SIR KNIGHT DUANE LEE VAUGHT, GCT, PGC (IN) Most Eminent Grand Master

Duane Lee Vaught was born in 1956 in Crawfordsville, Indiana, the first of three sons of Lloyd E Vaught and Maxine Vaught.

He was baptized and confirmed as a member of the Methodist Church. In 2000, he married Georgia Jean Nagai Goode. Sir Knight Vaught has two brothers, both residing in Indiana. Georgia has a sister, living in Atlanta, Georgia.

Duane Vaught began his professional career with a national accounting firm in its Indianapolis office, during which time he passed the CPA exam and was licensed as a Certified Public Accountant. He subsequently moved to a local accounting firm in Bloomington Indiana. He advanced in that firm to the level of partner. In 1995, he joined the firm of Stampfli Associates CPAs as Vice-President. In 2008, he became President of that firm. Although he works with individuals and many kinds of businesses, not-for-profit entities are one of his primary specialties. He served as president of his chapter of Kiwanis, is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, its Not-For-Profit practice section, Indiana State CPA Society and the Bloomington Chapter of the Institute of Management Accountants, in which last organization he served several years as Vice-president for Professional Education. Duane Vaught began his Masonic career in 1971 when he was initiated into Montgomery Chapter of the Order of DeMolay. In DeMolay, he served as Master Councilor of his Chapter, Illustrious Knight Commander of DeMolay Order of Knighthood in Indiana and two years as an appointed officer of the DeMolay State Council. He has received the DeMolay honors of Representative DeMolay, Chevalier, and Legion of Honor (Active)

Sir Knight Vaught was initiated, passed and raised a Master Mason in 1977, in his hometown of Crawfordsville, Indian. He served as Worshipful Master of Spencer Lodge No. 95 in 1993 during which year the lodge received the Grand Master's Award with Distinction. He has also served as Worshipful Master of Dwight L. Smith Lodge of Research.

From May 2002 through May 2008 he served as an officer of the Grand Lodge F&AM of Indiana, the last year of that period as Most Worshipful Grand Master. He is also the Grand Representative of the Grand Lodge of New York near Indiana. In 2008, he was elected to a three-year term as trustee. For five years, he also served on the Board of Directors of the Indiana Masonic Home. Vaught received the degrees of Royal Arch Masonry, Cryptic Masonry and the Orders of Chivalric Masonry on October 22, 1977 in a festival, held in Muncie, in honor of then presiding Most Eminent Grand Master, Willard M. Avery. He Served as High Priest of Crawfordsville Chapter No. 40 and Illustrious Master of Montgomery Council No. 34 in 1983.

Sir Knight Vaught served as Eminent Commander of Crawfordsville Commandery No. 25 in 1981 and 1982 and has received the Distinguished Service Award, Knight Commander of the Temple, and Knight Grand Cross of the Temple awards. He is Grand Representative of the Grand Commandery of Illinois near Indiana and holds memberships in Bloomington Commandery No. 63 and St Anselm Commandery UD in Indiana. He also holds memberships in Commanderies in Ohio and Colorado. He holds honorary memberships in several other Grand Commanderies. He served ten years as an officer of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana culminating in serving as the 140th Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana in 2001 - 2002. Sir Knight Vaught is a Past Sovereign of St. Basil Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine. Past Governor of Banks of the Wabash York Rite College No. 72 and has received the Gold Honor Award and Order of

the Purple Cross. He is a Past Excellent Chief of Indiana Council No. 15, Knight Masons and Past Director General of Indianapolis Preceptory, Yeomen of York. In the Allied Masonic Degrees, he is a Past Sovereign Master of St. Bernard de Clairvaux Council 256. He is a Knight Commander of the Red Branch of Eri and served over ten years as Secretary of his council.

Vaught is a Past Preceptor of St Andrew Tabernacle XXXV Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests and an officer of the Grand College. He is and officer of the Grand College of Rites. He is a member, IX degree, Knight Grand Cross of Indiana College, Masonic Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis, MSCRIF, and serves as Treasurer General of the High Council, MSRICF of the United States.

He is a member of J. Herbert Nichols and Robert A. Woods Priories of KYCH, Terre Haute Valley, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite NMJ, Royal Order of Scotland, Murat Shrine AAONMS, Sahara Grotto MOVPER, Grand College of Rites, Order of Knights Preceptor, Indiana Past Commanders Association, Goose and Tater, and Royal Order of Zanzibar. In 2005, he was crowned a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33 Degree. He is a Grand Cross of the Royal Society of Knights Occidental and an Honorary Kentucky Colonel.

Sir Knight Vaught was appointed Right Eminent Grand Captain General, Grand Encampment, and Knights Templar on August 29, 2007 by Sir Knight William Koon II, Grand Master and was elected to remain in the office of Grand Captain General of the Grand Encampment at the 64th Triennial Conclave, August 2009, in Roanoke Virginia. He was advanced to Right Eminent Grand Generalissimo on November 22, 2010 following the Death of Sid C. Doris III, elected Deputy Grand Master in Alexandria VA. in August 2012 and elected Grand Master of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar in August 2015 in Buffalo NY.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments the organization carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses on investment are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statement of activities.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) Restricted and Unrestricted Revenue Contributions received are recorded as increases in unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.
- (h) The Organization has evaluated subsequent events through July 5, 2016, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

After graduating from Classical High School, he enrolled at the Polly technical University of Belgrade, from which he was expelled (after two years) for refusing to join the Communist Party. In 1952, after living for seven years under Communist rule. He managed to escape across "Iron Curtain" (so called at the time) to Greece and received political asylum. In 1956, he married Evangelia M. Argiriadis, moved to U.S. and lived in Indiana, first in East Chicago then in Highland. They were members of St. Demetrios Greek Orthodox Church of Hammond for many years.

where he served on Church Board and in other various capacities, while she actively participated in Church's "Ladies Society" in top and other capacities. S.K Pete and Lee had two daughters: Helen, departed and Diana living in Boca Raton, Florida. S. K. Zivanovich worked for Inland Steel Co, as Manufacturing Technical Specialist for 34 years, until his retirement in 1990.

S. K. Zivanovich was raised a Master Mason May 4, 1978, in Indiana Harbor Lodge, F.&A.M. No. 686, in Highland, Indiana and served as Worshipful Master in 1985. He was exalted a Royal Arch Mason in East Chicago Chapter No. 141, March 7, 1981. and became High Priest in 1986, he is also appointed Representative of Gr. Royal Arch Chapter of Florida to the Gr. Chapter of Indiana. He was greeted as a Cryptic Mason in East Chicago Council No. 101, in 1981, of which he became Illustrious Master in 1987, and honored by being made the "Illustrious Master of the year 1988," in group 1. He was created a Knight Templar of East Chicago Commandery No. 58 in 1981, and an Eminent Commander of same in 1988. He received Distinguished Service Award in 1989, and was commissioned Gr. Representative of Georgia near Gr. Commandery of Indiana. He was a member of Past Commanders Association of Indiana, and in 1989-90 a Knight Commander its presiding Officer, S. K. Zivanovich is an honorary member of the Grand Commandery of Illinois and the Grand Commandery of K. T. of Kentucky. He was elected Executive Secretary (1986-1990) of the York Rite Association Group 1. Member of Tall Cedars of Lebanon. Member of Inland Steel Square Club, and later Vice President. He became a Companion Knight of Northwest Indiana York Rite College No. 73 in 1984, Secretary from 1990 to 1992, and received Order of Purple Cross in 1992. He was dubbed a Knight of York Cross of Honor in Indiana Prior; No. 8 KYC.H. in May 1989, also became a Charter Member of J. Herbert Nichols Priory No. 76 KYCH, in Jan. 1992.

S. K. Zivanovich was initiated Oct. 19, 1978 into Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite Valley of South Bend, and participated in 29th degree and was a "Hospitalcr" in his home town. He was also a member of Orak Shrine-A.A.O.N.M.S. in Michigan City, from May 1987, member of Past Masters and Charter Member of KYCH, Unit.

