. Just wait until two weeks from now and I'm up there in the spotlight. You think he had a tough time. I think I'm going to put him as a special deputy up on the stage to help me because I'll need it. Anyway, we've traveled together throughout this state. Jim and Doc and Marty, we've just been everywhere together. The workings of Grand Lodge and the Commandery, as has been pointed out, are considerably different. One of my big thrills this year was receiving my KYCH. I am a Past Commander of Lavallette 14. I am going to look with the Grand Secretary to see why we had the post points and Terre Haute won but I understand there was a mistake in the printed copy. So, always have to take care of my own first. You know, as Mayor Daley said when they asked him why he gave the insurance of Chicago to his son, he says, 'Who did you expect me to give it to?'

The triennial was a great moment for Indiana. We just nodded each other all afternoon, Grand Master, Grand Master, Grand Master. We had such a good time out there. I really wasn't even going to go outside until my wife made me when that fire alarm went off.

You have found despite my recent jest a really good Grand Secretary. George Ingles has always worked so hard in everything that he's been involved in. To go in and take over from a well-loved Grand Secretary in just a very short time and in the middle of a year is something that no one would look forward to. So, I hope that we can continue this trip in the next two years. I know that that is as far out as I can look but I know that the next, the Deputy Grand Master, Carey Carter, and the Senior Warden, and the Past Commander, Grand Commander, Rodney Mann, have kind of linked their years together because Rodney's got a load and a half with everything that's coming to Indiana plus the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary. So, I don't see any difference between the Grand Lodge and the Grand Commandery. I would look forward to seeing many of you at the Annual Communication on the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> of May. I will be out of office by 2:30 they tell me, yeah right.

So, I have enjoyed my year. I've enjoyed my year as Grand Master. I don't know that all Grand Masters say that at the end but I've enjoyed my year. George Ingles certainly did. He was putting out feelers for another year. But I have enjoyed it. I've had to have some difficulties, as we all do. I will tell you if not all of you are at Grand Lodge, there is no plan of the Grand Lodge of Indiana pulling recognition from Tennessee and Georgia or anybody else at this time. Indiana doesn't approach it that way. We may disapprove of what they do, but it's better to remain Brothers and give good counsel and hope everything always changes around eventually. So, we won't bother any groups going there, you know, no problems at all. The other thing that we will bring up at Grand Lodge is the fact that there is no prohibitive in Grand Lodge from any man asking for a petition, that goes for race, ethnicity, religion, but he does have to believe in a Supreme Being however he sees that, and sexual orientation. There is nothing in the book that precludes that. Now we all know there's a vote after that in the Lodge and the Lodges can do that. I would hope and pray that most of us would not reject a candidate simply on one of

those things. You know, there can be a deeper thing that you disagree with but on the surface, not those. So, with that, I think I bored you enough and before I knock over the microphone, I'm going to turn it back over to the Grand Commander and thank you for your hospitality and thank you for your good council and we just had a wonderful year.

BOILINGER: We have and I'm sorry that your wife Brenda can't be here tonight, but we'll certainly miss you.

REINERS: Well I can't be here last time when I was running around at the other two. I was going to other functions of the Grand Lodge. Tonight, unfortunately, I have to drive home, Ken Willis', who many of you remember, he was Grand Master, he appointed me as the Junior Grand Bottom or the Junior Grand Deacon, and his father passed away and it's been tough. I mean, it's been a long time. So, I'm going to go home and participate in that memorial service. He was a Brother. I don't know if he was a Sir Knight. Ken is a Sir Knight. So that's why I will now probably bid you adieu and again, have a great year next year.

Armstrong sent by Kokomo Commandery #36, Rev. David W. Hatfield sent by Anderson Commandery #32 and Rev. Timothy J. King sent by Anderson Commandery #32. We had one Minister that had to back out at the last minute due to not being able to obtain his passport, so Rev. King went in his place.

**Trustees:** As of the 22nd of April, 2014 the Permanent Fund was \$352,320.78. The Education Fund was \$220,380.77 with a \$5,000.00 withdrawal for the Christian Theological Seminary. These funds are kept at Morgan Stanley. We made money for the last year. We went from Portfolio Management to Unified Managed Account and will be performing on a risk-adjusted return for better expectations. The Trustees are pleased to report that financial support to the Newby-Avery Fund, which is part of the Permanent Fund, has now reached \$88,012.90. Our Life Membership Fund has assets of \$60,776.65 in Certificates of Deposits and a Savings Account.