The Grand Lodge of F.&A.M. of Indiana appointed him a member of Foreign Fraternal Relations Committee where he served until his death. He was a member of the Allied Masonic Degrees, and a Charter Member of Yeomen of York.

S. K. Zivanovich was appointed by P.G.C. Paul Friend a Gr. Warder in 1988. Later, due to untimely death of S. K. James C. Bunell, he was appointed by P.G.C. John Stevens to the position of Grand Junior Warden. After another tragic death of S. K. Jerry Warman, he was appointed to the Gr. Senior Warden's Office. In 1990, he was elected Gr. Captain General, and advanced through Grand Commandery Line to be elected Right Eminent Grand Commander of Knights Templar of State of Indiana on April 30th, 1993 in Indianapolis.

Sir Knight Ned E. Dull was born on October 18, 1923, in Ohio City, Ohio. He attended the public schools in Ohio City, the Ohio State University and The Citadel, Charleston, South Carolina. He was a lumber dealer in Van Wert, Ohio. He was preceded in death by his wife, Margaret. They had four daughters.

Civic activities included membership in the Chamber of Commerce, Industrial Development Corporation, Rotary Club, Elks, American Legion, V.F.W., Ohio and National Retail Lumber, Dealers Association. He was a Trustee and member of the First United Methodist Church of Van Wert.

During World War II, he served four years in the U.S. Army, including two years overseas in the European Theater with the 10th Infantry Division.

Masonically, Sir Knight Dull was Raised in Van Wert Lodge No. 218 and was a Past Presiding Officer of the York Rite Bodies of Van Wert. He served as Drill

Captain of the Drill Team of Ivanhoe Commandery No. 54, when they won National Championships at the 1961, 1964,1957, and 1976 Triennial Conclaves, and was a member of the Grand Encampment Committee on Drill Regulations. He was a member of Ohio Priory No. 18, Knights of the York Cross of Honor; Zenobia Temple, AAONMS; and the Royal Order of Scotland. He was a Past Sovereign of Holy Grail Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine, and a Past Grand Sovereign of the United Grand Imperial Council, R.C.C. Also, Past Sovereign Master, Buckeye Council No. 92, Allied Masonic Degrees; Past Preceptor, Prince of Peace Tabernacle No. X, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests; and Past Grand Preceptor, Grand College of America; member of Buckeye Council No. 64, Knight Masons of Ireland; Dayton Chapter No. 67, National Sojourner; Holy Order of Knights Beneficent of the Holy City (CBCS); and the Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis. Sir Knight Dull was an active member of the International Supreme Council, Order of DeMolay, and was a recipient of the Honorary DeMolay Legion of Honor. He was Coronated a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33°, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction in 1970.

Sir Knight Dull was elected Grand Captain General, September 2, 1976, in Kansas City, Missouri, and served in that capacity until November 30, 1977, when he was advanced to the office of Right Eminent Grand Generalissimo upon the death of Past Deputy Grand Master John B. Cottrell, Jr. Elected Deputy Grand Master on August 15, 1979, at Indianapolis, Indiana, and 47th Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the U.S.A. at the 55th Triennial Conclave of the Grand Encampment August 19, 1982, in Hot Springs National Park, Arkansas. He became a Most Eminent Past Grand Master at the 56th Triennial Conclave in Cincinnati, Ohio, in August 1985.

Sir Knight Dull laid down his sword and entered the Supreme Asylum above on Wednesday, January 11,2017:

As there is no known "instant fix" to this dire problem, we can only continue to try what has worked in the past, along with new and fresh ideas as we have them. Only time, our combined and determined efforts, and the providence of our ultimate Commander, Jesus Christ will give evidence to their effectiveness!

Report submitted to the 2016 Winter Meeting:

It is a sad fact that since 1969, almost half of a Century now, our numbers have been steadily decreasing despite our best efforts.

While numerous programs and various attempts at advertising and marketing have had limited success, the trend in our Membership problem has not changed. This continued downward spiral, if unchecked, will lead to dire impacts upon Templary in Indiana.

All the previous attempts at incentivizing our members to bring fellow Masons into the Commandery have been, and continue to be of benefit. These programs, such as the Grand Commandery Membership Cord Program, the Grand Encampment Membership Program, the Member Get a Member program among many others are helpful and should most assuredly continue to be implemented. The only problem with these efforts is that too many of our SK's are not motivated to go out to their Blue Lodges and recruit new Sir Knights.

While the growing use of Social Media and other forms of electronic communication promise good, if not spectacular results, as of now it is still only an unrealized promise. We still, and always shall be dependent upon the individual Commandries and their SK's for our new members. New members will not join, nor stay without the continued efforts at recruitment, encouragement, and support of existing members.

The Officers of each Commandery should be taking a greater part in not only seeing to it that their SK's are actively recruiting their own individual Blue Lodges, but insuring that each conclave is friendly, inclusive, and instructional. All too often new members are bored and disappointed with the "read the correspondence, vote on petitions, pay the bills, and go home" meetings, leading to their no longer attending. Unfortunately, this also applies to current members and past Officers as well. We need to ensure that our SK's are engaged and enthusiastic, as this will incite them to want to share the experience with their fellow Masons.

Currently, membership recruitment and retention is all too often seen as an additional burden upon our SK's already full plates, and not as the enjoyable and rewarding gift to our Brothers that it should be.

It is true that there is no higher or exalted degree than that of being a Master Mason, yet it is also true that with each additional degree we become more enlightened and knowledgeable in the sublime teachings of Masonry. Knight Templary, with its Orders, regalia, and élan since its foundation, has traditionally been seen as an elite goal to obtain. This pride in our organization has lessened to an alarming degree, and as a result we have moved into the shadows, out of view to the public at large. This must change if we are to see the numbers we once took for granted.

Everyone wants to be noteworthy, a part of something special, remembered! Not everyone can be an Airborne Ranger, a Search and Rescue Paramedic, the CEO of a billion-dollar industry, or an Astronaut.

And yet, each of those have aspired to be a Knight Templar. We, of right, are and should be proud of our Fraternity! Our Fathers, Grandfathers, and their Fathers were all very proud of their inclusion in this noble Order! We need to instill that very same pride in our members now. This above almost everything else, will push our numbers in the right direction because people naturally want to belong to what they perceive as the pinnacle of any endeavor. It is true that we are no greater than any other Master Mason, but it is also true that we are the Defenders of the Christian Faith and as such are unique and elite among Masons in that respect.

If we build ourselves into what we once were, we will bring in others, as bees to flowers!

Inactive Participation Committee

To: SK Donald D. Olvey - Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers of the Grand Commandery, Past Grand Commanders, Officers and Sir Knights:

As reported by the Membership Committee, our numbers have been in a state of decline for nearly half a century. What those numbers do not show is the appalling number of members who, while continuing to pay their dues, are no longer active participants in our Fraternity.

It is an expected fact that our members will at times be unable to attend a stated, let alone a called conclave for any numbers of reasons. Some who have joined will no longer be able to continue their active participation, while still wishing to continue aiding the financial health of their Commandery. This also was, and is, a known outcome of any group.

The problem we are faced with is the member who joined in good faith, with every expectation of being an active and enthusiastic participant, only to become inactive and a member on paper only.

We must strive to determine on an individual basis, why each inactive member is such, and what we can do to resolve the reasons, if possible. Our inactive members will have their own personal reasons for their non-participation, and they must never be ridiculed, dismissed, or belittled in any way! We must, with the utmost effort, strive to find a way to resolve all issues that we can to bring the member back to an active and enthusiastic level.

However, unless and until we contact the members on an individual basis, we shall never know of and thus be unable to overcome any obstacles in his way. Therefore, it is recommended that the Commander,

Officers, and Past Commanders of each Commandery in the state contact at least one inactive member of their Commandery and determine why they are such.

Additionally, the Commander and Officers must insure that their stated conclaves are instructive, interesting, and enjoyable to the SK's at each conclave to keep the SK's engaged. A member who is engaged will often find a way to attend, even when presented with personal or professional obstacles.

One potential difficulty is the SK's family. All Commandries must find ways to include the family in the area activities, and not just preparing meals or cleaning up. The term "Masonic Widow" referring to the wife of a SK who is never home due to his fraternal zeal is an indication of the potential loss of that SK. As the old saying goes, "When Momma ain't happy, ain't nobody happy!". We must remember that these women married their man to be a part of his life. We must include her when we can.

There will always be work conflicts, unless the SK is independently wealthy or retired. Shift scheduling can often be an insurmountable problem to stated conclaves, but there are other ways in which to keep individual SK's included, other than the monthly meeting.

Most problems faced by our inactive members can be overcome with a minimum of effort, be it transportation, finances, boredom, lack of regalia, physical impairment, or even misinformation received from family and friends, or published, broadcast, and social media about our fraternity.

However, all of this remains pure speculation until each SK is personally contacted and the reason(s) for his change in attendance is determined. After that, we can begin to work on how to bring him back into the fold.

If each Officer, past and current, of each Commandery reaches out to at least one of their inactive members, it should result in a significant increase in attendance.

Long-Range Planning

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers of the Grand Commandery, Past Grand Commanders, Officers and Sir Knights all,

This is the Annual Report from the "Long-Range Planning Committee":

We as a committee have reviewed the current long-range plan and have agreed that most of the goals that have been set in the plan should not be change, but we recommend the following be added to the plan: As many of you may know the Grand Chapter, Grand Council and Grand Commandery of Indiana, jointly conducted a survey of our newer membership. This survey was aimed at the those who have been in the York Rite for seven (7) years or less. This was conducted to see what our newer members expected from the York Rite and what they have received. We sent out 300 surveys of which 62 were returned. This is a return rate of approximately 21%, a very good result. There were some interesting answers to the questions and general comments from the membership.

From the results of the survey we have learned following: See Appendix A

1. Education:

1. 58% of our membership are telling us that they would like to see more education presented both in the form of historical, esoteric or philosophical points of view as well as the symbolism of the Orders. For that purpose, we are proposing that a "Commandery of Research" be formed and operated in the much the

manner that the "Dwight L. Smith, Lodge of Research" operates for the Grand Lodge. To this end we can provide the Sir Knights of Indiana, with the means for research and to publish their papers for the education of the Sir Knights of Indiana. We would like to see this project researched and if found feasible instituted within the next three (3) years.

- 2. Develop a list of books, magazine articles and web sites, that can be used to supply credible information
- 3. Develop a bound book (monitor) for the newly made Sir Knight to begin his education. This monitor could include, but not limited to:
 - a. Brief history of Knights Templar
 - b. The history of modern Knight Templary from the forming of the Grand Encampment to the forming of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

2. Communications:

42% feel that communications within their local York Rite Bodies is not adequate.

47% feel that communications with the Grand Bodies is not adequate.

Much of this problem we believe is generational. We the older members, need to learn and embrace the new ways communicate to our younger membership. This could include emails, a Web page, Facebook page and texting to name a few.

To that end, we propose the following:

- 1. Encourage every Commandery in the State to create their own Web page and a Facebook page to share and post information for meetings reminders, upcoming work and other announcements.
 - a. Put a member who is knowable, in charge for the updating of the communications for the Web/Facebook site
 - b. If necessary, use multiple methods of communication to meet the needs all members, i.e.
 - i. Phone Calls
 - ii. Traditional Mailing
 - iii. Emails
 - iv. Texting
- 2. Work with the other Grand Bodies to make a joint "Facebook" page
- 3. Work with the other Grand Bodies to make a joint "York Rite" web page
- 3. Communications Public Relations within the Grand Commandery:

Among the complaints (66%) was the lack of information on the "Programs for the Grand Bodies", to that end we recommend the following:

- 1. That the Public Relations Committee publish a list of all programs that the Sir Knights of Indiana can participate in and information about:
 - a. ITA Schools
 - b. Ritual Award Program
 - c. Leadership Development program sponsored by the Grand Encampment
 - d. Membership/Lanyard Program
 - e. Drill Teams/Pass and Review
- 2. The philanthropic work that we support:
 - a. Eye Foundation
 - b. Holy Land Pilgrimage
- 4. Leadership Training:

It is the opinion of your committee that there is a need for Leadership Training

- 1 Encourage those who can, to attend the "Leadership Development Training" sponsored by the Grand Encampment at the Department Meetings
- 2 Sponsor the same program in the summer months for those who cannot get time off for the Department Meeting (Planned for this coming summer)
- 3 Develop a "Correspondence Leadership Program" web based (goal of 3-5 years)
- 4 Develop an Annual ITA with a rotating curriculum
 - o Leadership
 - Tactics (all three orders)
 - Marching and Drills

5. Uniforms:

The high cost of Uniforms came up as a common complaint.

- 1. Try to find a way to lower cost. (Goal of 3 years)
 - a. Consider forming a "Provost Office" to purchase uniforms in bulk
 - b. Purchase uniform coats from Navy Surplus?

Consistent & up to date information of activities are not effectively communicated, so how am I to know what is going on?

I am not involved as much as I like to be, due to work and family.

I have been going to York Rite meets for two years now and have yet to have sit in on one official meeting. There have never been enough members show-up to open lodge. This is very discouraging.

The limited participation of current members, we do little outside of stated meetings, which causes little interest in the Rite.

To be perfectly honest I and a few others feel like asking for a demit rather than invest more time for lack of education/light or any effort from our leaders.

We need men who can teach to new members who are desirous of in-depth of the Rites. Not just paying dues and showing up at 1 or 2 meetings. The sadness is many of our longtime members do not know it. So, they are unable to teach. Some do not what to admit that they don't know. Small Chapter and Council struggle to get enough to show up to even open and Commandery are sometimes far apart in rural areas so this adds to the problem. I do not know where the answer may lay but for those who are seeking it become frustrating.

I enjoy everything about my local York Rite, enjoy visiting other York Rite Bodies. At the local level are all "one" York Rite Body. I do not like petty bickering and politics of the Grand Bodies. The Grand Bodies may be separate, but they <u>need</u> to understand, at a local level we are "one".

Life has taken over. I wish' could do more. More family problems.

Status of Lanyard Cord Program

To: Officers and Members of Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana

This report of the lanyard cord program has been prepared for the Grand Commandery session in April 2017 from information compiled and might include some late 2016's with a cut-off date of 12/25/16 to prepare the winter session distribution report. We now access the Grand Encampment database, MMS, and any information from our Grand Recorder. I have been completely thru the lanyard cord records we have on file, have deleted the deaths as reported on MMS. The report below gives all the current active TLS's for the lanyard cord program. I have revised the report to reflect totals from the end of December 2016 distribution at this Annual Conclave and will bring the lanyard cord program further up to date. This distribution covers TLS's since the 25th of December 2016 forward up thru April 15, 2017 as a cut-off date for the Annual Conclave. REMARKS BY SIR KNIGHT LOREN A. WINN, KCT EAST CENTRAL DEPARTMENT COMMANDER, OF THE GRAND ENCAMPMENT, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND PAST GRAND COMMANDER OF MICHIGAN