**Necrology:** The report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 131 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest. Grand Prelate, Adam Jackson gave his report and a Eulogy. Larry W. Brown, KCT, PGC, ECDC gave the eulogy for Blair Christy Mayford, GCT, MEPGM who passed away on March 28, 2015. Steven J. Barton, KCT, PGC, PDC gave the eulogy for Charles Richard Neumann, GCT, MEHPGM who passed away on August 13, 2014 and for Rufus Frank Williams, KCT, PGC, HPDC who passed away on July 2, 2014. David M. Bertch, KCT, PGC gave the eulogy for Kenneth Eugene Gibson, KCT, PGC who passed away on April 21, 2015. Irvin L. Bitting, KCT, PGC gave the eulogy for Henry Edmond LaHurreau, KCT, PGC who passed away on February 19, 2015.

**R. Frank Williams Award:** Sir Knight R. Frank Williams, KCT, PGC, HPDC and GPE who died July 2, 2014 was instrumental in the National Holy Land Pilgrimage Program and traveled to the Holy Land for over 25 years. He was the spearhead in getting Indiana involved in this great work. This Indiana Award will be given to the Commandery that contributes the most money to the Holy Land fund each year. Whether you pay the full price of a minister to go to the Holy Land or just donate money to help send a minister, everything that is donated from your Commandery will count toward your Commandery's annual donation. The year will run from January 1 to December 31 of each year. Nominations of ministers to go to the Holy Land may be submitted to the Holy Land Committee, who will then select the minister to go based upon the funds available. Your Commandery may pay and

select a minister of your choice by paying the complete cost of the trip. The R. Frank Williams Award will be presented at the Grand Conclave the following year for the Commandery to display for the year. A plaque will be placed on the award with your Commandery's name and year in which the award was presented. It is the goal of the Grand Commandery of Indiana that we raise sufficient funds each year through the R. Frank Williams Award to send at least one minister to the Holy Land. I am asking that each Commandery in the State of Indiana set a goal to donate at least \$100.00 to the Holy Land fund each year. With that funding we would be able to send one minister to the Holy Land from the State of Indiana. The first award was presented to Raper Commandery No. 1 at the Grand Conclave.

**Education Foundation:** The Educational Foundation Committee will continue to award a \$5000.00 scholarship to Christian Theological Seminary (CTS). Therefore, it was decided that we would continue our relationship with Christian Theological Seminary (CTS) to supply a \$5000.00 scholarship for a student who is working on a master degree in divinity. CTS assumed the responsibility to research the needs of their best students and present to the committee a deserving student. The committee is looking forward to working with CTS again.

**Templar Crusader:** The official Conclave Program Book, "The Templar Crusader," was again successful and Richmond Commandery No. 8 received the traveling award for selling the most ads. We only had 14 Commanderies, 2 appendant bodies, the Indianapolis SOOB, Indiana State Association of High 12 and 2 individuals sell ads this year for a total of \$3117.00 for the Holy Land Pilgrimage fund.

**Elections:** The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies except for Apollo No. 19 were represented by at least one delegate. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

With this report being prepared several days ago, I will present a revised version of the report, which replaces what you are viewing. It will read as follows: The Grand Commandery of Indiana has completed its' 5-year assessment of \$5.00 per member, which was approved at the Grand Session in 2010. We want to thank the Constituent Commanderies for your support of the 5-year assessment. We will honor the promise made five years ago that the \$5.00 assessment will end. **Therefore, there will be no legislation put forth this year to continue the assessment another year.** The assessment has helped the permanent fund and general fund recover from low levels that occurred in previous years. We appreciate the work done by previous Finance Committee members who helped direct the finances into the direction taken 5 years ago so we have a more stable position today. The Trustees' report will show the progress made in the funds. Also in 2010, the finance committee recommended that the per capita increase by .50 cents for each year for five years and it was necessary that it be approved by the delegates in each of the succeeding 5 years at the Grand Conclave. This increase was to help offset the loss of income due to a drop of membership.