Distinguished East, Sir Knights, is everybody awake out there? I promise you my remarks will be brief. I am always impressed at how cooperative the different Grand Commanderies are in my Department. We all work together very well. And it's very interesting how the opportunities that we have and I don't like to say problems, but opportunities that we have are very similar in each of the Grand Commanderies. It's most impressive this survey that we came up with. How many have had a chance to look at the survey? Very few. I suggest that before any of you leave this Grand Session that you do look at that survey. It's quite impressive. I could have looked at the survey and if it didn't have Indiana written on it, it would look the same for Michigan. It would probably look the same for Ohio, Illinois, and Kentucky. So, look at the report there, the survey. Look at the comments especially. I think that if you do take them serious and try to address what the survey came up with, it will help your commanderies. It'll help Grand Commandery. It'll help the Grand Encampment. So, please do read that. Give it the attention that it does deserve. These comments, especially from the younger members are important. It's a different generation that we're dealing with. They don't communicate like we do. And it's very apparent in their comments in there. So please do read that. One of the things that stands out is the communication problem. They don't communicate like we do like I say and it's in that survey. And you can't leave it to your recorders to do all the communication in your commanderies. Every one of us has to work towards that and learn new things and help out the new members that came in. Also, in your report here, what's also interesting and it's the same in each of the grand commanderies that I work with, you've had 124 knightings. You had 120 deaths. What's alarming is that you had, and this isn't just Indiana that has this situation, every single Grand Commandery is having the same situation, 356 demits or suspensions, 356. I can guarantee Ohio had more than that, a bigger commandery, bigger grand commandery. Michigan probably had, well, Michigan did have less but they're only 2/3 the size of Indiana. So, these are the things that we really have to look at and take seriously. Why are we having so many demits? Why are we having so many suspensions? And every one of us is thinking, well it was up to the recorder to follow up on that. It can't be left up to the recorders. They have too much to do already. Every one of us should be concerned if you have a suspension. What was the reasons? Every one of us should definitely be concerned if a demit, why is there a demit? And some of the comments in here was well, I'm thinking of demitting because I can't afford the uniform. Well, we can address those things. I have to take a demit because I, my family is growing up. The younger people in my family, I have to take care of them and so forth. Well, those are things that we can address and we can work with. But if we're not communicating with those members and we're losing them because of that lack of communication which the survey points out and we're all aware that this is probably happening, we didn't necessarily have to have a survey to do that. We kind of knew in the back of our minds that this is going on but those are the things that we need to work with. So, please read it. I'd also like to invite you to our next conference, which will be March 10 in your own backyard again, up there in Fort Wayne. I'd like to, I challenged you two years ago because I held it in Fort Wayne to at

and we give excellent leadership courses. So, some of these newer members, bring them in, get them into the leadership course, talk to your new grand commander, say I've got these names for you and I'd like to see them invited. The classes right now are like 30 in the first one and this last time we had actually around 30 for the second one, which was surprising but we can expand those classes if we need to accommodate our new leaders because that's where our future is, is in the leadership of the York Rite, not just Commandery, but the York Rite. And these new leaders that come out of the first course and they can't wait to get into the second course. We've actually, there's one conference that follows ours, it's here, and it's not unusual for them to do the first level and then want to go down to the southeast conference and take the next level. We had a couple do that this last time. So, need new leaders, that's where our future is. Get those names in, invitations will be sent to them and it's very convenient for Indiana. The reason I choose to do it in Fort Wayne is because if you take our entire Department and you find the dead center, that does happen to be Fort Wayne, especially if you're traveling all the way from southern Kentucky or the Upper Peninsula, it's about the same distance. So, there's no reason everybody has to travel about the same distance. But let's have a lot of Indiana people because I love coming to Indiana. It's just one of the friendlier places to visit and my lady and I really enjoy making the short travel, it's only 6 hours down here so it's not too bad. Anyhow, those are my remarks. If you have any questions or you have concerns at any time, don't hesitate to talk to me, call me and just like these younger generations, I like emails because then I have record when someone asks a question and I can respond to it. So, if you ever need to contact me, the best way is by email.

MOST EMINENT GRAND MASTER,

PAST GRAND COMMANDER OF INDIANA AND
PAST GRAND MASTER OF THE GRAND LODGE ON INDIANA

Thank you to my Department Commander, Loren. Fort Wayne is the geographic center. You must be counting the UP in that calculation. I'd like to touch briefly this afternoon on a number of things that we have going on in Grand Encampment. And there's a reason for that. But to begin with, let me just tick off some of the things that we're doing in the Grand Encampment to try to make this a better organization. Now, we've had a report on the Eye Foundation today. Eye Foundation continues with a really outstanding operation. We've continued the starter grants. Starter grants are these grants that we give to brand new PhD's and MD's who, mainly PhD's, who do not yet have enough data, do not yet have enough reputation to be able to obtain grants on their own. We can step in with a single year, occasionally a second year, grant to these people and that jump starts their career. John Penn, who is the chairman of our scientific advisory committee, was himself a starter grant recipient from us in '86. On average, when a person in that field gets their very first federal grant, their very first federal grant, which means man you are, you've made it, you are on the path, on average that's 42 ½ years old. John Penn was 31 when he got a grant from us. No, no, I'm sorry. He was 31 when he got his first federal grant which was immediately after our grant. We got his career going 10 years faster than if he had to slog

through the mud trying to get noticed and we are giving out 25, 30 of those a year. This is a huge impact. We've expanded the program. This will be the third year. Next week, I'm in Baltimore, next weekend, a conference known as ARVO, Association for Research in Vision and Ophthalmology. We've taken what would have been a single starter grant of \$65,000 and for that, we can give money to ARVO and they provide travel grants so that people who are working on their PhD, we're catching them even younger now, people who are working on their PhD or still in medical school can travel to this conference, meet other researchers and learn from it. Now, this is a real cool thing for people in that career. And we send 59, 60 people for \$65,000, we're not giving these people very much. They're only getting a little over a thousand dollars each. How many of you can remember when you were so new in your career that a thousand dollars was a fortune? Yeah. That's where these people are. Five years from now, they're going to be making six figures. Today, they're worrying about how to pay for dinner. And you're responsible for their being there. We're not the only people who do the ARVO grants. I was there at the conference last year and I had a picture taken of myself in front of the high donor board thanking the highest donors to the program and there is it, Knight Templar Eye Foundation. We weren't the only name. There was also MERCK and Pfizer and Genentech, there was about five names all together. What do you think, are we keeping pretty good company? This year, we're expanding the ARVO grants. We're still going to do ARVO, but we're going to also provide travel grants to another conference similar but a little different slant called EYECert? We've got a lot of other things going on in Eye Foundation. End of last month, I was at Duke University. They did the inaugural meeting of a new conference. They plan to meet every other year. They asked me to come down. The course was advances in pediatric retina. Okay, that's a little specialized. I'm told that there's about 300 people in the world that specialize in that. 140 of them were at the conference. I was asked to come down because the keynote lecture was being given by a distinguished gentleman and they were calling it the Knight Templar key note address. And yes, we did kick in a little bit of money to help them. We kicked in a whopping \$1,500. Okay, I guess we paid for his plane ticket and maybe his hotel room. Naming opportunities, they could've come to us and asked us for \$10,000 or \$5,000 or some big number. They asked for a trivial \$1,500. What does that tell you? It tells you they were more interested in getting our name on their program than they were about the money. What kind of reputation to you suppose the Eye Foundation that that's how they feel about us? Makes you feel good, doesn't it? The, incidentally, the faculty for that conference. There were 40 speakers at that conference. I sent a copy of the program back to the Eye Foundation and had them run the names through our system. 10 of those 40 got their very first grant from us, a quarter of them. Last weekend, or no, heck last Monday and Tuesday I was at Vanderbilt. Again, Eye Foundation, they were, they have a new lab down there for the benefit of one of their top researchers, John Penn, who I've mentioned is the Chairman of our Scientific Advisory Committee. They wanted me to come down for that. I had dinner at the home of the chairman of the department who got his very first grant in 1986 from the Knight Templar Eye Foundation. The top people in this profession are getting more and more to be there because we gave them a head start. Think on that. We're doing some other stuff. Another last item I'll mention for the eye foundation is that we have brand new, a new jewel because who can pass up having a new jewel called the Crusader's Cross. You'll see it, it's in the, I believe it's in the May one issue of the magazine that began hitting mailboxes late last week. There are a few people in the room that are wearing them now as am I. This is for the large donors to the Eye Foundation. Just because we appreciate those donors and we wanted something visible that they can wear to show their pride in supporting our project. The plaques are nice, but there's only so many of those you can wear at a time. We have other charities of course. We heard a report

earlier today on the educational foundation and that the rules had been changed so that grand commanderies that so desire can, there's certain changes in the programs but the grand commanderies that so desire can send the money that they're managing, investing, back to the Grand Encampment, we'll pool it, and by having a larger pool of money, presumably be able to do a much better job of investing. Now, it's not terrible here in Indiana with a couple of hundred thousand. But if you think about some of those states, small states out west, younger, that which also happen to be younger grand commanderies, maybe they've only gotten or \$20,000 in their fund. It's hard to invest 10 or \$20,000 in a meaningful, isn't it? Don't we wish we could get more than 1/10 of a percent on our savings accounts? So, this is an option, so as was mentioned in that report, Grand Encampment is not interested in taking over the program decisions. Those are best made at the state level. States will be told how much money they've got in the pot, their share of the earnings that they can spend. Local grand commanderies will have to figure out again, who to award scholarships to. We're doing things with the Holy Land Pilgrimage also. The program we're running now is excellent. You've heard of it many times. But it occurred to me a year ago that that's only the United States. Now, our grand commanderies in Europe could participate. It would be way cheaper for them because they don't have has much travel costs. So, I want the program expanded to allow the grand commanderies of Europe to participate on that also. There'll be some slight differences for them. They will not have to meet up with the group at JFK airport in New York. I think they could probably meet in Tel Aviv. We're going to require that they be fluent in English so that we don't have to deal with multiple languages. But we're going to introduce that and see what kind of benefit that can produce. For our youth groups, we've introduced a new award, a broad sword, similar to the sword of merit that is given out to very, very high donors in the eye foundation. It is my intent that any grand commandery that so desires can purchase one of these swords from us. We've bought 100 of them in bulk so we got the price way, way down. So, the Grand Commandery can buy the sword, get with the executive officer of DeMolay in your jurisdiction. Work with them, develop a set of criteria for what chapter might be worthy of an award. Is it the chapter that has the highest new membership, is it the chapter that scores highest in some competition, is it the chapter that has the best programs? Is it the chapter that has the best overall rounded program with points kind of like our activity awards? States differ. So, you can work with the DeMolay of Indiana, figure out what works best for you, create the criteria. Grand Commandery officers show up at the DeMolay conclave to present the award, come back a year later to receive it from the prior winner and award it to the next winner. It's an easy program for you, an easy opportunity to get in front of DeMolay, an easy opportunity to reward the DeMolays for their enthusiasm and participation. As I said, I don't have a final price on those swords. We're waiting to hear what the shipping cost will be. But I'm looking at something right around \$300, maybe a smidgen more, that's a technical term, right? But it's going to be about \$300. So, really very economical. We also talked about Masonic membership solutions. A lot been done with that software to develop it. One of the more recent developments is that it now tracks top line signers. That's a big boost to places like Indiana that want to be able to pull that data, to recognize those sir knights who top line signed our lanyard chords. But, we're not going to have historical data in it. But at least going forward, we're going to have that kind of data available. There's other things going on in Grand Encampment. Some of them don't affect you directly. I did some reorganizing of the Grand Encampment when I took office. We had two Grand Commanderies south of the US and we have a number of countries in South America that have one or two commanderies. These are known as subordinate commanderies. Subordinate means they don't report to a grand commandery, they report directly to Grand Encampment. I reorganized that and created a new department, just like East Central Department.

There's now a Department of Southern Americas. And in July, they will be having their first ever Department meeting. So, they're going, we're going to build a little more cohesion, a little more feeling of international fraternity and brotherhood among them. Also, that conference is going to be in Panama City. Also, in the Southern Americas, Mexico has been a problem for us for several years. It had some real serious problems, not involving a Templar bodies per say, but involving some of the other bodies that were prerequisite to Templary. Those problems have been worked out, but then there was the issue of getting the Grand Commandery back in operation. At the triennial session in Buffalo in 2015, that was all reported, it was brought up to date. A few months ago, I issued an order recognizing that Mexico had fulfilled all of the requirements that we set forth to allow them to be reinstated and I have declared the Grand Commandery of Mexico reinstated. Mind you, it's going to take them a lot of work still to get all their commanderies back in trim. But, you got to start somewhere. I'll also touch briefly on something that is completed. We talked about it a lot last year and the year before. But 2016 was the bicentennial of the Grand Encampment. Now, the first recorded conferral of the Order of the Temple in the US, well anywhere, was Boston in 1874. Then, grand commanderies grew up. Eventually, those grand commanderies decided that this organization needed some national leadership so that things stayed reasonably consistent from place to place. And in 1816 the Grand Encampment was formed. We had a nice celebration last year, a big party in New York City. There are a few people who were there, dinner cruise around the southern end of Manhattan. It was a nice, nice weekend. But you know, it's interesting, 200 years, that means that this Grand Encampment is now older than the original Knights Templar were when they were suppressed. Think about that. We all think about them as being ancient. We all think about them as having been around forever, which is why it was so dramatic when they were shut down suddenly. We are now older than the original Knights Templar became. And it's not just that we've completed 200 years. We are starting the next 200. Because this organization isn't going to look the same 20 years from now from what it does today. And, why should it? It doesn't look today like it looked 20 years ago. Disagreements on that? The evolution is going to continue. But we're going to continue to be, to care about our charities. We're going to continue to care that we have pride in this organization that we're willing to go to the effort to wear uniforms and come too far off places like Columbus. We're going to care about new members. We're going to care about the principals of this order. There are things that are going to change and there's things that are not going to change. But there's no reason that we can't be on those core principles for another 100, 200 years. And that is a lesson I want to leave you with. I do have one last thing I want to do. I presented one of these earlier, but we have someone else who will not be with us this evening so I want to get this presented again while I get to do it instead of somebody else getting all the glory. So, I have from the Grand Encampment of the Knights Templar, in the name of our Lord whereas our college of honors, having under consideration the distinguished services rendered by him to Freemasonry, has nominated Sir Knight Carey B. Carter for the honor and dignity of Knight Commander of the Temple in our order, now we with the sanction of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar do by this patent of honor make creating constitute him to be a Knight Commander of the Temple and it is my very great honor to present this to you. So, in conclusion, charities, spectacular, improving, the operation of the office, we continue to make improvements. Our programs, our other programs and activities of Grand Encampment, we're pushing to make things better in every way we can and we plan to be at it for a long time and we hope you're there to be part of it. Thank you.

REMARKS BY SIR KNIGHT Carey B. Carter MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER OF THE GRAND LODGE ON INDIANA