The budget for the 2015-16 year is found on page 23 of the Advance Proceedings. As you can see, the budget is balanced and able to sustain itself without a transfer from the permanent funds. With the Grand Commandery being on a more solid foundation financially, it is recommended that the 50 cent assessment not continue into the next year. It was also stated in the 2014-15 Advance Proceedings Finance Committee Report that there would be legislation dealing with Section 612. The proposed legislation is found on pages 25 and 26 of the Advance Proceedings. That recommended legislation is being withdrawn. Again we thank the Commandery membership in Indiana for your diligence in dealing with the finances of the Grand Commandery. We have made great progress and hope this financial condition will continue in the years ahead. Respectfully submitted, Paul W. Friend Motion passed.

# DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FOR SIR KNIGHTS

#### **Rules and Regulations**

An award to be known as the "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD" (for Sir Knights) was established by the Grand Commandery of Indiana on May 6, 1977 at the 123rd Annual Conclave. It is to be conferred upon members, who, by distinguished service to Templary are worthy of such an award. The recipients to be selected and the award to be presented as follows:

- 1. The recipient must be a member in good standing of a Commandery.
- 2. The Eminent Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General, will acting together, present the nomination for the award as suggested by members of their Commandery. The nomination shall be on forms to be provided by the Grand Recorder. Said nomination shall be forwarded to the Right Eminent Grand Commander no later than February 1st of each year for the preceding year. The Grand Commandery may appoint the Grand Recorder to assist him in the selection of recipients.
- 3. Those chosen to receive the award shall be made known by the Right Eminent Grand Commander at the Grand Commandery Conclave each year. The names of the nominees to receive the award shall be kept strictly confidential until announced by the Grand Commander.
- 4. The award shall be limited to two (2) members from each Commandery in Indiana each year starting with the year 1977.
- 5. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the recipient's Commandery, such presentation to be at a Stated or Called Conclave. It is strongly recommended that such presentation be open to the public, visitors and friends and is performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar uniforms.
- 6. The award shall consist of a jewel engraved with the words "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD, Grand Commandery of Indiana" In addition thereto an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.
- 7. The cost of the jewel, certificate and any additional engraving shall be borne by each Commandery presenting a nomination. Each Commandery will be billed for the cost by the Grand Recorder.

- 4. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the nominating Commandery, such presentation to be at a Called Conclave. Such presentation shall be open to the public, visitors and friends and be performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar Uniforms.
- 5. The award shall consist of a jewel with suitable fastener on back to be worn by a Lady or a lapel pin for a Gentleman. In addition, thereto, an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent. Grand Commander, attested to by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested to by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

### **Knights Templar Cross of Honor**

In accordance with the provisions of Section 237.5 of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, USA, a meritorious award known as the Knights Templar Cross of Honor may be conferred by the Grand Master upon a deserving Sir Knight (or Knights, depending on Grand Commandery membership counts) of each Grand Commandery once each year.

Each Constituent Commandery of Indiana is invited to submit a nomination for the award. #### "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR" RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) In accordance with the provisions of Section 237-1/2 of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, as amended at the 50th Triennial Conclave, the meritorious Award known as the **KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR**, shall be conferred by the Grand Master on behalf of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to deserving Sir Knights of Constituent and Subordinate Commanderies upon certain conditions hereinafter set forth.
- (2) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR shall be awarded "only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order, far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an officer or member." In deciding upon the award, precedents shall be entirely ignored and each case shall be decided upon its own unusual merits.

No posthumous award shall be made, and no present or past elected Grand Officer of a Grand Commandery shall be eligible for the award.