Most Eminent Grand Master, Right Eminent Grand Commander, Sir Knights, Brothers all, good afternoon. (In response to the Knight Commander of the Temple presented by Sir Knight Vaught 2 minutes ago.) That's cool. Thank you very much. That was very a big surprise. I'm honored to have that. You know, I've been a York Rite member, a member of the bodies for about 20 years and I haven't been really that active with them. I've been doing a lot of other stuff. But I was able to go to Grand Session here a couple weeks ago up in Gary and now I'm here and it's reminded me how excited I was when I joined all those bodies. I'm going to have some free time here in a few weeks. So, I think I might try to get more involved with that too. But, that was a big surprise. I actually appreciate that and the honorary membership. That was excellent as well. You know, most of the time when you see a Masonic leader stand up in front of a group, you're going to hear some of the same things and one of those things is membership and you've heard it a couple of times already. "You know, when I first got going in the line here, I kind of studied the membership numbers for our fraternity and for a long time, we lost about the same number of guys to death as we gained in petitions that were coming in. And that's still somewhat true, not quite as true, but the membership continued to decline. And it's my contention that part of that, not all of it, but a part of that, is that we get these new fellas in here and first all, when we get them coming, we don't truly explain to them what Freemasonry is. But once we get them in, we don't get them engaged. So, a lot of times, they lose interest and they're coming in the front door and going out the back door. So, over the course of the years, the Grand Lodge has tried to come up with some programs to kind of stop some of that and we've had one recently that I think could be universal and it's called the Rookie Reward program and you can find it on the Grand Lodge website. But basically, what happens is, when you get a new fellow in, he's got one year from the time he's raised as a Master Mason to complete a list of ten different things and it doesn't matter so much what those ten things are. But what does matter is he has ten opportunities to do something for his lodge, with his lodge brothers, and to get a better chance to build a relationship and get to know each other better and more importantly, it gives them a space in which they can contribute and make themselves feel like they're a part of that. And I think that's important. And I think that membership is not the end all, do all. I don't believe that we have to have a quarter million members but we do have to sustain. Because it's been my experience that when lodges consolidate, they lose members. Same thing happened with my lodge. It was a big lodge that just came into my lodge and a great percentage of those members didn't transfer over. I'm not sure if they're going other places or just kind of give up. But it's not a good thing to happen and when we lose lodges, especially in small towns, it's hard to get those back. And if we lose three or four lodges in a particular area, small towns like that, it can affect your groups directly. So, membership, although not being the end all, do all, it is important. So, you'll always hear us talking about that kind of thing. But I think the important thing is to remember that no matter how many programs are out there, no matter how many surveys we take, and I Think they're great, we need to remember that the most effective membership tool is right here. Hi, my name is Carey, I'd like to talk to you about Freemasonry and it's not that difficult and I'm saying that from a person that not really that outgoing. I'm not unfriendly, but sometimes I'm just shy. I know a lot of guys are that way about talking to people they don't know as well. But I've found over the years and I'm in a unique position, I grant you, I kind of

have the bully pulpit and everybody kind of knows who I am. But I know that if you wear something square and compass, a shirt, a hat, something, it generates a lot of conversations and most of the time, they'll open that conversation up for you. I had a fellow come to work on my furnace earlier this year or this week. He saw the Masonic plate on my motorcycle, started a conversation, and now he's headed off to a lodge to see if it's a good fit for him to become a Freemason. So, don't forget that. It's up to each of us to kind of do some of that as well. And one of the things that really made me start thinking about that today. How many of you guys are on Facebook? Well, I wasn't. I noticed you had talked about the youth groups today. Well, I'm a big guy with the Job's Daughters. I was involved with them for quite a while, great group. By the way, all the groups, all the youth groups love for Master Masons to come to their meetings and I encourage you to do that because they just love it when you show up. But I was there one night and they said what's your Facebook page, we want to friend you. I said I don't have a Facebook page. So, by the time I got home, I got an email that said, 'this is your Facebook page, this is your password.' So, I got the message. I said okay. But what they didn't understand was, now that my girls are grown up and going to college and I know who they're dating, I know when they go to football games, I know what they're doing, so I started tracking them. So, I've kind of stayed with the Facebook thing and there's a lot of good stuff out there. There's a lot of good Masonic stuff out there. One of the things that I do follow on Facebook is the Peoria Historical Society. As many of you may know, I'm originally from Peoria, Illinois. But, I've been in Indiana a lot longer than I was in Illinois so I'm a Hoosier now. But, I was looking at some of the old photographs and there was one photograph in particular that caught my attention and it was the main street of Peoria. It was 1930 or 31 or something like that and it was a parade. And the street was probably as wide from the wall to here, it was a huge street and we have a view of them as they were marching away and it was all Knights Templar and the street was packed. There must have been 15 to 18 across and it was for two blocks in one parade. And I'm thinking wow, wouldn't that be cool. I don't expect us to get back to those membership numbers. It's a different world today. We've got 24/7, we've got the Internet, we've got 24/7 television. There's all kinds of things to take our attention. But I don't think that we should lose track of the fact that membership is important and that those guys did that and belong to that not just because they had nothing else to do. But because of that relationship that we all share, that true secret of Freemasonry, our relationship. It doesn't matter what your title is. It doesn't matter what your building looks like. It doesn't matter how fancy your apron is. That's what it is. It's that relationship that we all share. So, as much as we can share that, I think we should. On behalf of my wife, Cathy, and I, I would like to thank you all for the outstanding hospitality that you've extended to us. I've enjoyed my time here. I've enjoyed seeing all of these faces that I know from other places. It's neat to be here with you guys. You always represent, you look great, you stand tall, you look sharp and I appreciate all that it is that you do. I want to thank you for the opportunity of being here. And thank you for these honorary memberships. They were excellent.

Trustees: The Permanent fund is invested with Morgan Stanley in a moderate growth account with a ten-year investment horizon. This has been a difficult year for our investments with Morgan Stanley. In April of 2015, we invested \$352,320.78 and \$220,308.77 in the General Fund and Education Fund, respectively with Morgan Stanley. The above investments declined to \$343,145.05 in the General Fund and \$215,399.86 in the Education Fund. Or an average decline of 3% in a very up and down year.

Necrology: The report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 117 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest. After Grand Prelate Steven A. Arlington gave his report, George A. Ingles, Jr., KCT, PGC read a eulogy in memory of Sir Knight Larry V. Kaminsky, KCT, PGC, and moved that he be awarded to title of Grand Recorder Emeritus serving from 2006 to 2016. Sir Knight Duane L. Vaught, GTC, MEGM then gave a eulogy for Sir Knight James McCrorry Wilson, Jr., GCT, HPGM, PGM of Texas and was the current Right Eminent Grand Treasurer of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA..

Education Foundation: The Educational Foundation Committee would like to continue to award a \$5000.00 scholarship to Christian Theological Seminary (CTS). However, the committee has contacted several theological seminaries in the state but we were unsuccessful in finding a seminary that would accept and acknowledge money from a Masonic organization.

Crusader: The official Conclave Program Book, "The Templar Crusader", was again successful and Raper Commandery No. 1 received the traveling award for selling the most ads.

Elections: The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies were represented by at least one delegate. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

Finance: SK James L. Dove KCT, PGC and Vice Chairman of the Finance Committee gave a presentation on the finances of the Grand Commandery.

This past year saw some additional cost to the budget in the moving of the office of the Grand Recorder and additional equipment and software.

This will be the first year in the last 6 that we will be taking money out of the Permanent fund and it is due to the present law for which a change to eliminate that requirement will be presented during this Conclave.

The finance committee is recommending no change to the present assessment although the budget shows a deficit of \$2,288.20, the new Grand Recorder is going to try to make that up with a change in the transmission of information to the officers of the Commanderies and Grand Officer via changes in notifications if passed and our web site.

In summary, the per capita now looks like this: Grand Encampment: \$9.00. Grand Commandery: \$11.50. Eye Foundation: \$1.00 (not assessed if member is a Life Member of the Eye Foundation).

Each year, beginning with the 2007-2008 Grand Commandery year, the permanent fund shall transfer as necessary to the general fund, for operations, up to five percent (5%) of the fund effective December 31st of each year. New Section Indiana Law

Commandery Dues

Section 806.

(a) Commanderys shall include in their by-laws the first stated conclave in June as the designated meeting at which dues of the Commandery shall be discussed and the amount set. Every Commandery shall designate in its by-laws the amount of dues to be paid by each member annually. The amount of these dues shall include the amount determined by each Commandery for their operation plus the amount set by the Grand Commandery for the Grand Commandery General Fund and the Grand Encampment Assessment, plus \$1.00 for all non life or higher sponsors of the Eye Foundation.

All dues and assessments are payable in advance and must be collected when due or considered in arrears.

- (b) Dues are chargeable to all Knights Templar in good standing and end on the date that his membership is terminated, or when he becomes a fifty-year member.
- (c) Should the membership of a Knight Templar terminate in any other manner than by his death before the end of the term for which his dues and assessments are paid, the Commandery shall refund to him the pro rata of his dues and assessments for the period during which he was not a member of the Commandery.
- (d) within ten (10) days following the June stated conclave the Recorder of the Commandery shall forward to the Grand Recorder the amount the membership of the Commandery shall be charged for the following year dues. Any Commandery failing to forward the information to the Grand Recorder in that time frame the last recorded dues shall apply.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FOR SIR KNIGHTS

Rules and Regulations

An award to be known as the "**DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD**" (for Sir Knights) was established by the Grand Commandery of Indiana on May 6, 1977 at the 123rd Annual Conclave. It is to be conferred upon members, who, by distinguished service to Templary are worthy of such an award. The recipients to be selected and the award to be presented as follows:

- 1. The recipient must be a member in good standing of a Commandery.
- 2. The Eminent Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General, will acting together, present the nomination for the award as suggested by members of their Commandery. The nomination shall be on forms to be provided by the Grand Recorder. Said nomination shall be forwarded to the Right Eminent Grand Commander no later than February 1st of each year for the preceding year. The Grand Commandery may appoint the Grand Recorder to assist him in the selection of recipients.
- 3. Those chosen to receive the award shall be made known by the Right Eminent Grand Commander at the Grand Commandery Conclave each year. The names of the nominees to receive the award shall be kept strictly confidential until announced by the Grand Commander.
- 4. The award shall be limited to two (2) members from each Commandery in Indiana each year starting with the year 1977.
- 5. The award is to be presented to the recipient by the Eminent Commander of the recipient's Commandery, such presentation to be at a Stated or Called Conclave. It is strongly recommended that such presentation be open to the public, visitors and friends and is performed with proper ceremony with Sir Knights present wearing full Templar uniforms.
- 6. The award shall consist of a jewel engraved with the words "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD, Grand Commandery of Indiana" In addition thereto an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.

Knights Templar Cross of Honor

In accordance with the provisions of Section 237 (b) of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, USA, a meritorious award known as the Knights Templar Cross of Honor may be conferred by the Grand Master upon a deserving Sir Knight (or Knights, depending on Grand Commandery membership counts) of each Grand Commandery once each year.

Each Constituent Commandery of Indiana is invited to submit a nomination for the award. It is to be noted that this award is to be made only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order of Knights Templar far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an Officer or Member. No elected Grand Commandery or Grand Encampment officer, past or present, is eligible to receive the award. This honor is for the Sir Knight of your Commandery who you consider has been, or is, outstanding in his Chivalric labors.

Should your Commandery desire to make a nomination for this award, you will use the following procedure.

- 1. Pass a resolution in your Commandery, naming the Sir Knight to be nominated.
- 2. Write to the Grand Recorder for a nomination form.
- 3. Read the instructions on the reverse side of the form. Fill it out and forward it directly to the Grand Commander, Donald D. Olvey at 3785 Waterfront Way, Plainfield, Indiana 46168-7624.

The nomination form must be in the hands of the Grand Commander prior to <u>February 1, 2017</u>. Incomplete forms and those received after that date <u>will not</u> be considered. Your Commandery should reconsider those Sir Knights who have been nominated previously but who have never received the award.

"KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR" RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) In accordance with the provisions of Section 237 (b) of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, as amended at the 50th Triennial Conclave, the meritorious Award known as the **KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR**, shall be conferred by the Grand Master on behalf of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to deserving Sir Knights of Constituent and Subordinate Commanderies upon certain conditions hereinafter set forth.
- (2) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR shall be awarded "only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order, far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an officer or member." In deciding upon the award, precedents shall be entirely ignored and each case shall be decided upon its own unusual merits.

 No posthumous award shall be made, and no present or past elected Grand Officer of a Grand Commandery shall be eligible for the award.
- (3) Only one nomination may be made from a Grand Commandery membership of 5,000 or less, plus one additional nomination may be made by a Grand Commandery for each additional 5,000 of its members, or major fraction thereof, during any one year. Only one nomination may be made from the total of the Subordinate Commanderies during one year.
- (4) The procedure to be followed for making nominations for this Award shall be as follows:
 - a. Any Constituent Commandery desiring to make a nomination shall first adopt a formal resolution, setting forth the full name of its nominee, and the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.
 - b. The Commander of such Constituent Commandery shall thereupon cause to be filled-in a nomination form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of his Grand Commandery, giving the date, full name of the nominee, address, and Templar rank, name of his Commandery and a statement of the nature of the meritorious service upon.
 - c. Such Nomination Form shall be signed by the Commander of such Constituent Commandery and shall be forwarded by him to the Grand Commander of his jurisdiction for consideration.
 - d. Such Grand Commander shall consider nominations made Constituent Commanderies of his Grand Commandery upon Nomination Forms and shall select only one nominee (more where qualified) in anyone year; upon making such selection, the Grand Commander shall affix his written approval to such Nomination Form and shall thereupon send the name to the Grand Master.
 - e. Any Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination for this Award shall follow the same procedure as is set forth above for Constituent Commanderies, except that such Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination, shall forward the Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment, and the same shall bear the written approval of the Commander of such Subordinate Commandery before being sent by to the Grand Master.
- (5) The **KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR** medal shall consist of a round, gold-finished medal, the outer circle of which shall bear the words "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR," showing through in black enamel, and in the center shall appear the Patriarchal Cross of the Grand Encampment in purple enamel. Such medal shall be suspended from a gold-finished bar by two small chain links on either side; upon the face of the bar shall be engraved the name of the Sir Knight who shall be the recipient thereof. The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medal may be worn upon the uniform by the recipient upon all occasions.
- (6) A suitable Certificate of Award, issued by the Grand Encampment, signed by the Grand Master and the Grand Recorder, and bearing the seal of the Grand Encampment thereon, shall accompany the medal. The Certificate shall contain a summary of the Citation upon which such Award is based.
- (7) It shall the responsibility of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to provide the medals, the Certificates of Award for the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, without any cost to the recipient or to his Constituent or Grand Commandery, or his Subordinate Commandery. Presentation of the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medals, Certificates shall be made at an appropriate ceremony by Grand Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies, and a report thereof sent by the respective Recorder the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment within thirty days thereafter.

GUIDELINES FOR THE SELECTION OF MINISTERS

The following are the selection criteria suggested for use in choosing ministers for the Knight Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage. Please carefully consider these guidelines before inviting ministers to apply.

Please take careful note, the guidelines have recently changed.

Ministers to be considered should:

- Have never traveled to the Holy Land before.
- Be serving in some form of <u>Credentialed Ministry</u> (Ordained, Certified, Licensed, etc.) A copy of the minster's credentials (certificate or letter) is to accompany the nomination form.
- Be currently serving in a <u>leadership ministry</u>, with regular preaching responsibility. This means that they are employed by the church in a leadership role and that ministry is considered their primary source of income.
- Have <u>served at least one year</u> in full time ministry in a primary leadership role as pastor / minister.
- Have <u>at least ten years of full time service</u> remaining in their active ministry. This opportunity is intended to enhance the ongoing preaching, teaching and overall biblical understanding of the participant, and in turn, benefit those they serve.
- Be of good physical health (if the idea of walking a brisk mile or more uphill, non-stop, with steps is a concern, this may not be the program from which this person would benefit). This is a physically rigorous program.
- Be willing to travel with an <u>ecumenical group</u> of other ministers from many denominations and religious groups, both male and female ministers, and maintain a professional and courteous attitude toward all.
- Be willing to travel in a program sponsored by the <u>Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the USA</u>, an appendant organization of <u>Freemasonry</u>.
- Be willing to travel **without their spouse**. This is non-negotiable.
- Have the understanding that this is a **strenuous educational and spiritual study seminar** / **historical & cultural immersion experience** and not a vacation trip.

General Order No. 1 Olvey

Annual Inspection and instructional of Constituent Commanderies

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 851 and 852 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of the Jurisdiction be inspected.