- (3) Only one nomination may be made from a Grand Commandery membership of 5,000 or less, plus one additional nomination may be made by a Grand Commandery for each additional 5,000 of its members, or major fraction thereof, during any one year. Only one nomination may be made from the total of the Subordinate Commanderies during one year.
- (4) The procedure to be followed for making nominations for this Award shall be as follows:
  - a. Any Constituent Commandery desiring to make a nomination shall first adopt a formal resolution, setting forth the full name of its nominee, and the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
  - b. The Commander of such Constituent Commandery shall thereupon cause to be filled-in a nomination form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of his Grand Commandery, giving the date, full name of the nominee, address, and Templar rank, name of his Commandery and a statement of the nature of the meritorious service upon.
  - c. Such Nomination Form shall be signed by the Commander of such Constituent Commandery and shall be forwarded by him to the Grand Commander of his jurisdiction for consideration.
  - d. Such Grand Commander shall consider nominations made Constituent Commanderies of his Grand Commandery upon Nomination Forms and shall select only one nominee (more where qualified) in anyone year; upon making such selection, the Grand Commander shall affix his written approval to such Nomination Form and shall thereupon send the name to the Grand Master.
  - e. Any Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination for this Award shall follow the same procedure as is set forth above for Constituent Commanderies, except that such Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination, shall forward the Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment, and the same shall bear the written approval of the Commander of such Subordinate Commandery before being sent by to the Grand Master.
- (5) The **KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR** medal shall consist of a round, gold-finished medal, the outer circle of which shall bear the words "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR," showing through in black enamel, and in the center shall appear the Patriarchal Cross of the Grand Encampment in purple enamel. Such medal shall be suspended from a gold-finished bar by two small chain links on either side; upon the face of the bar shall be engraved the name of the Sir Knight who shall be the recipient thereof. The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medal may be worn upon the uniform by the recipient upon all occasions.
- (6) A suitable Certificate of Award, issued by the Grand Encampment, signed by the Grand Master and the Grand Recorder, and bearing the seal of the Grand Encampment thereon, shall accompany the medal. The Certificate shall contain a summary of the Citation upon which such Award is based.
- (7) It shall the responsibility of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to provide the medals, the Certificates of Award for the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, without any cost to the recipient or to his Constituent or Grand Commandery, or his Subordinate Commandery. Presentation of the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medals, Certificates shall be made at an appropriate ceremony by Grand Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies, and a report thereof sent by the respective Recorder to the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment within thirty days thereafter.

## **Knights Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage**

**Our Mission:** To send Ordained Christian Ministers on a Biblical study and historical / cultural immersion experience who would not have the opportunity otherwise.

**PURPOSE**: To strengthen Christian ministry by providing an intensive travel and study program for full time, ordained ministers in the form of a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Our experience tells us how much the opportunity to 'walk where Jesus walked' can positively affect the preaching, teaching, and spirituality of Christian ministers. It is our plan to immerse the Pilgrim ministers in the land, the sights, the sounds, the history, and the cultures of the Holy Land, past and present.

The Committee on Holy Land Pilgrimage of the Grand Encampment organizes and supervises the planning and execution of the overall program and the pilgrimage travel groups each year. Travel is usually done during February and March. Pilgrimages are eleven days long with nine days in the Holy Land.

The cost per Pilgrim Minister varies from year to year and is announced in the spring by the Chairman of the Grand Encampment Committee on Holy Land Pilgrimage.

#### The fees cover:

- Round trip flights from New York to Tel Aviv and returning to New York
- Airline fuel surcharges and Airport Taxes

#### **GUIDELINES FOR SELECTION OF MINISTERS**

The following are the selection criteria used choosing ministers for the Knight Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage. Please consider these guidelines before inviting ministers to apply. Ministers who fall outside of these guidelines will rank lower in the process of selecting ministers from the pool of those nominated.

- Having <u>never traveled to Israel</u> before.
- Fully <u>Ordained ministers</u> (copy of Ordination Certificate or judicatory documentation must accompany the application). Youth coordinators, program directors, lay pastors, etc. rarely have ordination status.
- Serving in <u>full time</u> ministry, currently. This means that they are employed by the church full time and it is their primary source of income.
- Having served at least four years in full time ministry.
- Having <u>at least ten years of full time service</u> yet to go.
- Be of <u>good physical health</u> (if the idea of walking a brisk mile or more uphill, non-stop, with steps is a concern, this may not be the program from which this person would benefit).
- Willing to travel with an <u>ecumenical group</u> of other ministers from many denominations and religious groups, male and female.
- Willing to travel in a program sponsored by the <u>Knights Templar</u>, an appendant organization of <u>Freemasonry</u>.
- Willing to travel <u>without their spouse</u>. This is non-negotiable.
- Having the understanding that this is a <u>strenuous educational and spiritual</u> <u>study seminar / historical & cultural immersion experience</u> and not a vacation trip.

#### **Annual Inspection of Constituent Commanderies**

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 851 and 852 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of the Jurisdiction be inspected.

- 1. The Battalion Commander shall inspect each Commandery within the Battalion with the following exception:
  - The Grand Inspector General will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each elected Grand Officer, excluding the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder.
  - A fellow Grand Line Officer will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each appointed Grand Officer, if it is within the Battalion of the latter. Only the Grand Commander may authorize other exceptions or substitutions.
- 2. Each Inspecting Officer will send a "Notice of Inspection" courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder at least 30 days prior to the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, and Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and request the completion of specified reports. The Recorder shall provide the <u>completed</u> reports to the Inspecting Officers upon his arrival.
- 3. The records Inspection shall consist of:
  - A report on the membership efforts.
  - Examination of the books, records, and accounts.
  - Examination of the paraphernalia and property of the Commandery.
  - Examination of the Activity sheet.
- 4. No Inspection will be deemed complete until the Inspecting Officer has reviewed all books and financial records. If they are not presented at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the responsible Officer (Treasurer or Recorder) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within seven (7) days. Failure to comply may cause the Commandery to be placed upon probation until the obligation has been fulfilled.
- 5. Each Inspection will start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Inspecting Officer. The inspection process may be completed over two meetings, with one meeting for the Reception inspection and another meeting for the conferral of the Order. The full inspection may be done in one day, if desired. All inspections must be complete by the first Sunday in December 2015.

- 6. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the Reception and Order conferral. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to provide any needed assistance. If an actual candidate is present, the quality of the work is of prime importance.
- 7. An Inspection may consist of up to three (3) separate Commanderies participating together for an official inspection, when approved by the Battalion Commander. Points for the inspection will only be awarded when a participating Commandery has six (6) or more of its members present (subject to review by the Battalion Commander and the Grand Commander).
- 8. The participating Commanderies will open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form using the Ten Man or Twelve Man Opening in accordance with the most recent official interpretation of the Ritual and official Indiana Asylum Tactics. Fifty (50) points for a Closes Inspection and one-hundred (100) points for a public Reception will be added to the Activities Sheet for all participating Commanderies.
  - A Commandery of Knights Templar shall be opened in Full Form with Rehearsal of Duties then closed (If the Order being inspected is done at another time).
  - Upon completion of each inspection and prior to closing, the Inspecting Officers shall give his remarks first, and then the Grand Commander, if present, will follow with his remarks. Whenever he is not present, the Inspecting Officer, acting as the Grand Commander's official Representative, shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him, as such. If the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana is present he will speak after the Grand Commander; otherwise, the Grand Commander will be the final speaker.
  - Violating proper protocol as prescribed in Indiana Tactics General Regulations shall constitute a no score for your inspection and thus require an additional inspection scheduled by the Right Eminent Grand Commander.
  - The public may be invited into the Asylum while the Commandery:
    - The Commandery receives the Commander
    - The Commander receives Distinguished Guest
    - The sword manual is performed
    - The Commandery is inspected for uniform
    - The Triangle is formed
    - The United States Flag and lecture is given
- 9. The participating Commanderies will exemplify the Full Ceremonial of the Order being conferred. Commanderies may separately or jointly confer the Ceremonies in accordance with one of the following options at the time and place with the consent of the Battalion Commander. The inspection of the Order of the Red Cross, Order of Malta, or The Order of the Temple may occur anytime after May 3, 2015 and prior to the first Sunday in December 2015.
  - A single Commandery may perform one of the Orders for points as graded by the score sheet by the Battalion Commander and staff, if the majority of parts are filled by the inspected Commandery or Commanderies.
  - Same as above with the exception that up to three (3) Commanderies may participate with the same points being given to all the participating Commanderies. As long as they have at least six (6) Sr. Knights present at the work.

- An Instructional meeting may be held instead of any, or all, ritualistic work when the Inspecting Officer, with the concurrence of the Grand Inspector General, deems that change to be in the best interests of the Commandery.
- 10. The Inspecting Officer shall make his inspection report of each Commandery to the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Inspector General, the Deputy Grand Commander, Grand Recorder, as well as the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the inspected Commandery within fourteen (14) days following the completion of the inspection. A full report of the Inspections will be discussed at the winter meeting and present for publication and appropriate recognition at the Annual Conclave.
- 11. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the score of the opening and closing combined with that of the Order conferred (Activity scores excluded). All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose.
- 12. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each battalion on the activity score sheet will also be recognized by a ribbon that may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.