- 1. The Battalion Commander shall inspect each Commandery within the Battalion with the following exception: The Grand Inspector General will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each elected and appointed Grand Officer, if it is within the Battalion of the latter, excluding the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder. Only the Grand Commander may authorize other exceptions or substitutions.
- 2. Each Inspecting Officer will send a "Notice of Inspection" courtesy letter to the Eminent Commander and Recorder at least 30 days prior to the Inspection. The letter will confirm the date, time, and Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and request the completion of specified reports. The Recorder shall provide the completed reports to the Inspecting Officers upon his arrival.
- 3. The records Inspection shall consist of:
 - A report on the membership efforts
 - Examination of the books, records, and accounts
 - Examination of the paraphernalia and property of the Commandery
 - Examination of the Activity sheet
- 4. No Inspection will be deemed complete until the Inspecting Officer has reviewed all books and financial records. If they are not presented at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the responsible Officer (Treasurer or Recorder) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within seven (7) days. Failure to comply may cause the Commandery to be placed upon probation until the obligation has been fulfilled.
- 5. Each Inspection will start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Inspecting Officer. The inspection process may be completed over two meetings, with one meeting for the required inspection items (see #3 above) as well as the Ritual Inspection for score (opening, closing and flag presentation) and another meeting for the agreed upon Instructional. The area of instruction may be an Order or any part of the Ritual and/or Tactics as determined by the Battalion Commander based on the needs of the respective Commanderies. The full inspection and instructional may be done in one day, if desired. All inspections and Instructionals must be complete by the first Sunday in December 2016.

- 6. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the Reception and Ritual Inspection. Officers and members may assume other stations during the Instructionals.
- 7. An Inspection and Instructional may be held at the Battalion level and include any number of the Commanderies within that Battalion deemed appropriate by the Battalion Commander. Each participating Commandery must have at least 6 members present to receive the Ritual score or receive credit for the Instructional.
- 8. The participating Commanderies will open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form using the Ten Man or Twelve Man Opening in accordance with the most recent official interpretation of the Ritual and official Indiana Asylum Tactics. One hundred (100) points for a public Reception will be added to the Activities Sheet for all participating Commanderies. Upon completion of each Inspection and Instructional and prior to closing, the Inspecting Officer shall give his remarks first, and then the Grand Commander, if present, will follow with his remarks. Whenever he is not present, the Inspecting Officer, acting as the Grand Commander's official Representative, shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him, as such. If the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana is present he will speak after the Grand Commander; otherwise, the Grand Commander will be the final speaker.
- 9. Knowingly violating proper protocol as prescribed in Indiana Tactics General Regulations shall constitute a no score for your inspection and thus require an additional inspection scheduled by the Right Eminent Grand Commander. The public may be invited into the Asylum while:
 - The Commandery receives the Commander
 - The Commander receives Distinguished Guests
 - The sword manual is performed
 - The Commandery is inspected for uniform
 - The Triangle is formed
 - The United States Flag and lecture is given
- 10. Each Battalion will host at least one, but no more than two, receptions for the Grand Commander. These receptions will be conducted as a Templar Boards followed by the Reception of Distinguished Guests. No opening or closing of the Asylum need be associated with this reception.
- 11. The Inspecting Officer shall make his inspection and instructional report of each Commandery to the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Inspector General, the Deputy Grand Commander, Grand Recorder, and Division Commander, as well as the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the inspected Commandery within fourteen (14) days following the completion of the Inspection and Instructional. A full report of the Inspections and Instructionals will be discussed at the winter meeting and presented for publication and appropriate recognition at the Annual Conclave.
- 12. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the score of the opening, closing Flag presentation and the

successful completion of the required instructional (Activity scores excluded). All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose.

13. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each battalion on the activity score sheet will also be recognized by a ribbon that may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.

Mentoring New Members and Junior Officers

Maintaining interest in new Sir Knights and preparing Junior Officers for future leadership are important issues in the life of any Commandery. An active mentoring program can achieve these goals and the following program is directed for implementation and monitoring by each Commandery.

- Upon Knighting, each Sir Knight will have a mentor assigned whose responsibility it will be to cause the new Sir Knight to remain an active member by inviting him to all functions personally, helping him become involved in the Commandery to the extent the new Sir Knight is able, and answering all questions that he and his family pose.
- The mentor will also be responsible to provide a member packet to the new Sir Knight containing information about the Commandery and Templary. This may include a calendar, newsletter, Commandery history, philanthropies, and information on Conclaves, activities, and officers.
- Each new officer in the line will also be assigned a mentor, preferably a Past Commander or Dais
 Officer, to provide guidance and encouragement to the new officer and to instruct and answer
 questions he will have as he advances.
- The officer's mentor shall make certain that the new officer has the proper ritual, tactics, officer's handbook bylaws, and other information he needs to succeed. The mentor shall assist the new officer in preparing his uniform and equipment and assist him with proficiency in protocols and practices.

The Recorder will maintain a record of the assignment of mentors and include that information with his books for annual inspection. A suggested place for keeping this information is the membership book or log of the Commandery.

The Generalissimo will be assigned to administer and monitor the mentorship program and to oversee the development of new Sir Knights and officers. I have requested the Battalion Commanders and Deputies to assist you, the Generalissimo, in implementing the program.

ROSTER OF INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg No. 2 - Charter date September 1853, was one of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from Greensburg No.2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin No. 2.

Cambridge City No. 6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery No. 6 was changed to Cambridge City No. 6. On April 30, 1884, this action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford No. 7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker No. 9 - Organized April 4, 1866 and Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown No. 9 on April 28, 1874. Knightstown No. 9 surrendered their charter on March 31, 2008 and merged with Greenfield No. 39.

Warsaw No. 10 - Chartered April 7, 1868, and merged with Goshen No. 50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch No. 14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus No. 14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling No. 16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute No. 16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora No. 17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929, revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Muncie No.18 – Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter surrendered December 11, 2000. Charter was restored on October 24, 2006. Charter surrendered December 31, 2010.

Marion No. 21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County No. 21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp No. 22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison No. 22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin No. 23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County No. 23 on April 20, 1990.

Plymouth No. 26 - Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974, and merged with South Bend No. 13.

DeMolay No. 62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental No. 62 on May 12, 1941.

Oriental No. 62 - Successor to DeMolay No. 62; At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental No. 62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity No. 62 but the only record of a name change is noted in the Conclave Bulletin No. 1. No other record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity No. 62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge No. 717.

The Committee on Dispensations & Charters presented a request to change the name of Oriental Commandery No. 62 (Currently called Trinity Commandery no. 62) to Prather Commandery No. 62 to document the name change properly. Vote taken and passed to officially make the name of the aforementioned Commandery to be henceforth called Prather Commandery No. 62. (Approved April 24, 2010).

Wright Commandery No. 64 Chartered April 29, 1988. Dispensation granted on April 29, 2005, to move their Charter to Eckerty Lodge No. 719, Eckerty, Indiana 47116 on a permanent basis. (May 1, 2006). Dispensation was granted to Wright Commandery No. 64 to move its Charter to Dubois Lodge No. 520 at Huntingburg, Indiana, for the Stated Conclave on September 16, 2009. At that time, the Commandery will be voting to permanently move the Charter to Dubois Lodge, subject to approval at Grand Conclave 2010. (Approved April 24, 2010)

H. W. Matthewson Commandery No. 66 Chartered April 30, 1993. Charter surrendered December 12, 2012 and merged with Lafayette Commandery No. 3 in Lafayette, Indiana. (Approved April 25, 2014)

Lawrence Commandery No. 67 Chartered April 29, 1994. Charter moved to Millersville Lodge September 21, 2002. Name changed to H. E. Lackey Commandery No. 67 on April 23, 2003.

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. - Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, too open Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued February 12, 2001 to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 23, 2003.