This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and be made a part of the minutes.

## **Special Dispensations**

**ITEM NO. 2** Dispensation is hereby granted to all Constituent Commanderies to move their Charter and to appear in uniform at any time to portray the Orders of Templary or to assist in any ceremonies at the Indiana Masonic Home.

**ITEM NO. 3** Constituent Recorders are hereby requested, prior to requesting a Dispensation for any purpose, to first ready the following Sections of the Constitution and Laws of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar 214, 215, 48(f)3, 177, 76, 145, and 48(f)1.

**ITEM NO. 4** Constituent Commanderies are strongly urged to recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag at the opening of each Stated and Called Conclave.

#### **Mentoring New Members and Junior Officers**

Maintaining interest in new Sir Knights and preparing Junior Officers for future leadership are important issues in the life of any Commandery. An active mentoring program can achieve these goals and the following program is directed for implementation and monitoring by each Commandery.

- Upon Knighting, each Sir Knight will have a mentor assigned whose responsibility it will be to cause the new Sir Knight to remain an active member by inviting him to all functions personally, helping him become involved in the Commandery to the extent the 5new Sir Knight is able, and answering all questions that he and his family pose.
- The mentor will also be responsible to provide a member packet to the new Sir Knight containing information about the Commandery and Templary. This may include a calendar, newsletter, Commandery history, philanthropies, and information on Conclaves, activities, and officers.
- Each new officer in the line will also be assigned a mentor, preferably a Past Commander or Dais
  Officer, to provide guidance and encouragement to the new officer and to instruct and answer
  questions he will have as he advances.
- The officer's mentor shall make certain that the new officer has the proper ritual, tactics, officer's handbook bylaws, and other information he needs to succeed. The mentor shall assist the new officer in preparing his uniform and equipment and assist him with proficiency in protocols and practices.

The Recorder will maintain a record of the assignment of mentors and include that information with his books for annual inspection. A suggested place for keeping this information is the membership book or log of the Commandery.

The Generalissimo will be assigned to administer and monitor the mentorship program and to oversee the development of new Sir Knights and officers. I have requested the Battalion Commanders and Deputies to assist you, the Generalissimo, in implementing the program.

### ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874. Knightstown No. 9 surrendered their charter on March 31, 2008 and merged with Greenfield No. 39.

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868, and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929, revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Muncie No.18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000. Charter was restored on October 24, 2006. Charter surrendered December 31, 2010.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990.

Plymouth No. 26 - Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974, and merged with South Bend No. 13.

Greensburg No. 59 – Chartered May 12, 1920. Charter surrendered December 1, 2001 and merged with Columbus No. 14.

Peru No. 60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash No. 37.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941.

Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62; At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but the only record of a name change is noted in the Conclave Bulletin No. 1. No other record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge No. 717.

The Committee on Dispensations & Charters presented a request to change the name of Oriental Commandery No. 62 (Currently called Trinity Commandery no. 62) to Prather Commandery No. 62 to document the name change properly. Vote taken and passed to officially make the name of the aforementioned Commandery to be henceforth called Prather Commandery No. 62. (Approved April 24, 2010).

Wright Commandery No. 64 Chartered April 29, 1988. Dispensation granted on April 29, 2005, to move their Charter to Eckerty Lodge No. 719, Eckerty, Indiana 47116 on a permanent basis. (May 1, 2006). Dispensation was granted to Wright Commandery No. 64 to move its Charter to Dubois Lodge No. 520 at Huntingburg, Indiana, for the Stated Conclave on September 16, 2009. At that time, the Commandery will be voting to permanently move the Charter to Dubois Lodge, subject to approval at Grand Conclave 2010. (Approved April 24, 2010)

H. W. Matthewson Commandery No. 66 Chartered April 30, 1993. Charter surrendered December 12, 2012 and merged with Lafayette Commandery No. 3 in Lafayette, Indiana. (Approved April 25, 2014)

Lawrence Commandery No. 67 Chartered April 29, 1994. Charter moved to Millersville Lodge September 21, 2002. Name changed to H. E. Lackey Commandery No. 67 on April 23, 2003.

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. - Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, too open Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued February 12, 2001 to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 23, 2003.
